Carly McDonald, Norton

McDonald closed out her Norton hoops career as a three-time Tri-Valley League All-Star, playing the most games in program history (since 2011-12). The senior averaged 8.7 points, six rebounds, 4.6 assists and 1.6 steals this season. An elite passer with great court vision, McDonald racked up career 296 assists and is one of the winningest players in Norton girls basketball history.

Avery Tinkham, Norton

'Tink' was a Lancers captain as a junior and one of the top scorers in the Tri-Valley League. She averaged 13.2 points for fifth in the TVL and had 4.6 rebounds, 2.5 steals and 2.2 assists per game. The TVL All-Star hit 114 field goals for the most in program history in a single season since stats started being tracked in the 2011-12 season.

Sienna Miranda, Seekonk

The junior played in

19 games for the Warriors, scoring 184 points to finish with an average of 9.7 points. Miranda also averaged 10.2 rebounds and 2.8, leading the Warriors in most categories. One of the most improved players on the team and in the SCC after missing half of last season due to sickness and injury, Miranda was a South Coast Conference All-Star as a key piece of Seekonk's floor attack. She had a season-high 16 rebounds against Somerset-Berkley and logged a triple double against Joseph Case this season.

Kerin Connolly, Tri-County

Connolly closed out her sensational sophomore campaign with 10.4 points per game while connecting from 3-point range 23 times to earn Mayflower Athletic Conference Offensive Player of The Year recognition. A fierce competitor, Connolly ran the point for the Cougars, emerging as one of the top players in the Mayflower Athletic Conference. She also had 25 assists and 38 steals.
