Thomas McCormack, Mansfield

Despite being only a freshman, McCormack burst onto the scene with 20 points in Mansfield's youth movement. McCormack tallied six goals with 14 assists, utilizing a combination of skill and speed to help pace the Hornets' attack this season.

Dominic Bertino, North Attleboro

Bertino was the third of a top-three set of skaters, tallying nine goals with 13 assists for 22 points in his senior season. A team leader at forward with great skating ability and ice vision, Bertino was third on the team in scoring as the Hockomock League All-Star led North to a tournament win over Newburyport.

Shaun Colonna, North Attleboro

Colonna scored a team-leading 18 goals to go with nine assists at forward for the Rocketeers. The sophomore Hockomock League All-Star helped lead North to a 13-win season that took second place in the Davenport Division.

Alex Kojoian, North Attleboro

A senior force for North Attleboro

and a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Kojoian averaged 1.71 points per game to collect a team-leading 36 points. A top-three player for the Rocketeers, the Hockomock League All-Star forward finished with 10 goals and 26 assists as one of North's key playmakers and goal scorers on the ice.

Kyle Gass, Norton

Gass was a two-year starting defenseman for the Lancers, who was a regular in the special teams mix throughout his senior season. A fourth forward at times, Gass was used in big spots to produce as the season went on. Gass was a physical player who played coast-to-coast, finishing with four goals and eight assists for 14 points.

Brogan Laverdiere, Norton

The senior captain and four-year starter for the Lancers was constantly on the ice, playing on power plays and penalty kills in addition to his regular top-six forward duties. Laverdiere was 85% successful from the faceoff dot and stepped up as a lead-by-example two-way forward. He finished the season with eight goals and eight assists for 16 points.
