Michael Canova, North Attleboro

Canova was a senior staple for the Rocketeers at 132, racking up a 41-10 record for North Attleboro over the course of the season. At the Division 2 Central Sectional, the two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star earned a second-place finish as the second seed, winning two matches following a first-round bye. At the Division 2 state meet, Canova won his first two matches before falling into consolation and working his way back to a third-place finish.

Zac Faria, North Attleboro

Faria won the Division 2 Central Sectional title as the top seed at 113, needing only three wins. The North Attleboro junior had a first-round bye before out-scoring his next three opponents 44-10 to take top honors. The Hockomock League All-Star placed third at the Division 2 state meet, bouncing back from an early loss to get to the consolation final where he was pinned in the second period. Faria closed out with a 43-13 record.

Ryan Gill, North Attleboro

Only a sophomore, Gill was the Hockomock League champion at 120 and the Division 2 Central Sectional titlist in his division for the Rocketeers. Gill had four wins by pin at the sectional and took third at the Division 2 state meet, battling back from a loss to close out his final day 4-1. The Hockomock League All-Star finished sixth at the All-State meet, winning three bouts as he put the wraps on a 52-15 season in which he provided crucial points for North Attleboro's 15-win dual meet season that saw them win the Davenport Division crown.

Abdullah Peterson, North Attleboro

Peterson placed second at the Division 2 Central Sectional at 144 pounds as the top seed. Peterson went on to finish sixth at the Division 2 state meet, winning three matches there. He also was the runner-up at the Hockomock League Championship at 144. The Rocketeer senior was a Hockomock League All-Star and one of many key figures in North's lineup, finishing the season at 47-8.

Jacoby Flynn, Norton

Flynn took third at the Division 3 state

meet at 144, closing out his divisional run with a 6-4 decision win to take the consolation bracket. At the Division 3 Central Sectional, the Lancers' junior took three wins as the top seed and then wrestled at the All-State meet but did not place. One of three key scorers for Norton all season, the two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star put up a 44-8 record and was a Tri-Valley League All-Star.

Dillan Mueller, Norton

A three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Mueller's senior season saw him go on a strong run at 132, particularly in the post-season. Mueller won the 132 Division 3 Central Sectional title for the second year in a row, pinning three straight opponents followed by a 3-2 decision win. At the Division 3 state meet, Mueller took the title again by pinning three straight opponents and securing a 7-3 decision in the final. He wrestled at the All-State meet, but did not place, finishing the season at 44-4.

Kayden Plumb, Norton

Plumb was the Division 3 Central Sectional champ for a second straight year, winning all four of his bouts as the top seed at 126. The Norton junior and two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star won two by pin, one by technical fall and one by decision. He continued his success at the Division 3 meet where he took third, working back in consolations to win the back half of the bracket with a 20-3 technical fall. Plumb wrestled at the All-State meet but did not reach the podium as he finished the season at 42-12 and was a Tri-Valley League All-Star.

Patrick Cloney, Tri-County

Cloney was one of the top wrestlers of the Division 2 Central Sectional, finishing third at 126 as the second seed. Cloney then placed fifth at the Division 2 state meet, closing out his junior season after taking four wins at states. He went 41-7.

Anthony Gagne, Tri-County

Gagne dominated at the Division 2 Central Sectional as the top-seeded grappler brought home the title at 190. The Cougars' junior notched three straight pins and a decision to win his bracket. At the Division 2 state meet, Gagne won three matches for sixth place, closing the book on a dominant 31-9 season as a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.
