

The Girls Outdoor Track All-Stars

S'taarr Parham, Attleboro

Parham was a dynamic contributor for the Bombardiers in her junior season. The Hockomock League All-Star cleared 5 feet, 5 inches in the high jump to earn third place at the New England Championship. She consistently jumped 5-4 or better, including a fourth-place finish at the Meet of Champions. She also placed second at the Hockomock League Championship (5-0) and fourth at the MIAA Division 1 Championship (5-0). In the 100 hurdles, she clocked a 16.28 PR to place fifth at the league meet. She also reached a 35-0.25 PR in the triple jump.

Emilia Smith, Attleboro

A familiar name on The Sun Chronicle All-Star Team, Smith capped her senior season with another stellar distance campaign. She won the Hockomock League two-mile in 11:02.20 and placed 11th at the MIAA Meet of Champions (11:12.13). In the mile, she posted a season-best 5:17.88 for fourth at the Coaches Shore Invitational. The Hockomock League All-Star added a runner-up performance at the league meet (5:21.92) and placed 14th at the MIAA Division 1 Championship (5:20.82) in a culmination of her consistent track and field excellence.

Gigi Colleran, Bishop Feehan

The Shamrock senior closed her career as a versatile standout and the team's leading point scorer. She posted a 17-foot, 2-inch long jump personal best to take fourth at the MIAA Division 2 Championship. The Catholic Central League All-Star earned second place at the CCL Championship (17-0). A steady scorer in sprints and jumps, Colleran logged noteworthy season bests in the 100 (13.3), 200 (28.53), 400 (1:06.97) and triple jump (32-10). She also helped Feehan's 4x400 relay claim the CCL crown and place second in the division.

Molly Duignan, Bishop Feehan

Duignan was a key contributor in the hurdles and sprints for the Shamrocks. She posted a 1:05.62 personal best in the 400 hurdles to finish second place at the CCL Championship. She also earned first place at the Attleboro-North Attleboro-Bishop Feehan tri-meet (1:09.40) and 19th at the MIAA Meet of Champions (1:07.24). The Catholic Central League All-Star added PRs in the 400 (1:01.84) and 200 (27.56). A reliable relay runner, Duignan helped Feehan secure a league title and division runner-up finish in the 4x400 relay. She is a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Jill Olson, Bishop Feehan

Olson delivered a stellar senior season across middle-distance events. She ran a 5:16.22 mile PR to win the event at the CCL Championship. A Catholic Central League All-Star, Olson placed fourth at the BSR Mid Distance Classic (5:18.74) and eighth at the MIAA Division 2 Championship (5:19.43). In the 800, Olson clocked a 2:20.16 personal best and later raced at the MIAA Meet of Champions (2:22.75). She also recorded a 1:01.93 PR in the 400, proving herself one of the Shamrocks' most versatile and dependable competitors.

Sophie Shaw, Bishop Feehan

Shaw emerged as one of the region's top young distance runners as a sophomore. She clocked an 11:15.76 personal best in the two-mile to place fifth at the MIAA Division 2 Championship. Shaw finished 10th at

the Weston Twilight Invitational (11:46.18) and 25th at the MIAA Meet of Champions (11:43.62). Additionally, the Catholic Central League All-Star took home the crown at the CCL Championship in the 800 meters with a personal best 2:22.63. In the mile, her season-best 5:18.57 earned sixth at the Coaches Metro Invitational.

Lauren Bober, Foxboro

Bober showcased impressive range in her junior season. She posted a 1:07.15 PR in the 400 hurdles to finish fourth at the MIAA Division 4 Championship. In the 400 meters, she earned second at the Hockomock League Championship with a season-best 1:00.99. Also a sprinter, Bober recorded top times of 12.64 in the 100 and 26.44 in the 200. In the long jump, the Hockomock League All-Star hit a 16-foot, 8.25-inch personal best leap at the MSTCA Warrior Invitational, rounding out a stand-out multi-event season.

Alex D'Amadio, King Philip

A multi-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, D'Amadio dominated as a true all-around star. She captured the MIAA Division 2 title in the 200 meters (25.93) and posted an area-best 57.55 in the 400. Her 36-foot, 9.75-inch triple jump PR led all area marks. The junior garnered all-star consideration in eight individual events, a rare level of versatility. They include the 400 hurdles,

where her 1:04.15 PR both earned her a Hockomock League title and led all area performances. Her 17-8 long jump was the area's second-best PR. She was a Hockomock League All-Star.

