

# The Girls Hockey All-Stars



King Philip Regional High sophomore Ella Morgan collected 14 goals with six assists to rank second on the Warriors in scoring.

### Chloe Bryda, Bishop Feehan

In her fourth straight season as a starter, Bryda put together the best offensive season in recent Bishop-Feehan memory. Her 33 goals as a senior led the team by a country mile, and her 52 points put her among the state’s best for scoring. A Catholic Central League All-Star, this is Bryda’s second year as a Sun Chronicle All-Star.

### Annie Lough, Bishop Feehan

After finishing third on the Shamrocks in goals (13) and points (22), Lough earns her first nomination to the Sun Chronicle All-Star Team in her senior season. With her high hockey, she spent most of her ice time with Bryda and Murray, creating a trio of offensive threats for the Shamrocks.

### Georgia Murray, Bishop Feehan

In two years of high school hockey, Murray has garnered two Sun Chronicle All-Star nods and is a Catholic Central League All-Star. The sophomore’s 22 goals were second-most on the roster, and she led the Shamrocks with 58 points. After leading Bishop Feehan last season in points (23), Murray now makes back-to-back appearances on the Sun Chronicle All-Star Team.

### Aviva Olitsky, Bishop Feehan

Olitsky was the backbone for the Shamrocks, compiling a 16-6-2 record along with eight shutouts. The junior’s goals against average was a miniscule 1.46 with head coach Mike Cripps calling her “an elite goalie.” The two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star is also a Catholic Central League All-Star.



Bishop Feehan High junior goalie Aviva Olitsky went 16-6-2 in net this season, posting eight shutouts and a 1.46 goals against average.

### Annabelle Curran, King Philip

King Philip head coach Ken Assad called it an “incredible year,” and nobody helped the Warriors more than Curran. In her freshman season, she led KP in goals (17), assists (13) and points (30). The two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star was a key cog in a system that will retain its entire roster heading into next season.

### Stephanie Leblanc, King Philip

Leblanc became one of King Philip’s best offensive threats in her first season of high school hockey. She tallied 20 points with the Warriors, as the eighth grader quickly

### Kiki Lynch, King Philip
