

The Baseball All-Stars

Ryan Landry, Attleboro

Landry returned to two-way stardom for the Bombardiers this spring, thriving on the mound and at the plate. The senior batted .328 with eight extra-base hits, 10 RBIs and six stolen bases to go with pitching 33 innings for a 3-4 record with a 3.39 ERA and 52 strikeouts. A four-year varsity starter and outfielder as well, Landry will be at Merrimack next season.

Miles Murray, Attleboro

A workhorse pitcher who missed part of his senior season due to injury, Murray returned in grand form with a 2.13 ERA in 26 1/3 innings. His WHIP sat under one at .900, and he struck out 43 batters to only eight walked. Murray was the go-to man in big games, as he turned in a complete game against eventual Div. 1 finalist Bishop Feehan, going six innings and allowing two hits with eight strikeouts.

Jeremy O'Hara, Attleboro

One of a handful of two-way players for the Bombardiers as a senior, O'Hara was a leader at the plate and on the mound. The three-year starter hit .321 with five extra-base hits, 11 RBIs, 10 runs and six stolen bases. The Hockomock League All-Star also pitched 42 innings with a 3-2 record, a 2.50 ERA and 47 strikeouts.

Brody Bumila, Bishop Feehan

No other player in the state drew an audience quite like the 6-foot-9 Bumila this spring. The senior was drafted by the Texas Rangers in the third round of the MLB Draft after the flame-throwing lefty pitched 44 1/3 innings with 10 starts, striking out 106 of 163 batters. He finished 6-0, allowed eight hits all season, posted a WHIP of 0.496 and an ERA of 1.10. Bumila's likely final season of ever picking up a bat was also solid as he batted .369 with an OBP of .461 and an OPS of 1.076. The Massachusetts Gatorade Player of the Year and MaxPreps Male National Athlete of the Year, Bumila had 24 hits, hit three home runs and had 19 RBIs — all team-highs. He was also 7-for-8 in stolen bases.

Jack Gasse, Bishop Feehan

Gasse led the Shamrocks in innings pitched with 59 1/3, including with 11 starts in his 12 appearances. The junior righty finished 9-3, striking out 51 to nine walks issued with a 1.77 ERA and a WHIP of 1.062. A two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Gasse was also strong at working out of danger, stranding a rotation-best 47 runners on base.

Trace Reed, Bishop Feehan

Reed was a huge asset for the Shamrocks out of the bullpen, appearing in a team-high 13 games for 23 1/3 innings pitched. The junior righthander posted four saves with 35 strikeouts, a 1.50 ERA and a WHIP of 1.286. Opponents hit a paltry .184 off him late in games when he came out to finish.

Jordan Castro, Dighton-Rehoboth

The senior captain was a machine at the plate for the Falcons, earning an unanimous South Coast Conference All-Star

selection to cap his high school career. Castro batted .333 with 21 hits, seven extra-base hits, 11 RBIs and 19 walks. The South Coast Conference All-Star's on-base percentage was a strong .500 and his OPS hovered around 1.000 at .992.

Cole Viveiros, Dighton-Rehoboth

Viveiros doubled as both an infielder and an outfielder for the 10-9 Falcons in his junior season. Viveiros batted .333 with an on-base percentage of .465 and an OPS of .885, tallying 23 hits with four doubles and nine RBIs. Viveiros was also great at finding his way on base without the bat, working 16 walks. On the mound, he pitched 47 2/3 innings, and went 3-2 with 60 strikeouts and 21 walks. A South Coast Conference All-Star, Viveiros' ERA was 1.62 and his WHIP was 1.09.

Nick Hardiman, Foxboro

Hardiman roamed the outfield for the Warriors with success as a sophomore this spring. At the plate, he had 21 hits with a .362 average, driving in 13 runs and scored 10 runs. When he wasn't using his speed to track down balls in the gap, Hardiman was circling the basepaths, stealing six bases for the six-win Warriors.

