Caroline Watson, King Philip

A four-year starter in the cage, the Hockomock League All-Star will leave some big shoes to fill for the KP program. Watson made 195 saves during her senior campaign, stopping more than 50 percent of the shots she faced with a 10.5 goals-against average. "She excelled at stepping up to cut down the shooting angles of attacking opponents," Kourtne Wilder said of Watson, who is a first-time Sun Chronicle All-Star. "She came up with big saves in competitive games."

Maggie Danehy, Mansfield

The senior Danehy was all over the field for the 10-win Hornets, who qualified for the MIAA Tournament. She was a fixture on the draw circle, a hawk around bouncing ground balls and excelled while doing her part on both the defensive end and transition role. A first time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Danehy scored 27 goals with five assists this season. "She always gave 100 percent," Hornet coach Lauryn Wilkie said of the three-year contributor, who was a three-sport athlete at Mansfield.

Katie Garvin, Mansfield

The senior led not just the Hornet attack, but was among the highest scorers in the Hockomock League with 100 goals on the season and 200-plus in her four-year career. "If we needed goals, she would get it done," Lauryn Wilkie said of the multi-time Sun Chronicle selection and two-time Hockomock League All-Star. Garvin contributed 31 assists to go with her cage-attacking prowess. "Her skills and quickness made her an asset all over the field," Wilkie said. Garvin will play at Endicott College.

Melissa Shanteler, Mansfield

The Mansfield sophomore and first time Sun Chronicle selection will carry some high hopes in the future after a breakout year, her first season in the starting line up. Shanteler was among the best defensive players for the Hornets this season, playing down low for the first time. "She has a natural ability to read a player and shut them down," Lauryn Wilkie said. The speedy Shanteler was equally crucial in helping the 10-win Hornets slow down an opponent's fast break.

Lauren Whitman, Mansfield

"Her control on the circle had her winning a majority of our draws while her sharpness and skill made her a key component in our transitional game," Lauryn Wilkie said of the Hornet senior captain. A two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Whitman scored 63 goals with 13 assists this season while surpassing the 100 career-goal threshold for the MIAA

Tournament-qualifying Hornets. She was equally as strong on the defensive end while forcing turnovers. Whitman will play at Simmons College.

Regan Fein, North Attleboro

A Hockomock League All-Star, Fein was earned 'Team MVP' honors this season for the 8-win Rocketeers. The junior midfielder, who tallied 36 points on the season, was consistently showing her ability on both the offensive and defensive ends of the field. "Her draw control, ground balls, lacrosse IQ, shot placements and stick work were a huge contribution to this team's success," North Attleboro coach Colleen Manning said of Fein, a first-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Katie Lindstrom, North Attleboro

The Rocketeer attacker concluded her junior season in the top-10 in scoring among the Hockomock League as she finished with 81 points on 65 goals and 16 assists this season. "She was consistently performing at a high level," Colleen Manning said of Lindstrom, an All-Hockomock selection and first time Sun Chronicle All-Star. Lindstrom, who was named Offensive MVP for the 8-win Rocketeers averaged four goals per game. She is a captain-elect for the 2020 season.

Lauren Pezzi, North Attleboro

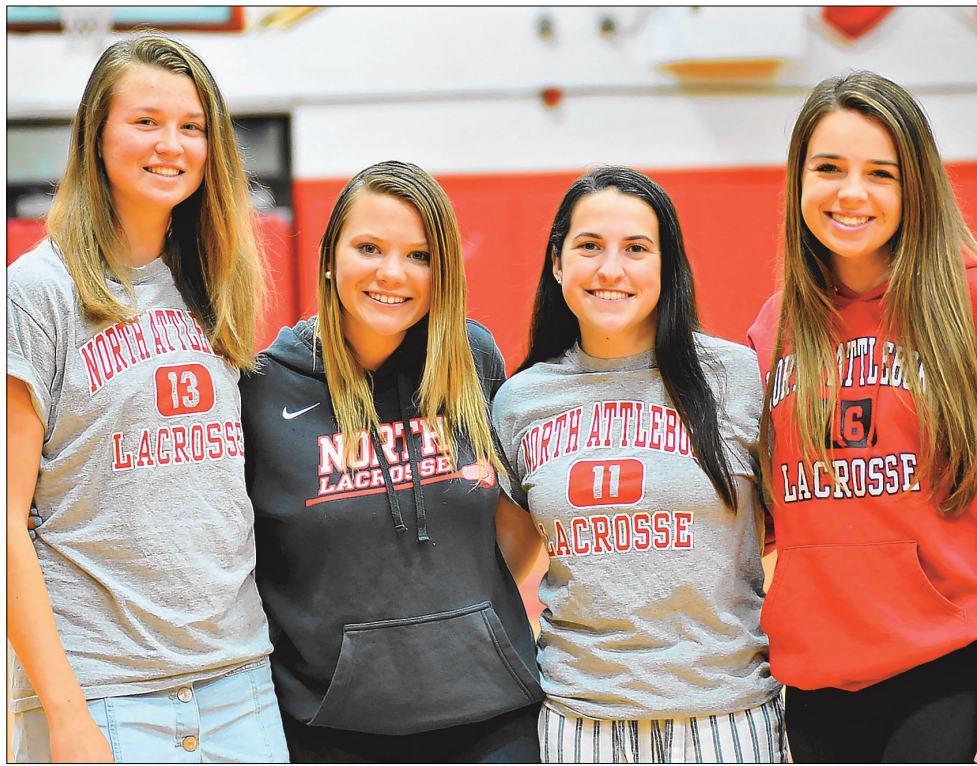
The senior captain and Hockomock League All-Star was the most influential of players that took the field for the 8-win Rocketeers. Pezzi was the program's most talented defender, earning her 'Defensive MVP,' while her ability to lead by example and showcase an unmatched work ethic was idolized far more than her stick finesse and fast footwork. "Lauren's lacrosse IQ is above average," Colleen Manning said of Pezzi, a first-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Lexi Sinacola, North Attleboro

A first-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, the senior captain continued to climb the ladder of success in her Rocketeer career which was properly capped by her final season in which she scored 25 goals and tallied 21 points to finish second on the team in points (46). Sinacola was well-balanced on the attack for the 8-win Rocketeers as she utilized her teammates' abilities to her advantage. "She played with heart, passion, dedication and determination," Colleen Manning said.

Ava Gesner, Norton

A first time Sun Chronicle All-Star, the Lancer underclassman was the heart and soul on the offensive end. With her speed and stick work, Gesner had an ability to find the back of the net through traffic, scoring at a rapid rate all season. The Norton sophomore attacker scored a season-high six goals against Norwood while she scored five against Dedham and four in a 9-7 win over Old Colony. Gesner was a Sun Chronicle honorable mention following her freshman season.
