

The Girls Outdoor Track All-Stars



King Philip Regional High senior Sydney O’Shea took six top-10 finishes at the MIAA Meet of Champions and won the long jump title at the MIAA Division 3 Championships.

Elayna Marinelli, Attleboro

As Bombardiers coach Jillian Ellis put it, Marinelli and javelin go hand and hand with the Attleboro senior captain holding the school record in the event (personal best 116-6). Marinelli placed third in the javelin at the MIAA Division 1 Championships after a second-place finish at the Hockomock League Championships. Her personal best came as she took sixth at the MIAA Meet of Champions. An All-Hockomock League selection, Marinelli scored 42 points during the season. She is a first-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Emilia Smith, Attleboro

Smith showcased the potential to be one of the premier up-and-coming distance runners in the Hockomock League. The Bombardier freshman took fourth place in the mile at the league competition before running a personal best (5:26.99) at the MIAA Division 1 Championships. Smith also took third in the league’s underclassmen meet. She finished with 48 points this season en route to All-Hockomock honors. Smith is a first-time Sun Chronicle selection.

Anna Boyd, Bishop Feehan

Boyd continued to be one of the best two-mile runners in the state during her senior year with the program. The Shamrock standout, who earned a third-place finish at the Nike Indoor Nationals

in March, claimed the MIAA Division 2 crown in the two-mile behind an improved personal best (10:58.94). It came after Boyd already finished first in the event at the Central Catholic League meet. The All-CCL selection went on to finish fifth at the MIAA Meet of Champions. Boyd will continue her running career in cross country and track at the University of South Carolina.

Maeve Parrish, Bishop Feehan

The Bishop Feehan senior claimed Central Catholic League titles in both the 800 meters and 4x400 relay for the Shamrocks. It was the 800 which proved to be Parrish’s most notable event as she placed fourth at the MIAA Division 2 Championships and ninth in the MIAA Meet of Champions with a personal best 2:17.25. Parrish also took part in the 200 and 400 for the Shamrocks. She is a multi-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Brooke Serak, Bishop Feehan

The Shamrock freshman put together a wildly impressive rookie season with three MIAA Division 2 place finishes. Most notably, Serak claimed the divisional crown in the shot put while finishing fifth in the long jump (personal best 17-4) and sixth in the discus. She had a pair of top-10 finishes at the MIAA Meet of Champions as she took eighth in the shot put and 10th in the discus (personal best 105-5). Her personal best in the shot put (40-5) came at the MSTCA Div. 2 Relays, as she took first.

Heidi Lawrence, King Philip

The Warrior sophomore placed in three events at the Hockomock League Championships including a third-place finish in the triple jump, the event she also placed

fourth during the MIAA Division 2 Championships (personal best 35-4). Lawrence would add a seventh-place finish in the long jump while running the anchor leg for the 4x100 relay team. She was recognized by the program as the Most Improved Athlete and was named a Hockomock League honorable mention. She is a first-time Sun Chronicle selection.

Katharine O’Neil, King Philip

Competing in her second season with the Warriors, the King Philip sophomore continued to showcase her potential in the shot put. O’Neil took third in the event at the Hockomock League Championships prior to placing fifth in the shot put at the MIAA Division 2 Championships. She set her personal best earlier in the season with a third-place finish at the MSTCA Div. 2 relays (36-2.75). O’Neil was recognized as league all-star and is a first-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Sydney O’Shea, King Philip

An All-Hockomock League selection, King Philip’s Female Senior Athlete of the Year earned top-10 finishes in six events at the MIAA Meet of Champions. The senior captain finished third in the 800 meters (personal best 2:36.61), sixth in both the shot put (personal best 28-2.25) and long jump (personal best 16-2.5) as well as ninth in the high jump and 10th in the 100 hurdles (personal best 17.87). At the MIAA Division 3 Championships, O’Shea claimed the crown in the long jump (personal best 17-5), was the runner-up in the 800 and took third in the shot put, high jump and triple jump. She had three top-four finishes at the league meet, as well.

Our Selections

THE GIRLS TRACK ALL-STAR TEAM was selected with local coaches consulted for their recommendations.

Anna Buckley, Mansfield

The Hockomock League All-Star set a Mansfield school record in the long jump (18-1) as she placed sixth in the event at the MIAA Meet of Champions. And that took place after the Hornet senior captain earned three top-four finishes at the Hockomock Championships, including a runner-up finish in the 100 hurdles, a third place in the long jump and fourth place in the triple jump. She competed at the MIAA Division 3 Championships in all three events with her outing highlighted by a second-place finish in the long jump and personal best (16.1) in the 100 meters. She is a multi-time Sun Chronicle selection.

Anna Darlington, Mansfield

Darlington was crowned a MIAA Division 3 champion in the 400 meters behind a personal best (58.80) and anchored Mansfield’s 4x400 team as the Hornets earned the divisional title. She took second in the 200 at the meet behind a personal best (26.09). The Mansfield senior previously had finished as the runner-up in both the 200 and 400 at the Hockomock League Championships after helping the 4x400 relay to a first-place finish. She competed in all three events at the MIAA Meet of Champions. Darlington was well-deserving of an All-Hockomock selection and is a multi-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Caitlin Dumouchel, Mansfield

Dumouchel concluded her senior season by repeating as a MIAA Division 3 champion in both the javelin and 4x400 relay. She won consecutive Hockomock League titles in both events, as well, throwing for a school record in the javelin at the league meet (134-5). Dumouchel also placed sixth in the javelin at the New England Championships. She was equally impressive in the 400 hurdles with a runner-up finish at the Hockomock League Championships, third place at the Div. 3 level and ninth at the MIAA Meet of Champions (personal best 1:06.89). An All-Hockomock honoree, she compiled 188.5 points in her career and is a multi-time Sun Chronicle selection.

Chloe Guthrie, Mansfield

Guthrie showcased early promise for the Hornets, portraying herself as a dynamite sprinter during her freshman season. An All-Hockomock League selection, Guthrie anchored the MIAA Division 3 champion 4x100 relay team while simultaneously finishing third in the 100 and fourth in
