

The Boys Soccer All-Stars

William Badger, Attleboro

A fast, high-motor, tough senior to stop up top, Badger was second on the team in points with 14, scoring six goals with eight assists as the Bombardiers’ co-MVP and a Hockomock League All-Star. Badger was also named an Eastern Mass All-Star and tabbed for All-State honors, completing a high school career on a high note as the “perfect soccer player,” said head coach Peter Pereira.

Luke Hagopian, Attleboro

Creative and shifty on the field, Hagopian helped feed the attack in the midfield and kept opposing attacks from doing much of anything going the other way. Hagopian finished his senior season with two goals and was second on the team in assists with seven as a skillful and high-IQ player on the field for the Bombardiers. Hagopian was a Hockomock League All-Star.

Tyler Rocchio, Attleboro

A multiple-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Rocchio continued his run as one of the best goalkeepers in the Hockomock League this fall, finishing the season with a record of 14-2-4 as a league all-star. The senior closed out his high school career as the winningest keeper in AHS’ program history, and ended the year with 12 shutouts and a goals against average of .700 behind a solid back line.

Corvengdjimy Thomas, Attleboro

Big and stronger than most sophomore players, Thomas’ role as a striker proved to make an immediate impact for the Bombardiers. He scored a team-high 10 goals for Attleboro and added six assists for a team-best 16 points as a rising and still improving attacker in the Hockomock League.

Zach Caisse, Bishop Feehan

Dominating on the field, Caisse was relentless against opposing defenses to the tune of amassing a team-high 20 goals this season — more than triple the next Shamrocks’ scorer. The junior’s goal-scoring ability also brought a knack for finding the extra pass to earn a team-high 10 assists. Caisse is a multiple-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and was a Catholic Central League All-Star.

Ethan Coyne, Bishop Feehan

A savvy and veteran senior midfielder, Coyne saw plenty of action on the break to post six goals and six assists this season, helping the Shamrocks close out the season with a record of 10-8-1. Coyne was also a Catholic Central League All-Star.

Bryce Doelher, Dighton-Rehoboth

The Falcons’ senior right back was the model of consistency and was another key to D-R’s state semifinal run on the back line, which posted nine shutout wins.

Ryan Moitoso, Dighton-Rehoboth

Moitoso was crucial for the Falcons, acting as an orchestrator and creator in the final third. The junior posted seven goals with five assists for the 11-win Falcons, who will enter his senior season next fall with plenty of established success in the SCC already.

Matthew Supernard, Dighton-Rehoboth

The senior center midfielder had a defensive mentality, Supernard was a two-year captain for the Falcons whoe utilized

his height and physicality to win 50-50 balls at midfield, allowing D-R to generate chances on offense. A high-IQ and spatially-aware player, Supernaud was a savvy veteran on the field for the Falcons.

Kristof Trond, Dighton-Rehoboth

A two-year captain for the Falcons, Trond capped his high school career with his second South Coast Conference all-star honor and was a senior leader for the D-R on offense. Trond collected a team-leading 14 goals, with four coming in tournament play.

John Hollis, Foxboro

An orchestrator for Foxboro to the maximum degree, Hollis had a hand in all but five goals for the Warriors for the season. The Hockomock League All-Star capped his senior campaign with 11 assists and two goals. “He was our creator who could make anything happen out of nothing,” Foxboro coach Colin Meiselman said. “He’s incredibly gifted with the ball at his feet.”

Jack Sullivan, Foxboro

Sullivan’s role as a versatile forward saw him receive an honorable mention from the Hockomock League at forward. Despite Foxboro’s struggles, the Warriors’ senior was a bright spot as a technical and crafty striker, finishing with nine goals and one assist.

Will Bowen, King Philip

A talented winger and multiple-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Bowen’s speed and athleticism also led to him doubling as an outside back when needed for King Philip. Bowen tied for the team-high in points, scoring three goals with six assists as a critical regular in the starting lineup and a Hockomock League All-Star.

Ryan Keller, King Philip

Keller’s role as an attacking midfielder helped translate to time at centerback for King Philip. A Hockomock League All-Star and selection First Team XI selection, the senior is also an Eastern Mass. All-Star, finishing the season with five goals and three assists for third-best on the team.

Neel McGrath, King Philip

Called the “most versatile player” by head coach Mike O’Neil, McGrath was an interior and outside defender for the Warriors who helped the back line finish 9-5-6 in the MIAA Division 1 postseason. An excellent athlete, the King Philip senior is among several Sun Chronicle All-Stars to be selected to the Hockomock League’s First Team XI.

Derek McGrath, Mansfield

An Eastern Mass. All-Star and Hockomock League All-Star, McGrath closed the year as a strong defender on Mansfield’s back line. One of two center backs, the Hornets’ junior helped Mansfield post 10 shutouts and owned a 1.0 goals against average. McGrath is a multiple-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Matt Sullivan, Mansfield

The sophomore centerback worked with McGrath up the middle of the defense together for two seasons to be a tough tandem to beat. An Eastern Mass. All-Star, Sullivan’s play often assisted the offense as well for Mansfield, which finished 6-5-8. “They were both dangerous in the box, offensively on corners and on direct or indirect kicks,” Mansfield coach Steve Sheridan said of Sullivan and McGrath.

Kaden Burns, North Attleboro

The powerful, hard-working senior finisher up top, Burns posted 11 goals with three assists to lead North’s attack as the Rocketeers’ Offensive Player of The Year. Burns was also a Hockomock League All-Star.

Patrick Etienvre, North Attleboro

North Attleboro’s team MVP, Etienvre did the free kicks for the Rocketeers and was a commanding presence at the midfield spot. The junior finished the season with two goals and two assists as an integral part of the starting 11s.

Bryce Newth, North Attleboro

Newth posted nine goals with four assists for the second-highest total on the Rocketeers. A Hockomock League All-Star and captain for North, Newth was one of the most skilled players on the pitch at all times with speed that made him a threat in transition at any time.

Matt Cropley, Norton

The dominating senior center back doubled as a forward when needed. Cropley
