the 200 meters (personal best 26.12). She finished third in the 200 and fourth in the 100 (personal best 12.63) during the Hockomock competition. Guthrie is a first-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Abigail Scott, Mansfield

The Mansfield sophomore qualified for the MIAA Meet of Champions in three events and set personal bests in both the 100 (12.7) and 200 meters (seventh, 25.62) during the competition. Scott previously ran the first leg for Mansfield's MIAA Division 3 champion 4x400 relay, which took second at the Hockomock League Championships. She also placed third in the 200 and fourth in the 100 at the Div. 3 competition after a fifth-place finish in the 100 at the league meet. She is a first-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Megan Burns, North Attleboro

The Rocketeers senior captain placed second at the MIAA Division 2 Championships in the discus behind a personal best (99-4) after taking sixth in the event during the Hockomock League Championships. Burns, who qualified for the MIAA Meet of Champions in the discus, was the fourth-highest scorer on the Rocketeers. She was named an All-Hockomock League selection. Burns is a first-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Abby Camelio, North Attleboro

The Rocketeer senior captain made the most of her opportunities as she became one of the best javelin throwers not just in the Hockomock League, but the state. Camelio finished third at the MIAA Division 3 Championships in the javelin while setting a new personal best by seven feet (116-6). She also took third in the event at the MSTCA Div. 3 Relays and fourth at the Hockomock League Championships. She advanced to the MIAA Meet of Champions. Camelio is a first-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Marissa Daley, North Attleboro

A Hockomock League All-Star, Daley placed in two events at the MIAA Division 3 Championships with a fourth-place finish in the triple jump (personal best 34-8) and the Rocketeers' 4x100 relay team claiming seventh. She also finished seventh in the triple jump at the league meet. The Rocketeer junior, who scored the third-most point for the Rocketeers, competed in the 100, 200 and long jump this season. She is a first-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Sienna Newth, North Attleboro

Newth won the shot put in all five of North Attleboro's Hockomock League dual meets this season before placing seventh in the event at the MIAA Division 3 Championships (personal best 31-3.5). The Rocketeer sophomore, who also took third in the shot put at the MSTCA Div. 3 Relays,

placed in a pair of events at the Hockomock League Championships as she took seventh in both the shot put and discus. A first-time Sun Chronicle selection, she scored the second-most points for the Rocketeers this spring.

Sydney O'Connor, North Attleboro

The Rocketeers Team MVP placed sixth at the MIAA Division 3 Championships in the pentathlon (2054 points) with fourth-place finishes in the 800 meters (personal best 2:47.59), 100 hurdles (personal best 18.60), shot put (personal best 23-3.5) along with a fifth place in the high jump and ninth place in the long jump. The North Attleboro sophomore also took fourth in the 400 hurdles (personal best 1:13.27) and eighth in the high jump at the league meet while running with the 4x400 relay team. She finished as the team's top point scorer and is a first-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Ali Murphy, Norton

The Lancer junior won both the 200 and 400 meters at the MIAA Division 5 Championships before finishing as the runner-up in both events at the MIAA Meet of Champions and ultimately qualifying for both at the New Balance National Outdoor competition. Murphy, who was named Tri-Valley League MVP, also claimed All-New England honors as she placed fourth in the 200 at the regional competition. Murphy, who won the 100 and 200 at the Tri-Valley League Championships, broke her own school record in the 400 at New Balance Nationals (personal best 55.51). She is a multi-time Sun Chronicle selection.

Zoe Santos, Norton

Santos won the Tri-Valley League title in the high jump (personal best 5-2) despite the Lancer freshman being in her first season with the program. She advanced to the MIAA Division 5 Championships where she placed fourth in the high jump before ultimately competing at

the New Balance National Outdoor competition where she claimed seventh in the freshman high jump. She also competed in both the 200 and 400. Santos is a first-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Jillian Strynar, Norton

Strynar earned a MIAA Division 5 crown in the 100 meters before advancing to place eighth at the MIAA Meet of Champions and ultimately competing at the New Balance Nationals. The Lancer sophomore also finished as the runner-up in the 200 at the Div. 5 competition before placing seventh at the All-State meet. Strynar was the runner-up in three events at the Tri-Valley League Championships doing so in the 100, 200 and triple jump. She also ran for the fourth-place 4x100 relay, which took fourth at the Div. 5 meet.

Jillian Audette, Seekonk

Audette claimed crowns in both the 100 meters and 4x100 relay during the South Coast Conference meet before she went on to place in both events at the MIAA Division 5 Championships. Audette qualified for the MIAA Meet of Champions by claiming fourth in the 100 at the divisional meet while helping the Warriors to a sixth-place finish in the relay. The Seekonk junior also competed in the 200 at the Div. 5 meet, and placed eighth in the long jump at the South Coast Conference competition. Audette is a first-time Sun Chronicle selection.

Lauren Morales, Seekonk

The Warrior junior was a member of the South Coast Conference-winning 4x100 relay while also finishing as the runner-up in both the shot put and discus. Morales advanced to take third in the discus at the MIAA Division 5 Championships (personal best 96-4) with a top-10 finish in the shot put. Morales and the relay team placed sixth in the divisional meet. She also competed in the 200. Morales is a first-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.
