Bishop Feehan High's Brian Parkinson won both the 200-yard freestyle and 500-yard freestyle at the Catholic Central League Championship, placing third in the 500 freestyle at the South Sectional.

Krzysztof Kotnisz, Attleboro

Kotnisz paced Attleboro in points scored this season as a sophomore. At the South Sectional, the two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star finished fifth in the 200 individual medley (2:03.57) and was sixth in the 100 breaststroke (1:03.17). He also won the 100 breaststroke (1:04.15) and was the runner-up in the 200 IM at the Hockomock League Championship. "There isn't an event he can't do," head coach Sarah Butler said.

Seal Mukasa, Attleboro

The Bombardiers' senior captain, Mukasa's bread and butter came in the 50 freestyle and 100 freestyle. He also was a key member of the school's highly successful relay teams throughout the season.

Antonio Morabito, Bishop Feehan

Morabito took second-place finishes in both the 50 freestyle and 100 freestyle events at the Catholic Central League Championship. The Shamrocks' senior qualified individually for South Sectionals in the 50 and 100 free and wound up in the top 30 in both events against stiff competition. He also was a member of Feehan's 200 and 400 relays.

Brian Parkinson, Bishop Feehan

A four-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Parkinson was a two-time individual CCL champion in the 200 freestyle and 500

freestyle all while helping the Shamrocks to victories in the 200 medley relay and 200 freestyle relay. At the South Sectional, the senior CCL All-Star finished third in the 500 freestyle (4:56.70) and placed second in the 100-yard backstroke (54.43). Parkinson capped his high-school career at the Div. 2 State Meet by placing sixth in the 100 backstroke (53.56) and ninth in the 500 freestyle (4:50.45).

Brandon Franciosi, Foxboro

A two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Franciosi had a strong postseason showing. At the South Sectional, the Warriors' junior placed first in the 500-yard freestyle in 5:05.72, was fifth in the 100 freestyle (5:05.72) and ninth in the 200 freestyle (1:54.98). At States he placed 11th in the 500 freestyle (5:05.72) and 18th in the 100 backstroke (56.44). "He's a good tone-setter for

Andrew Gallagher, Foxboro

The Warriors' sophomore is a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star who placed 12th in the 500-yard freestyle (5:16.32) at the South Sectional and 18th in the 200 individual medley (2:12.41) to qualify for States in both events as a consistently high performer and a consummate teammate. "He was always helping out other members of the team with new skills (flip turns, underwater work, legal strokes)," said head coach Zoe Plum.

Jackson Keyes, Mansfield

Keyes made his mark at the Hockomock League Championship where the junior three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star notched fourth-placed finishes in both the 100 butterfly and 500 freestyle (5:26.97). Keyes was also key for Mansfield's relay teams.

Patrick Murray, Mansfield

The junior three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star set Hornet records in both the 200-yard and 500-yard freestyle events this season, finishing second in the 500 (4:56.26) at the South Sectional and fourth in the 200 (1:51.27). At the Hockomock League Championship Murray finished with the top spot in the 200 freestyle (1:55.5) and secured a sixth finish in the 100 backstroke (1:01.89).

Lucas Zonfrillo, Seekonk

A junior, Zonfrillo made the cuts for both sectionals and states for the Warriors. The two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star placed fifth in the 100 backstroke (56.04) at the South Sectional. At the Div. 2 state meet, Zonfrillo notched another fifth-place finish in the 100 backstroke (55.15) and was 15th in the 100 freestyle (50.25).
