

# The Girls Basketball All-Stars

## Tia Williamson, Attleboro

A two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Williamson was a big part of Attleboro's interior play, maintaining a role in the post that had her as one of the best at the position in the league. The senior forward averaged a double-double across the season with 10.2 points and 11.3 rebounds per game to be named a Hockomock League All-Star.

## Shannon LaMorticelli, Bishop Feehan

LaMorticelli averaged 7.6 points and seven rebounds a game as a junior for the Shamrocks, posting four double-doubles with seven games in double-digit scoring and a high of 21 points. A grinder on both ends of the court, LaMorticelli was strong under the basket as a scorer and rebounder. She also had 2.6 steals per game and was 38% from 3-point range.

## Mollie Mullen, Bishop Feehan

Mullen assumed the top scorer spot for Bishop Feehan and ran away with it, being the central figure in an offense that was spread around, but often came back to her. The senior was named the Catholic Central League MVP as she averaged 17 points per game with a game-high of 30 points while averaging 31 minutes a game. Mullen was the only returning starter from Bishop Feehan's prior title-bound teams and the defensive anchor continued to get under opponents' skin. The two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star averaged six steals a game and was part of a defense that allowed only 40 points per game all season.

## Avery Teixeira, Bishop Feehan

Teixeira did a lot of the dirty work for Bishop Feehan, whether it was battling hard on both ends for rebounds despite being undersized, or trying to disrupt offenses with her smothering defense. The junior guard averaged seven rebounds per game with six games in double digits (a high of 14), and averaged 1.5 steals a game. She also averaged seven points game with a career high of 19 in an overtime win over St. Mary's that sealed the CCL title for the Shamrocks.

## Reese Jefferson, Dighton-Rehoboth

Jefferson was a big piece of D-R's success this season with 9.1 points per game for 173 total, 3.4 rebounds per game (51) and 2.5 assists per game (32). She also had 38 steals, averaging 2.5 per game. The senior captain hit from 3-point range often, scoring 120 points from distance, including a night where she had seven against Somerset Berkley.

## Alaysia Drummonds, Foxboro

The two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star has continued to improve, year after year, and in her junior season elevated herself to one of the best two-way guards in the area. Drummonds averaged 14.5 points per game with 49 3-pointers, hitting from the field a team-leading 46.75 of the time. The Hockomock League All-Star's ability to finish through contact and get to the free-throw line, where she was a team-best 70% shooter, and her ability to create separation for chances off the dribble made her a weapon and the Shamrocks' Offensive Player of The Year.

## Adrianna Porazzo, Foxboro

The Warriors' senior slid into the point guard spot this winter and was among the best in the area, closing out her high school career with 724 career points while averaging a team-leading 15.7 points during her final season. Porazzo drilled 53 3-pointers and averaged 4.2 assists, both team-high totals. The Warriors' MVP

was a dominant player who had unselfish tendencies and an ability to take off in scoring to once again be a Sun Chronicle All-Star and a Hockomock League All-Star.

## Tatum Morgan, King Philip

Averaging 14 points per game, Morgan led King Philip to a 14-win season as the go-to scorer and the Hockomock League Kelley-Rex Division MVP as a junior. Mor-

gan achieved most of her success from outside the arc, connecting for over 100 career 3-pointers with the Warriors. The two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star also averaged two steals per game in an aggressive King Philip defense.

## Katie Stierer, King Philip

The junior provided balanced production for the Warriors, averaging nine points per game with four rebounds, four assists and two steals. A two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Stierer was do-it-all type of player who was used effectively by King Philip to again be a Hockomock League All-Star.

## Sophie Clang, Mansfield

Clang was a lockdown defender for Mansfield in her junior season, slowing down the top guards across the Hockomock League. Clang was a Hockomock League All-Star as a great fundamental player who boxed out, provided strong defense and has improved her scoring touch. She averaged seven points per game with a notable 18-point game coming in a win over North Attleboro.

A 6-foot tall sophomore, Egan averaged 13.2 points, 8.3 rebounds and 1.9 assists in 21 games for the Rocketeers. The Hockomock League All-Star forward had three games of 20 points or more along with five double-doubles, acting as a central piece of North's youth movement under first-year head coach Julia Feid.

## Isabella Houghton, North Attleboro

Houghton's sophomore campaign ended with her scoring 205 points at a 9.3 per game clip, along with averaging 6.5 rebounds and two assists. The Hockomock League All-Star amassed a team-high 44 assists and in 22 games, had three double-doubles, posting a career-high of 19 points in a win over King Philip.
