

# The Football All-Stars

## Cam Gray, Attleboro

A 6-foot-5 lineman and three-year starter on the Bombardiers' offensive line, Gray is a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and was a big piece up front for an Attleboro offense that made positive strides through the season. The senior was key to helping open up the run game, which amassed 826 yards, and was a trusted blocker for quarterback Brayden Jones, who wasn't sacked once by a lineman trying to get past Gray.

## Mikey Huntington, Attleboro

Huntington was used in several different manners his senior season, seeing time as a receiver and at running back along with even playing quarterback in the wildcat formation. A safety on defense, Huntington was consistent all season on both sides of the ball, collecting 149 yards rushing, 263 yards receiving and making 40 tackles, including four for a loss, and an interception. Huntington is a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

## Will Plizga, Attleboro

The senior linebacker went wherever the ball went as Plizga made 110 tackles this season, getting past blockers in the run game and in the passing game. Flying under the radar when it comes to great linebackers in the league, Plizga's numbers

stack up with the best of them as he made his presence felt for Attleboro.

## Tommy Cairns, Bishop Feehan

A Catholic Central League All-Star, Cairns had the most impact on the defensive side of the ball for the Shamrocks, ending the season with a team-high 114 tackles, averaging 10.4 per game. The senior stopper also had 16 tackles for a loss, three sacks and nine quarterback hurries. In one of his two rushing attempts, he went for 47 yards and a touchdown.

## Sean Hickey, Bishop Feehan

The Catholic Central League MVP, Hickey was disruptive and integral on the defensive side of the ball. Selected to the Massachusetts High School Football Coaches Association Division 2 All-State Team, Hickey totaled 74 tackles with six sacks, along with 11 hurries and a team-high 17 tackles for a loss. The senior also got involved with the scoring, punching in a rushing touchdown and returning a fumble recovery for a score as well.

## Kane Mankins, Bishop Feehan

A dominant two-way junior lineman, Mankins helped pave the way for Feehan's running game and was a stopper on defense as the Catholic Central League Lineman of the Year and a CCL All-Star. Mankins was chosen to the theMassachusetts High School Football Coaches Association-Division 2 All-State Team as well, helping Feehan's running game tally 1,780 yards with 20 touchdowns and helped the passing game rack up 1,521 yards. Defensively, Mankins routinely found his way into opposing backfields with eight tackles for a loss, ending the season with 75 tackles and six sacks to go with 18 quarterback hurries.

## Joseph Millis, Bishop Feehan

Millis flew around the field his junior season, getting to the quarterback for one sack and 101 tackles for the Shamrock defense. The CCL All-Star at linebacker also got behind the line five times for tackles for a loss, helping them go 9-2 this season with five shutouts.

## Owen Mordas, Bishop Feehan

Moras' ascension as a dual threat quarterback continued in his junior season as he rushed for 520 yards and three touchdowns to go with 1,333 yards passing. A CCL All-Star, Mordas had 14 passing TDs with five interceptions, spreading the ball around the receiving room efficiently. Elusive and growing, Mordas kept Feehan in close games and helped the Shamrocks put teams away with four wins of 30 points

or more.

## David Quinn, Bishop Feehan

Quinn narrowly hit the 1,000 mark in his senior season, hitting 1,030 yards on 166 carries this, averaging 6.2 per carry. A great runner after contact who was hard to take down, Quinn ended the season with 13 rushing touchdowns and added 150 yards receiving with one score. Quinn was a Catholic Central League All-Star.

## Titan Grassie, Dighton-Rehoboth

Grassie thrived for the Falcons in his junior season and was a South Coast Conference All-Star. Touted as Dighton-Rehoboth's best offensive and defensive lineman by D-R head coach Kevin Gousie, Grassie was the leading blocker for the run and passing games. On defense, Grassie was often double-teamed due to his ability to disrupt on the interior, finishing with 20 tackles, including 5 1/2 for a loss, and a sack. Grassie also earned the team's Offensive Player of The Year award and is poised for another strong senior season.

## Ben Angelini, Foxboro

A hard-hitting running back that was central in moving the ball for the Warriors in back-to-back Super Bowl seasons, Angelini ended his career in Foxboro with
