Alex Jarousky, Attleboro

Jarousky was a tough player for the Bombardiers, converting from defense to left wing with the transition paying off big in his senior year. Jarousky collected seven goals and five assists this season and came up big in big games, scoring three game-winning goals. The Hockomock League All-Star netted the overtime winner against Foxboro on a penalty shot and scoring a last-minute goal for the lone goal of the game in a win over North Attleboro.

Beckett Stone, Attleboro

Only a sophomore, Stone's 23 points were the team-high as the scoring defenseman could take over games in Attleboro's favor. His ability to control pace of play, handle the puck in stride, and utilize his vision to find open teammates made him a threat in any spot. The Bombardiers' co-MVP was also a Hockomock League All-Star.

Jake Westwater, Attleboro

The Bombardiers' other sophomore co-MVP, Westwater logged 769 minutes in goal. The a Hockomock League All-Star picked up seven wins in net while posting a goals against average of 2.63 and a save percentage of 90.2 — both top-end numbers in the Hockomock League among goalies with 700-plus minutes played. His standout 34-save performance in a win over Foxboro, and a 37-save shutout of North Attleboro were highlights in a season where Westwater has assured that the Bombardiers' goaltending situation will be locked up for the next two seasons.

Thomas Besarick, Bishop Feehan

A junior defenseman, Besarick stabilized the Bishop Feehan blue line corps with his 10-point season. Besarick's ability to excel in all situations made him a pivotal player for the nine-win Shamrocks.

Christopher Morrison, Bishop Feehan


