

# The Gymnastics All-Stars

## Sydney Berndt, Attleboro

A two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and Hockomock League All-Star, Berndt competed in uneven bars, balance beam and the floor exercise for Attleboro in her senior season, posting a season high of 9.15 on the balance beam in a match against Mansfield.

## Raegan Bonneau, Attleboro

The Hockomock League MVP paved the way for the Bombardiers' success in her senior season, leading them to a second-place finish at the Hockomock League Championship. At the league meet, Bonneau was second in the all-around with a 36.1, and at the state individual meet, was 15th, scoring a 35.225. She was 12th in the all-around with a 35.60 at the South Sectional, tied for 12th in the floor exercise and was 18th in the balance beam. The two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star was one of 20 seniors in the state tagged to represent Massachusetts at the National High School Gymnastics Association's Senior Showcase Invitational in Fort Myers, Fla., in May.

## Olivia Haist, Attleboro

Haist placed first in the individual floor exercise at the Hockomock League Championship, scoring a 9.25. The senior Hockomock League All-Star came in seventh in the floor exercise at the South Sectional with a 9.375 score and was 35th in the all-around. She posted season highs in the floor exercise of 9.5, where she qualified for New Englands, and also had highs in the balance beam (9.4) and vault (9.2).

## Logan Medeiros, Attleboro

A three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star as a junior, Medeiros was fourth in the all-around at the Hockomock League Championship, scoring a 35.7 in a stacked field. She went on to score a 35.10 in the all-around at the state individual meet, placing 19th overall, was ninth in the vault at 9.25 and 14th in the uneven bars with an 8.7 score. Medeiros tied for first in the uneven bars with an 8.50 at the South Sectional, tied for 10th in the all-around at 36.050 and placed 11th in the floor exercises. A three-time Hockomock League All-Star as well, she posted season highs of 36.95 in the all-around, 9.6 on vault, 9.0 on bars, 9.3 on the balance beam and 9.2 in floor exercises.

## Ashley Goldstein, Foxboro

Goldstein competed in the all-around at the Hockomock League Championship, falling just outside the top-four but posted strong numbers. The senior Hockomock League All-Star tied for fourth in the all-around beam with a 9.0 and tied for second in the floor exercise with a 9.40. Goldstein placed 26th in the all-around at the state individual meet, scoring a 34.15, and took eighth-place in the floor exercises at 9.10.

## Brenna Turner, Foxboro

The Warriors' freshman was fifth in the all-around vault at the Hockomock League Championship, scoring a 9.0, but fell outside the top-four all-around finishers.

Attleboro High senior Olivia Haist won the individual floor exercise at the Hockomock League Championship and placed seventh in the event at the South Sectional.

Mansfield High senior Sophie Moore took third in the all-around at the Hockomock League Championship before placing third in the event at the state meet where she was fourth on the vault as well.

Turner was also third in the floor exercises at the league meet with an 8.60. The Hockomock League All-Star competed in the state individual meet in the vault, improving her score to a 9.10 to place fourth in her lone event there.

## Madi Turner, Foxboro

A two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Turner turned in a fine performance at

the Hockomock League Championship, competing in the all-around where she had a fifth in the vault with a 9.10 and tied for sixth in the floor exercises at 9.0. In the state individual meet, the junior league all-star was ninth in the vault, her lone event, scoring an 8.825.

## Abby Lefebvre, King Philip

Lefebvre closed out her career with the Warriors as a four-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and a senior cog in King Philip's scoring all season. At the Hockomock League Championship, she was among the best in show, tying for first place in the uneven bars with a 9.0 and earning second in the balance beam, scoring a 9.30. At the individual state meet, Lefebvre was second in the uneven bars with a 9.325, and 12th in the balance beam with an 8.90. She was a Hockomock League All-Star.

## Paige Austin, Mansfield

Austin won the all-around at the Hockomock League Championships, leading the way with a 38, and was a state individual qualifier in the event. The sophomore placed fourth in the floor exercises and on the uneven bars at the state meet, where

she was also seventh on the balance beam and sixth in all-around. The two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star qualified for the New England Championship where she took fourth on bars and placed fifth in the all-around. Austin was a Hockomock League All-Star.

## Sophie Moore, Mansfield

Moore is a four-time Sun Chronicle All-Star who won the vault and was third in the all-around at the Hockomock League Championship in her senior season. At the state meet, she was fourth on the vault, seventh in the floor exercises and 12th in the all-around to qualify for the New England Championship. The Hockomock League All-Star helped lead the Hornets to the Davenport Division title and the league championship.

## Ava Redding, Mansfield

The Hornets' junior was the Hockomock League champ on the uneven bars and balance beam for the Hornets, scoring 9.40 on the beam and a 9.0 on the bars. At the state individual meet, the three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star placed third in the uneven bars with a 9.0 and was fourth in the balance beam with a 9.30. A Hockomock League All-Star, Redding tied for 13th in the floor exercise with an 8.60.

## Ella DeFeo, Norton

Only a sophomore, DeFeo established herself for years to come. The Tri-Valley League MVP was also the Lancers' MVP as she dominated the season from start to finish once again. The three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star was the league champion in the all-around with a 37.6 and won the vault, balance beam and floor exercises at the league meet. She had a high of 9.9 on the vault, and averaged a 9.825 — the highest in the state in the event. She also had a season average of 9.5 on balance beam and a 9.475 in the floor exercise. Her all-around average was a 37.75. She went on to qualify for the state individuals where she was ranked second in the South.

## Rylan Savas, Norton

A four-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and four-time Tri-Valley League All-Star, Savas was second at the TVL Championship in the all-around and won the uneven bars with a 9.6 score. The junior was also runner-up at the league championship in the balance beam and the vault. Her averages were at or above 9.5 in all events. She also qualified for the state individuals meet in the all-around where she was ranked third in the South.
