Bishop Feehan High junior Max Comey was the Catholic Central League Player of the Year in singles, going 9-6 overall at first singles to lead the Shamrocks to the CCL title.

Brady Rosen, Attleboro

Rosen was the Bombardiers’ lone captain, playing all four years on varsity. Three senior ended his final season with an 8-5 record and was a key member in singles for the two-time Kelley Rex Division champions.

Max Comey, Bishop Feehan

Comey went undefeated in CCL play as the Catholic Central League’s Player of The Year in singles at 4-0. Overall, the Shamrock junior was 9-6, getting the top non-league talent from across the state. The multi-time Sun Chronicle All-Star dropped just 13 games all season, and is set to reprise his No. 1 singles role in his senior campaign.

Aakash Deshpande, Bishop Feehan

Deshpande, a senior, had only one loss in CCL play at first doubles where he and Casey Fennell won every match together in straight sets. The duo was the CCL Doubles Players of The Year, posting a combined record of 14-1. Deshpande was also a state quarterfinalist in the USTA tournament.
