

The Golf All-Stars

Hunter Fitzgibbons, Bishop Feehan

Fitzgibbons helped Bishop Feehan lock up the Catholic Conference League title, tying with teammates McKinley Garcia and Declan Sutula at runner-up. A top scorer for Feehan, Fitzgibbons is a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and a junior CCL All-Star who will likely continue his role as a top-three scorer for Bishop Feehan.

Mackinley Garcia, Bishop Feehan

Garcia was the Catholic Central League MVP in his senior season. The Shamrock senior from Rehoboth battled in the Division 1 South Sectional by shooting a 5-over par round of 77 to tie for 20th. Garcia tied for second in the CCL championship with a round of 73. One of Bishop Feehan’s top scorers with great course knowledge and awareness, Garcia helped the Shamrocks to several wins in stableford format.

Declan Sutula, Bishop Feehan

Sutula was a runner-up in the CCL title match to help the Shamrocks win the match by 13 strokes. The senior CCL All-Star shot a 10-over par round of 82 to tie for 43rd at the Division 1 Central Sectional. A regular scorer for Feehan, he helped the team to a 12th-place finish in the South Sectional.

Charlie Rosa, Dighton-Rehoboth

Rosa was a bright spot for Dighton-Rehoboth, leading the way for the Falcons all season with poise and course control. The junior South Coast Conference All-Star played well enough to enter the South Sectional as D-R’s only representative, posting a 7-over 79 to tie for sixth place. Rosa tied for 29th, shooting a 12-over 83 at the Division 2 state match.

Zac Georgantas, Foxboro

Regarded as one of, if not, the best, in the area when it comes to course control and finding his way out of trouble (even though he was rarely in it,) Georgantas is a three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and the Hockomock League Davenport Division MVP. Foxboro’s No. 1 was consistently low in the regular season where the senior won the Cape Cod Invitational. A three-year captain for Foxboro, Georgantas tied for first at the Division 2 South Sectional with a round of 75, and finished as the runner-up at the Div. 2 state match with a round of 73. Georgantas will play at Providence College next school year.

Ryan McGuire, Foxboro

The three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star shot a 78 at the Hockomock League Championship this season, tying for fifth in the field. Playing behind Zac Georgantas, McGuire would have been a No. 1 at plenty of other schools in the state. At the Div. 2 South Sectional, McGuire tied for 10th with a 9-over par round of 81. McGuire had a 16-over par 87 to tie for 56th at the state match. He was named a Hockomock League All-Star.

Charlie Pelkey, King Philip

The Warriors’ senior was third at the Division 1 Central Sectional with a 5-over par 77 to tie for 20th and help King Philip clinch fourth-place as a team. Pelkey had a strong finish at the Hockomock League match to clinch the team title for the

Evan Regan, King Philip

A four-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Regan was strong for the Warriors again

in his senior season, placing inside the top-10 in the Division 1 Central Sectional with a 3-over par 75, tying for ninth with fellow all-star Jason Silva. Regan won the Hockomock League Tournament to lead the Rocketeers to the team to the league title, shooting a 71 to win by a stroke. In the Division 1 match, Regan tied for 24th with an 11-over round of 82.

Jason Silva, King Philip

Silva, a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, tied for ninth at the Div. 1 Central Sectional, to book his spot in the Div. 1 match where the Warriors senior again tied for ninth, shooting a 7-over 78. One of the top golfers on the reigning league champion, Silva was consistent and steady, particularly late in the season, to help King Philip cap the regular season undefeated in league play.

Lincoln Frisoli, North Attleboro

Despite only being a sophomore, Frisoli consistently ranked in North’s top-three mix. Among the best of the league when it came to lowest average rounds in the Hockomock League, Frisoli was on average less than two strokes above par through the regular season. He shot a 6-over par round of 78 to tie for 27th in the Div. 1 Central Sectional, ending his tournament run.

Maxx Zides, North Attleboro

Zides was one of the top scorers for a North Attleboro team that was strong toward the top, and the sophomore was a key performer in tournament play. Zides shot a

Mason Ball, Norton

Ball was a top talent for the Lancers through the season, and the junior shined in tournament play. At the MIAA Div. 2 South Sectional, Ball tied for first, shooting a 3-over par round of 75 to help Norton clinch a spot in the Division 2 match as a team. Norton took ninth at the state match with Ball carding a round of 80 for 9-over, tying for 17th. Ball is a Tri-Valley League All-Star.

Griffin Clary, Norton

The Lancers’ junior tied for 10th at the Div. 2 South Sectional, battling hard in a 9-over par round where conditions were not favorable. Clary was consistently at the top of a strong Lancers squad. At the state match, Clary tied for fourth with a round of 75 at 4-over par. Clary’s top-end performance at the state match led Norton to a ninth-place finish at 50-over par. He is a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and a Tri-Valley League All-Star.

Aidan Connell, Seekonk

The Warriors’ sophomore lit up the Division 3 field, winning the division state title with a 2-over par 74. Connell’s state crown was the culmination of his postseason dominance, starting with a runner-up finish at the South Coast Conference tournament. The South Coast Conference All-Star went on to the South Sectional and finished second again as Seekonk’s lone entry. A two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Connell went on to receive an invitation to the 2026 Boys High School Golf National Invitational as well.