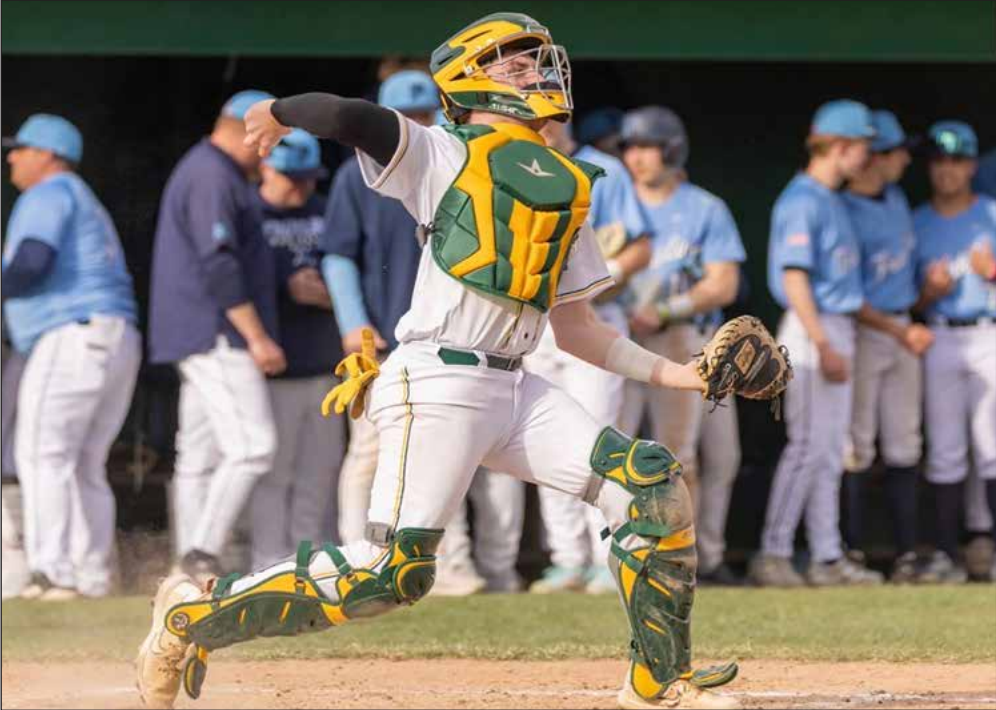
Aidan Stow, Foxboro

A senior of many talents, Stow played both the field and pitched for the Warriors. He batted .279 with 17 hits, including a pair of home runs, had 12 RBIs, 15 runs and 14 walks. On the mound, he was one of Foxboro's best options, going 44 2/3 innings with a 2.98 ERA and holding opponents

to a .200 batting average. The Hockomock League All-Star's pitching prowess came to the front in a no-hit effort against East Bridgewater.

Jacoby Cady, King Philip

Cady's numbers were good enough to anchor nearly any staff in the state, but the junior No. 2 pitcher was another game-changing arm in the Warriors' staff. Cady went 4-4 in 50 1/3 innings, striking out

36 with a 1.80 ERA and owned an opposing batting average of .212. The Hockomock League All-Star also saw time at third base, providing big hits over the course of the season for the Warriors.

Leo Dowling, King Philip

Dowling closed his senior season, his fourth as a varsity starter, as the Warriors' anchor behind the plate and at the dish. Dowling caught 95 games in his high school career and was largely responsible for the Warriors' pitching success, calling games for the rotations. At the plate, he batted .242 with an on-base percentage of .407, driving in eight runs with 10 walks and nine HBPs.

Zach Gebhard, King Philip

Gebhard's ability was good enough to be an ace on most teams, but with King Philip, the senior righthander was an accomplished No. 3 starter that provided valuable innings en route to an MIAA Division 2 title. He pitched 34 2/3 innings, going 4-1 with 30 strikeouts and an ERA of 2.42. Gebhard held opponents to a batting average of .255, playing a pivotal role in King Philip's deep pitching staff.
