Our Selections

THE GIRLS LACROSSE All-Star Team was selected by staff writers with local coaches consulted for their recommendations. Portrait photos of the all-stars were taken by The Sun Chronicle's Mark Stockwell and Paul Connors.

Jaime Notarangelo, Foxboro

The junior midfielder had a breakout year as she came up with clutch plays and game-winning goals over both Weston and Wayland in the MIAA Division 2 East Sectional Tournament. Notarangelo was third on the team in goals with 46 while contributing 14 assists. "She started and very rarely ever came off the field," Brittany Sherry said of Notarangelo's benefit for the 17-win Warriors. She was an All-Hockomock selection and a first-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Caroline Klim, King Philip

A four-year starter, Klim was a fixture in the team's success with her ability to control the center of the field in her second year as a midfielder. Klim scored 82 goals while corralling an identical 82 draw controls. She added 12 assists and caused 35 turnovers. "She brought her experience and lacrosse IQ to the team," KP coach Courtnie Wilder said of the repeat Hockomock League All-Star. The three-time Sun Chronicle selection will play lacrosse at UMass-Lowell next year.

Jessica Sullivan, King Philip

A first time Sun Chronicle All-Star, the junior had a breakout season on the attack for KP, which was third in the Hockomock in goals scored during the regular season. Sullivan was second on the team with 56 goals while contributing 18 assists for the 12-win Warriors. "We relied on her to one of our top scorers," Kourtne Wilder said. Sullivan was put on the faceoff circle midway through the season and tallied 28 draw controls. She has committed to play lacrosse at Saint Anselm College.

Victoria Tormey, King Philip

The senior was relied on heavily for the KP defense, which finished among the top of the Hockomock in goals against. On the offensive end, Tormey scored 13 goals with 12 assists while defensively she caused 15 turnovers and had 20 ground balls. "She was able to shut down other teams' top scorers," Kourtne Wilder said. A first time Sun Chronicle All-Star, she was a four-year starter while playing midfield as well. She will play Division I lacrosse at Boston University.

Dana Truini, King Philip

A three-year starter and two-time Sun Chronicle selection, Truini was at her best on the faceoff, winning the pursuit of ground balls to ignite the offense. She was second on the team in draw controls (79) while contributing 27 goals and seven assists. She corralled 32 ground balls and

Rylee Fontes, Attleboro

A first-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Fontes gave the Bombardiers a dynamic 1-2 punch with teammate Kyra Lyons on the offensive end of the field. Fontes finished the season with a career-best 56 points on 34 goals and 22 assists. She scored four goals against both Norton and Dartmouth while she netted a hat trick against North Attleboro as well. She is a multi-year member of the Bombardier varsity squad and was a Sun Chronicle Honorable Mention following her breakout junior season.

Kyra Lyons, Attleboro

A three-time Sun Chronicle selection and four-year varsity member, the senior blew past the 100 career goal threshold during her junior year before scoring another 60 goals this season. Lyons was among the most dynamic offensive players in the Hockomock League, concluding the season with 88 points as she added 28 assists for the Bombardiers. Lyons, an All-Hockomock selection, scored five times against Norton and netted hat tricks against both Bishop Feehan and King Philip.

Jolie Bellemore, Bishop Feehan

A three-year starter and two-time Sun Chronicle selection, the Shamrock junior was an energetic presence in the midfield as her relentless effort could be relied upon in every facet of the game. Bellemore scored 20 goals with nine assists for the offense, while her ability to equally contribute on both the draw circle and in transition was why she never came off the field for the 12-win Shamrocks. The Eastern Athletic Conference first-team selection was named a captain-elect for the 2020 season.

Mikayla Cotter, Bishop Feehan

A two-time Sun Chronicle selection, the Shamrock senior captain led the Eastern Athletic Conference champions in points this season as she scored 50 goals and set up teammates with 23 assists during her final campaign. "She was a great leader, like a coach on the field," said Feehan first-year coach Mike Vitelli of the All-EAC first-team selection. A multi-year starter in the midfield, Cotter was vital to the Shamrock transition game too. She will play lacrosse at the University of New Haven.

Lauren Hurley, Bishop Feehan

The senior attacker scored 40-plus goals for the second consecutive season, finishing second on the team in points (60) behind 41 goals and 19 assists. "Once she got to the crease from behind the goal, she was impossible to stop," said Shamrock coach Mike Vitelli of Hurley's goal-scoring prowess, which helped the 12-win Shamrocks win the Eastern Athletic Conference crown. A two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Hurley was named an All-EAC first-team selection for the second time.

Maggie Roberts, Bishop Feehan

"Her shoulders hurt from carrying us in so many big games," said Feehan coach Mike Vitelli of his senior goaltender and Eastern Athletic Conference first-team selection. The Lehigh University-bound Roberts allowed just 154 goals in 19 games for a 8.11 goals-against average. She was a defensive backbone as the Shamrocks claimed 12 regular-season wins, making 13 saves in a 14-12 win against Old Rochester and nine in a three-goal verdict against Mansfield. She is a first time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Sara Addeche, Foxboro

A two-time All-Hockomock selection, the Warrior sophomore goaltender provided a key last line of defense for the 17-win squad, who advanced to the Division 2 State Semifinals. "She's a hard worker and is always looking for ways to improve," Foxboro coach Brittany Sherry said. Addeche made 112 saves on the season with a 36 percent save percentage clip. She was an Eastern Mass. first-team selection following her sophomore stint and has committed to play lacrosse at the University of Louisville.

Meghan Curran, Foxboro

A first-team Eastern Mass. All-Star, the Warrior senior provided the Division 2 East Sectional champions with a much-needed leadership on the offensive end. Curran, a

repeat Sun Chronicle All-Star, scored 35 goals and had 20 assists this season to bring her career totals to 138 goals and 101 assists. She was voted a recipient of the Positive Coaching Alliance scholarship and is a three-time Hockomock League selection. She will play Division I lacrosse at Princeton.

Sophia DiCenso, Foxboro

A member of the United States Women's Lacrosse U-19 team, the Warrior senior was named All-American for the second consecutive year. She capped her career with a Division 2 East Sectional title and holds program records in goals (244), assists (142) and draw controls (207). The University of Richmond-commit led the Warriors with 58 goals, 26 assists and 67 draws this year. She is a four-time All-Hockomock selection, and was named to Division 2 Eastern Mass. first team the last two years.

Julia Kelley, Foxboro High

A first-time Sun Chronicle selection, Kelley had a breakout season of her own as she was an asset on the attack for the Davenport Division champions. "She was always finding a way to get open," Foxboro coach Brittany Sherry said of the junior, who provided the Division 2 East Sectional champions a balance that was hard to stop with her vision at X. Kelley was second on the team in goals scored (48) and tied for first in assists (26). "With more exposure, she really started gelling."
