

The Softball All-Stars

Jenna Callahan, Attleboro

Callahan was one of the best hitters in the Hockomock League, tallying 56 hits to finish the season with a .560 average. The senior slugger also had a .625 on-base percentage and a slugging percentage of .860. The multi-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and four-time league all-star also hit five homers, drove in 29 RBIs and had 50 runs scored. As the go-to pitcher for Attleboro, Callahan went 132 $\frac{2}{3}$ innings with a 15-4 record and 111 strikeouts, posting a 3.58 ERA with a WHIP of 1.51, utilizing her precision and craftiness to get hitters out.

Lola Ronayne, Attleboro

The three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star continued to be a problem for the opposition, hitting 18 home runs with 52 RBIs and 44 runs scored. A .529 hitter, the Bombardiers' junior had an on-base percentage on .638 to go with a 1.318 slugging percentage. Ronayne teamed up with Callahan to form one of the most lethal 1-2 punches in the league and in Division 1, leading to the Hockomock League All-Star often getting worked around as team's chose to take their chances elsewhere in the lineup. In the circle, Ronayne pitched 36 $\frac{1}{3}$ innings with an ERA of 3.08 and 26 strikeouts.

Olivia Abren, Bishop Feehan

Abren was a central part of Bishop Feehan's lineup, boasting a .353 average with an on-base percentage of .413 with 24 hits. The junior shot the gaps and utilized her speed successfully, driving 11 doubles with 16 RBIs, 12 runs scored and six walks.

Izzy Cox, Bishop Feehan

Cox led the Shamrocks at the plate with a team-high .426 average in her junior season and reached base more than half the time for an on-base percentage of .519. Cox also led the team in hits with 29, tallying five for extra bases with two home runs. Cox drove in 13 runs and scored 21 runs.

Zoey Pereira, Bishop Feehan

Pereira tallied 19 hits in her sophomore campaign, batting .328 with an on-base percentage of .458 in 22 games played. She had two doubles, a triple and a home run to go with nine RBIs and nine runs scored. Pereira utilized her plate discipline to work 12 walks.

Camryn Cloonan, Dighton-Rehoboth

Cloonan wrapped a dominant high school career as a multi-team Sun Chronicle All-Star with a batting average of .515 and a slugging percentage of 1.221 in 68 at bats. She had 35 hits, eight doubles, five triples and 10 homers. She also drove in 46 runs and scored 49 times with 18 stolen bases. The veteran captain shortstop was the South Coast Conference MVP for the season and will go on this fall to play at the Division 1 level with Villanova.

Haley Gomes, Dighton-Rehoboth

The Falcons' freshman catcher debuted by batting .440 with 37 hits, 11 doubles, three triples and 28 RBIs. She also scored 22 times. Besides producing in the cleanup spot, Gomes was strong defensively with just one error and 10 runners caught stealing. She was also a South Coast Conference All-Star.

Edy Latour, Dighton-Rehoboth

Latour was a dual threat for the Falcons, providing both excellence as a hitter and as a pitcher. At the plate, the junior batted .367 with 20 hits, and nine for extra bases. Latour drove in 15 runs as well. In 17 games (75 $\frac{1}{3}$ innings), she struck out 84, posting an ERA of 3.06 while stranding 76 runners on base. The three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and SCC All-Star worked back from a leg injury after she missed the first five games of the season to produce both quality innings and at-bats for the MIAA Div. 3 state semifinalists.

Sara Marsella, Dighton-Rehoboth

Marsella rose to the occasion in her senior season as a captain and a SCC All-Star, hitting .397 with 33 hits, 20 singles and 12 doubles. She also drove in 29 runs and scored 24 runs. In addition to her reliability in right field, Marsella provided much-needed help as pitching depth for the Falcons. She struck out 236 of 124 batters in her seven games (28 innings) and posted a 2.50 ERA.

Olivia Jaworski, Foxboro

Jaworski was a defensive master in center field for Foxboro, tracking down anything in the gaps to take away extra-base hits. The junior Hockomock League All-Star led the Warriors in RBIs with 25 and hit .433 with 26 hits and 10 runs scored. She also clubbed three homers.

Dighton-Rehoboth Regional High senior Camryn Cloonan was the Falcons' catalyst at the plate with a .515 batting average, 46 RBIs and 10 home runs.

Meghan Kelley, Foxboro

The Warriors were again led by Kelley at shortstop in her final season to conclude her four-year career at the varsity level. The multi-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and two-time Hockomock League All-Star

Anna Patterson, Foxboro

Patterson's freshman season was one of the best in recent league history as she went 11-2 with a 10-0 record in Hockomock League play, posting a 2.49 ERA for the Warriors. Patterson fired a no-hitter in the state tournament to blank Lynnfield. The Hockomock League All-Star was a big factor to the Warriors' success with a .352 average, tallying 25 hits with 29 runs scored and 23 RBIs. She also led Foxboro with seven homers.

Annabelle Curran, King Philip

Curran hit .415 with an OPS of 1.145 in a team-high 119 at-bats, tallying 39 hits, 25 RBIs, 36 runs scored and a team-best 21 walks. Only a sophomore, Curran is a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and stole nine bases, playing a big part of King Philip's ever dangerous lineup to help them clinch the MIAA Division 2 title. She was a Hockomock League All-Star.
