
# The Softball All-Stars

#### Jenna Callahan, Attleboro

A sophomore pitcher who has firmly taken a hold of the ace status, Callahan's ability to keep batters off-balance and work all parts of the plate saw her post a 3.34 ERA with a 10-5 record. The Hockomock League All-Star was just as much a tone setter at the plate as she was in the field, hitting .407 with 24 hits, 10 runs scored, 25 RBIs and a home run. The multiple-time Sun Chronicle All-Star also helped hold eventual state finalist King Philip Regional at bay in the first round of the MIAA Division 1 tournament before an extra-inning comeback bounced the Bombardiers.

#### Rylie Camacho, Attleboro

One of the top catchers in all of the Hockomock League, the Westfield State University commit hit .394 with 26 hits, a pair of home runs and 25 RBIs in her senior season. Camacho, a multiple-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, was also the primary catcher and a senior leader for a young pitching staff, which she helped mentor into the MIAA Division 1 postseason where the Bombardiers nearly knocked off eventual state finalist King Philip.

# Madison Moran, Attleboro

The junior third baseman hit for a .411 average with the Bombardiers, driving in 29 runs while scoring 13 times out of the five spot in a talented top half of the Bombardiers order. Moran went yard four times out of her 23 hits this past season, capping off her junior year strong ahead of her final go around in blue and white.

## Victoria Parent, Attleboro

The heart of the order as a senior first baseman, Parent posted a top-10 average in the league at .464, closing out her senior season in style. She had 26 hits in 56 at-

bats, drove in 29 runs while also scoring 22 times and homered four times for the Bombardiers.

#### Lola Ronayne, Attleboro

A needed addition after the departure of shortstop/pitcher Lily Routhier last year, Ronayne instantly made an impact as a freshman. The Hockomock League All-Star sophomore hit .484 with 30 hits, 24 runs scored, 24 RBIs and three homers as an infielder, and added relief to Callahan when needed with a 3-2 record in the pitching circle, striking out 38 in 39 innings.

#### Sarah Dupre, Bishop Feehan

The senior center fielder was perfect in the field, and in 17 games hit .315 with an OPS of .801 and an on-base percentage of .431. Dupre tallied 17 hits, three doubles, six RBIs, 14 runs scored and 11 walks for the Shamrocks out of the leadoff spot. On the base paths, she stole four bases, not getting caught once. Dupre is a multiple-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and a Catholic Central League All-Star.

## Madison Narcucci, Bishop Feehan

The senior Catholic Central League All-Star led all hitters with 30 plate appearances or more, hitting .333 for the Shamrocks near the middle of the order. Her OPS just narrowly missed 1.000, sitting at .999, and her slugging percentage was .638. The senior led the team in hits with 23 and doubles with seven, also homering four times with 23 RBIs and 11 runs scored.

## Mylee Ramer, Bishop Feehan

Ramer was one of the biggest difference-makers for the team in the area, providing shut-down pitching in the circle for the 14-win Shamrocks to help them earn a top-10 seed in the Division 1 tournament. The junior pitched 136 <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> innings, going

12-8 with a whopping 247 strikeouts for the Shamrocks. The multiple-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and Catholic Central League All-Star held opponents to a 1.01 WHIP and an average of .193 while posting an ERA of 2.04.

#### Allison Bastis, Dighton-Rehoboth

The Falcons senior third baseman hit .329 with an OPS of .861 in 73 at bats. She had 25 hits, eight doubles, 16 RBIs and 16 runs scored while going .973 in the field in 73 chances.

#### Caleigh Cloonan, Dighton-Rehoboth

The senior sister of Camryn, Caleigh herself put together a quality season for the Falcons. Cloonan hit .309 with an OPS of .842, tallying 25 hits with six doubles and a home run. She drove in 12 RBIs and scored 20 runs as a top of the order bat for the Falcons, setting up for the heart of the order. When given the chance on the basepaths she was a green light runner, stealing eight bases.

## **Camryn Cloonan, Dighton-Rehoboth**

The embodiment of a 'must watch' ballplayer, Cloonan was electrifying come tournament time where the sophomore hit six home runs, including a two-run homer in the state title game. A two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and a South Coast Conference All-Star as a sophomore, Cloonan hit .490 with an OPS of 1.731 and a slugging percentage of 1.194 to go with 16 home runs, 11 doubles and five triples out of her 48 hits, driving in 42 RBI with 50 runs scored. The infielder committed only two errors in 93 chances for the Falcons' second-best fielding percentage.

## Skye Harrison, Dighton-Rehoboth

The junior outfielder was stellar, hitting .385 with an OPS of .951 for the state champion Falcons. She had 25 hits, six doubles and eight RBI, but scored 27 times while drawing 11 walks — bringing her on-base percentage up to .474.

## Haleigh Kelley, Dighton-Rehoboth

The trusted junior shortstop for the Falcons hit .412 in the middle of a hardto-pitch-around lineup, posting an OPS of 1.356 and a slugging percentage of .812. She tallied 33 hits, nine doubles, seven home runs and 27 RBIs paired with 34 runs scored. A game-changing infielder with range and determination, her bat came up big in big moments, showing in a 2-for-4 Elite 8 game where she homered, drove in a pair of runs and scored twice.

## **Edy Latour, Dighton-Rehoboth**

The freshman South Coast Conference Al-Star was a threat from both sides of the field as a hitting pitcher. At the plate, she hit .403 with an OPS of 1.203 and a slugging percentage of .710, hitting eight doubles with three homers out of her 25 hits. She drove in 15 runs behind the heart of the order. In the circle, she pitched 129 <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> innings, starting 17 of her 21 appearances. going 18-3 with one save and 121 strikeouts as the left-hander that relied on off-speed and moving the ball.

## **Lucy Latour, Dighton-Rehoboth**

Latour was a nightmare for opponents in an already extremely tough D-R lineup, hitting .560 with an OPS of 1.633 for the highest in the area. Her slugging was 1.060 with seven of her 56 hits going for a home run. The senior also had 21 doubles, three triples, 44 RBIs and 38 runs scored. A South Coast Conference All-Star and multiple-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Latour was one of the best outfielders in the state. She went 3-for-4 in the state final, driving in the winning run to earn the hardware.
