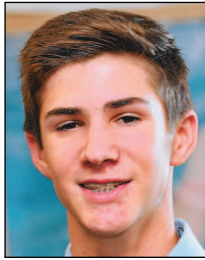


The 2018 Golf All-Stars

Brad Gillen, Bishop Feehan

The Shamrock sophomore shot a season-best round of 35 and averaged 39.2 per round for coach Artie Anderson's EAC champs for an 18th consecutive year. A LeBaron Hills CC member and two-year starter, Gillen hits a lot of fairways. He shot an 83 in Easton during the Division 2 Qualifying Tournament and was the Shamrock medalist in six matches, scoring in all 12 regular season contests.

John Veno, Bishop Feehan

The Shamrock junior's scorecard was used in all 12 regular season matches, with a low round of 35. Veno averaged 40.5 per round for the EAC champions, shooting a round of 82 at the Easton CC in the Division 2 Qualifying Tournament. Veno broke 40 in five matches as the two-year starter was consistent from tee to green, especially with his long balls off the tee.

Adam Housley, Dighton-Rehoboth

The Crestwood CC member averaged 34 points per match for D-R, setting a Falcon record for lowest score (32 at Hillside CC) and most points in a match. Housley carded a D-R medalist round of 76 for the second-place Falcons at the SCC Championship Tournament. He followed that up with a round of 78 at the Division 2 Qualifying Tournament. The Falcon MVP and junior tournament frequenter is captain-elect for 2019.

Collin Gagnon, Dighton-Rehoboth

The Falcons' senior captain carded a season-best round of 34 at Swansea CC and fired a round of 84 for D-R at the SCC Championship Tournament, helping his Falcons to a second-place finish. The Segregansett CC member averaged 24 points per match for D-R. He played in the Division 2 Qualifying Tournament and was an All-SCC selection, showing steady improvement since his sophomore season.

Jon Dowling, Foxboro

The Warrior senior received All-Hockomock League acclaim, and was Foxboro's medalist at the Championship Tournament in Canton, taking the No. 6 spot overall with an 82. The Foxboro CC member also serves with the grounds crew there. Dowling was Foxboro's medalist in 12 matches. "He was our most improved player, he doesn't miss many fairways," said coach Jared Tise of Dowling's long ball off the tee.

A true student of the game after being junior tournament-tested regionally and nationally, the Hornet sophomore owns a superb short iron game.

In just his fourth season of playing golf, Dow averaged 40 strokes per round. He was the No. 2 scorer at the Hockomock League Championship Tournament with a round of 79, helping the Hornets to the league team title. He scored an 88 at Hingham in the MIAA Division 1 Qualifying Tournament.

Nate Morreale, Mansfield

The Hornet sophomore proved his mettle on the course by becoming the medalist at the Hockomock League Championship Tournament with a low round of 76, leading Mansfield to the team title. He averaged 41.8 strokes per round, with the southpaw swinger carding a round of 86 at the MIAA Division 1 Qualifying Tournament. A Norton CC member, Morreale has a superb chipping and putting game, displaying his confidence and competitiveness.

Jason See, Mansfield

The Norton CC member and long-ball specialist helped the Hornets win the Hockomock League Tournament championship by shooting a round of 85. See, a junior tournament veteran, averaged 40.4 strokes per round and earned Hornet MVP honors. See shot a Hornet medalist round of 78 at the Division 1 Qualifying Tournament in Hingham, then was a top-10 finisher at the MIAA State Tournament with a round of 75.

Jillian Barend, North Attleboro

Improving her distance off the tee and in the fairway, Barend placed 14th the MIAA Girls Tournament. In her third varsity season, Barend shot an 87 at the Hockomock League Championship Tournament at Blue Hills and carded a 90 at the MIAA Division 2 Qualifying Tournament. The Foxborough CC member averaged 39.56 per round and was the Rocketeers' medalist six times.

Marcus Costa, North Attleboro

A four-year varsity member, the Rocketeer senior captain averaged 40.94 this season for the No. 5 finishers at the Hockomock League Tournament where Costa shot a North Attleboro medalist score of 86. Costa was the North Attleboro medalist in five matches, carding a round of 83 at Easton Country Club during the MIAA Division 2 Qualifying Tournament. "He improved his short game," North Attleboro coach Steve Nelson said of Costa's consistency on the tee and fairways.

Matt Wanless, North Attleboro

The senior captain was the lone Rocketeer to qualify for the MIAA All-State Tournament where he shot an 86. The Foxborough CC member shot an 80 at the MIAA Division 2 Qualifying Tournament to advance. Wanless was North Attleboro's medalist in five matches this season and averaged 40.88 per round. He carded a 92 at the Hockomock League Tournament. A member of the state championship North baseball team, he vastly improved his game from tee to green.

Jack Buchan, Norton

The Norton CC member and Lancer captain was the team medalist in five matches, averaging 41.2 per round. The junior's score figured in 14 matches for Norton, his average (5.93) against par being among the top 20 in the TVL. The Lancer MVL shot a season-best 36 at TPC-Boston and missed qualifying for the MIAA State Tournament by one shot at the Division 2 Tournament. "He is a consistent ball-striker, he loves golf," said coach Dan Langmead.