Maddie Hill, King Philip

Hill delivered a strong senior season highlighted by excellence in the hurdles and javelin. She ran a 16.20 PR in the 100 hurdles to place sixth at the MIAA Division 2 Championship and earned fourth at the Hockomock League Championship (16.28). In the javelin, Hill launched a 126-foot, 3-inch personal best to win the MSTCA Division 2 Relays and added runner-up finishes at several major meets, including second at the division championship. She is a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Chloe Guthrie, Mansfield

Guthrie cemented herself as an elite sprinter and jumper. She posted a 12.04 100-meter PR. She placed third at the Hockomock League Championship (12.36), second at the MIAA Division 3 Championship (12.24) and fourth at both the MIAA Meet of Champions (12.31) and New England Championship (12.20). In the long jump, Guthrie cleared 18 feet, 4 inches to place second at the MSTCA Warrior Invitational and finished as runner-up in both the league (17-11) and division (18-3.5) meets. The two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star logged a 25.04 season-best 200 time and was a Hockomock League All-Star.

Frankie Spagna, Mansfield

Spagna was a force for the Hornets in the jumps throughout her senior season. She posted a 36-foot, 6-inch triple jump in a dual meet for a season best mark. She later placed fourth at the MSTCA Division 3 Relays (34-7.5), second at the Hockomock League Championship (34-11.5), eighth at the MIAA Meet of Champions (36-1.5) and 12th at the New England Championship (35-7). Her 17-4.75 long jump PR earned seventh at the division championship, and she consistently placed among the region's best.

Jordan Egan, North Attleboro

Egan made an immediate impact as a freshman multi-event talent. She won the Hockomock League high jump title with a 5-foot-flat personal best mark. In the 400 hurdles, the Hockomock League All-Star logged a 1:08.62 personal best at the MIAA Division 3 Championship to place fifth. Egan also earned 10th at the MSTCA Freshman Sophomore Invitational (1:12.19)

and fifth at the Hockomock League Championship (1:08.75). A sprinter as well, Egan clocked a 27.24 PR in the 200, displaying the upside she possesses across multiple events.

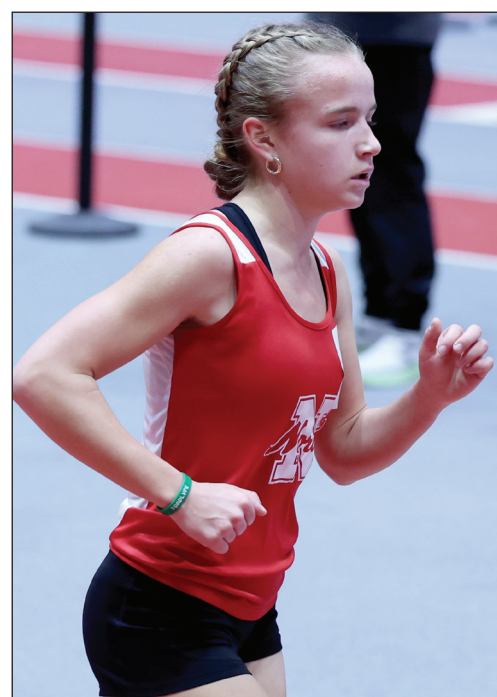
Raegan Gagne, North Attleboro

Gagne wrapped up her Rocketeers career with a strong distance season. The senior ran an 11:35.73 personal best in the two-mile to place third at the Hockomock League Championship. She also placed fourth at the MSTCA Coaches Shore Invitational (11:44.71). Gagne also logged personal bests of 2:25.9 in the 800 and 5:22.5 in the mile. A key contributor in the 4x800 relay, she was a consistent presence in scoring positions and was a Hockomock League All-Star.

Molly Galgoczy, North Attleboro

A familiar name to The Sun Chronicle All-Star Team, Galgoczy continued to shine as a sophomore. She posted a season-best 11:15.37 in the two-mile to finish runner-up at the Hockomock League Championship. In the mile, she clocked a 5:16.95 PR to win the Attleboro-North Attleboro-Bishop Feehan tri-meet and later competed at the MIAA Division 3 Championship. A steady performer and relay contributor, Galgoczy was a Hockomock League All-Star.
