

The Boys Outdoor Track All-Stars

Braiden Carrico, Attleboro

The junior sprinter was a Hockomock League All-Star and the third leg of Attleboro’s seventh-place finish in the 4x100 relay, timing out at 43.19. A regular in the relays along with short distances, the two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star’s strong work in the long jump and triple jump added more versatility to an Attleboro team that was a league-winning group.

Mathis Clineus, Attleboro

Clineus won the Hockomock League title in the triple jump, clearing 45-4½, and was third in the long jump at 21-6. At the Division 1 meet, the Bombardiers’ senior was fourth in the triple jump, clearing 45-0¾, and in the Meet of Champions, Cineus took fifth with an improved distance of 47-2. The Hockomock League All-Star competed at the New Balance Outdoors and finished 56th in the field to close the spring as an unattached competitor.

Madden Murray, Attleboro

Murray was a member of the Bombardiers’ 4x100 relay that won the Hockomock League Meet and placed ninth at the Meet of Champions. The junior two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star was a regular in scoring and utilized his athleticism across multiple events. He helped Attleboro to seventh at the Division 1 Meet and was a Hockomock League All-Star.

Fareed Oseni, Attleboro

Oseni was the ace sprinter for Attleboro this spring, climaxing with a third-place finish at the Meet of Champions in the 110 hurdles where he timed out at 14.47. The junior placed fourth in the Division 1 meet in the same event and was a qualifier for the Div. 1 Meet in the high jump but did not compete. Oseni helped the Bombardier boys clinch the league title at the Hockomock League Championships by winning the 110 hurdles in 15.27. He was a Hockomock League All-Star.

Zayne Thomas, Attleboro

A Hockomock League All-Star amd two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, the senior sprinter was one of the best in the region, playing a part in the Hockomock League-winning 4x100 relay alongside Tommy Labathe, Madden Murray and Kevin Lucas, which won in 43.29. Thomas was also the opening leg of the seventh-place relay squad at the Div. 1 Meet. Attleboro’s 4x100 took ninth at the Meet of Champions. Individually, Thomas was second in the 100 at the league meet in 11.14, and sixth in the 200 at 23.02.

Noah Williams, Attleboro

Williams was a thrower for the Bombardiers and a regular atop the podium during his senior season as a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star. Williams placed second in the shot put at the Hockomock League meet at 53-3 ¾, and was second in the discus at 146-11. At the Division 1 Meet, the Hockomock League All-Star won the title in the discus, throwing 173-11, and took sixth in the shot put at 51-0¾. At the Meet of Champions, Williams finished ninth in the shot put and and 13th in the discus.

Devin Lamorticelli, Bishop Feehan

Lamorticelli competed in the javelin at

the Meet of Champions and finished fifth in the state with a throw of 172-8. The Shamrocks’ senior won the MIAA Division 2 title with a throw of 168-11. Lamorticelli closed his spring strong as a point scorer with a number of first-place finishes in the field.

Mack Slowey, Bishop Feehan

A regular fixture near the top of the leaderboard in both the high jump and long jump as a sophomore, Slowey took second in the high jump at the Division 2 Meet, posting a 6-2. At the Meet of Champions, Slowey was ninth in the long jump with a school-record mark of 22-7½ to close a strong campaign as a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Timmy Chase, Foxboro

Chase finished third in the 800 at the Hockomock League Championships with a time of 2:00.62, and was the third leg of Foxboro’s fifth-place 4x400 relay at the meet. At the Division 4 Meet, the Warriors’ senior ran the second leg of Foxboro’s 10th-place 4x400 relay team and took 29th in the 800.

Max Keen, Foxboro

Keen was strong in the javelin for Foxboro, placing third at the Hockomock League Championships with a throw of 152-2. At the Division 4 Meet, the Foxboro senior took 10th, throwing 144-0. He qualified for the Meet of Champions and finished 21st with a throw of 145-4.

Bishop Feehan High sophomore Mack Slowey took second in the high jump at the Division 2 Meet and posted a school-record 22-7 1/2 long jump for ninth at the Meet of Champions.

Tallan King, King Philip

King continued his school year of dominance for King Philip in the field events, placing second in the javelin at the Hockomock League Championships with a throw of 158-9. At the Division 3 Meet, King took fourth with a throw of 163-7 and at the Meet of Champions, the Hockomock League All-Star placed third, improving his mark to 173-10.

Connor McDonald, King Philip

McDonald was a multi-event senior standout for King Philip, winning the 400-hurdles with a time of 56.40 at the Hockomock League Championships. McDonald was also the third leg of the league-winning 4x400 hurdles relay, which ran a time of 3:24.29. Also in the league meet, he took sixth in the 110 hurdles at 17.10. At the Division 3 Meet, McDonald placed 26th in the 110 hurdles preliminaries, and in the Meet of Champions, the Hockomock League All-Star finished 22nd in the 400 hurdles at 57.10.

Bryan Rogers, Mansfield

The Hornets’ senior thrower took sixth in the shot put at the Hockomock League Championships throwing 45-2 ¼, and was third in the discus in the league meet with a throw of 146-3. At the Division 3 Meet, Rogers was seventh in the shot at 46-0 ¾ and sixth in the discus at 134-6. A Hockomock League All-Star, Rogers qualified in the discus for the Meet of Champions and placed 18th, throwing 141-6.

Walter Stock, Mansfield

Stock won the 800 at the Hockomock League Championships with a time of 1:57.95, and was the second leg of the Hornets’ eighth-place 4x400 relay team. The junior middle-distance specialist was fourth in the 800 at the Division 3 Meet

with a time of 1:57.57. Stock was also the opening leg of Mansfield’s ninth-place 4x800 relay team. The the two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and Hockomock League All-Star closed the spring in 18th in the 800 at the Meet of Champions, timing out at 1:57.82.

Anthony Malakidis, North Attleboro

Malakidis took second in the two-mile at the Hockomock League Championships, running 9:24.93 to miss out on a league title by a fraction of a second. The Rocketeers’ junior continued his season at the Div. 3 Meet where he was sixth in the two-mile and third in the mile with a time of 4:23.67. Malakidis finished 12th in the two-mile and 21st in the mile at the Meet of Champions to close out as a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and a Hockomock League All-Star.

Sean Parham, Norton

Parham is a three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star who was a versatile contributor for the Lancers, ranging from the 400 and 800 meters to the relays to the long and triple jumps. In the Division 5 Meet, Parham took seventh in the 400, running a 51.01. Parham was 28th in the division in the 800 with a time of 2:1.92. At the Meet of Champions, he took 21st in the 400 hurdles at a 57.07, closing the season after a fifth-place finish in the Div. 5 Meet at 57.64.

Michael Raneri, Norton

Raneri did a bit of everything for the Lancers in his senior season, but did particularly well in the long jump. At the MSTCA Division 5 Relays, Raneri was second in the long jump, clearing 22-1½, and in the Division 5 Meet, he took 15th, coming up short of his previous total with a 19-1 ½. A reliable scorer for Norton throughout his high school career, Raneri is a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.
