

The Softball All-Stars

Jenna Callahan, Attleboro

A dual infielder and pitcher, Callahan ended her junior season batting .500, with 32 hits 20 RBIs, 29 runs scored and a pair of home runs. A multi-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and three-time Hockomock League All-Star, Callahan posted a 4.07 ERA in the pitchers circle with good control and ability to keep hitters off-balance. She struck out 92 and posted a WHIP of 1.349 as she was named the Bombardiers' MVP for a second straight season.

Madison Moran, Attleboro

The Bombardiers' senior third baseman capped her career on a high note in her fourth season as a varsity starter. Moran hit .492 with four home runs, tallying 28 hits with 30 RBIs and 33 runs scored and was a Hockomock League All-Star. A team captain, the two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star showed steady improvement throughout her Bombardier career to set the standard for the underclassmen.

Lola Ronayne, Attleboro

A heavy-hitting shortstop and power arm in the circle, Ronayne's sophomore season saw her put up big numbers at the plate. The two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star batted .517 and broke the single-season home run record for Attleboro with 17 homers among her 31 hits for the season. Ronayne drove in 45 runs, scored 33 runs and was the Hockomock League MVP in the Kelley-Rex Division. She was also the Bombardiers' Offensive Player of The Year.

Maddie Coupal, Bishop Feehan

The rangy shortstop provided plenty of production at the top of the order in her senior campaign after sitting out last season with a torn ACL. The dynamic infielder batted .451 and had an astounding OPS of 1.513, registering 32 hits with 13 doubles, a triple and six homers. She drove in 15 runs, scored 35 times and struck out only four times with 22 walks. Named, the Catholic Central League Defensive Player of the Year, Coupal was a CCL All-Star and will play at Boston University next season.

Caitlyn Deveney, Bishop Feehan

Deveney returned to the lineup this spring and batted .397 with an OPS of 1.165. The senior slugger had four doubles, a pair of triples and three homers with 18 RBIs and 21 runs scored, playing the hot corner for a Bishop Feehan team that made the Div. 1 semifinals and ended the season at 19-6.

Mylee Ramer, Bishop Feeehan

Ramer was again one of the top pitchers in the area, logging 133 innings and 22 games for the Shamrocks as the Catholic Central League MVP. The senior righthander and multi-time Sun Chronicle All-Star posted a record of 15-5 with an ERA of 1.26 and a WHIP of 0.82 as she struck out 207 batters. At the plate, Ramer batted .362 with an OPS of 1.416, 14 extra-base hits, six being home runs, and drove in 25 runs while scoring 11 runs.

Camryn Cloonan, Dighton-Rehoboth

Cloonan continued to light up the high school ranks as a junior, hitting .459 with an

on-base percentage of .613. The multi-time Sun Chronicle All-Star had 10 home runs, 36 RBIs, 44 runs scored and swiped 23 bases. One of the highest IQs on the field, Cloonan was a defensive wizard in the middle of the infield and a presence at the plate.

Emma Horrocks, Dighton-Rehoboth

One of the best all-around catchers in the area, Horrocks was a force at the plate and behind it. The senior stalwart caught 15 runners trying to steal this season and hit .512 with an on-base percentage of .544. She also clubbed 11 homers, eight doubles, and drove in 38 runs while scoring 16 times to close out her career. Horrocks will play at Holy Cross next spring.

Haleigh Kelley, Dighton-Rehoboth

Kelley was a threat everywhere on the field, playing steady defense at shortstop with a big bat. The senior team leader hit .403 with an on-base percentage of .516, clubbing seven homers with 31 RBIs and 27 runs scored. The two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star had a fielding percentage of .903.

Edy Latour, Dighton-Rehoboth

Latour was one of the best hitting pitchers in the area this spring, posting a .409 average and an on-base percentage of .512. The sophomore clubbed nine doubles and had 17 RBIs in the heart of the order for the Falcons. In the circle, Latour continued to elevate her already tremendous game, posting an ERA of 1.13 in 21 games starts with a record of 22-2. A two-time

Sun Chronicle All-Star, Latour stranded 102 runners on base in her 38 innings and fanned 142 batters on her way to her second Division 3 state title for the Falcons as their go-to arm.

Emma Callahan, Foxboro

A four-time Hockomock League All-Star, Callahan tallied her 100th career hit on her way to a Team MVP season. The Warriors senior batted .453 with 39 hits and 35 runs scored, driving in 22 RBIs. She struck out only once over the season and was a tough out at the plate. The multi-time Sun Chronicle All-Star had exceptional range in the field to pair with teammate Meghan Kelley at shortstop as one of the better middle infield pairs in the area.

Vittoria Cuscia, Foxboro

The engine that kept Foxboro going, Cuscia ended her career as a three-time Hockomock League All-Star. The senior four-year starting pitcher for Foxboro won 11 games this spring, and hit the 250-strikeout mark for her career. She pitched a no-hitter against Hudson and held St. Mary's to two hits in the state tourney. A two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Cuscia posted a 2.89 ERA and added a .349 batting average at the plate.

Meghan Kelley, Foxboro

The junior shortstop was terrific for the Warriors, batting .453 with 40 hits (including her 100th of her career), eight doubles and 17 RBIs. Kelley was Foxboro's Offensive Player of The Year and a Hockomock League All-Star with her game-changing presence in the field as well as on the basepaths where she stole nine bases. She is a The multi-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

THE SOFTBALL ALL-STAR TEAM was selected with local coaches consulted for their recommendations.

Jill Slattery, Foxboro

Slattery led the Warriors in RBIs her senior season with 28 as she provided timely hitting to help Foxboro to the MIAA Division 3 state semifinals. The Hockomock League All-Star added three home runs at the plate and was one of the best defensive center fielders in the league, committing only one error this past season.

Annabelle Curran, King Philip

Curran's freshman debut for the Warriors was nothing short of sensational as she hit .500 with an OPS of 1.276 and a team-high 39 hits. A Hockomock League All-Star, Curran legged out eight doubles and a pair of triples, drove in 24 runs, scored 35 runs and was nearly perfect on the basepaths with 28 stolen bases in 29 attempts.

Ali Gill, King Philip

Gill was the second half of King Philip's firepower when it came to home run power. The junior Hockomock League All-Star and multi-time Sun Chronicle All-Star slammed seven homers with 25 RBIs usually out of the leadoff spot, where she batted. .353 with an OPS of 1.279. Gill, who has already committed to play at Colgate, was second for the Warriors in stolen bases, utilizing her center fielder speed to pilfer 16 bags in 17 attempts.
