Megan Huntington, Attleboro

A shifty sophomore for the Bombardiers. Huntington finished seventh in the Hockomock League in points with 10 goals and 16 assists (26 points). Her strong stick in the circle combined with her instinct to finish attacks made her a player to be on the lookout for in coming seasons as well.

Kelsey McCleary, Attleboro

McCleary was a true playmaker in the midfield for the Bombardiers as the junior orchestrated an offense that scored 45 goals and had 10 wins. McCleary finished with nine assists and had three goals as a Hockomock League All-Star.

Siany Ortez-Amaya, Attleboro

Marking her third year in the cage, Ortez-Amaya finished with 550 saves and an 82% save percentage. A two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, the senior backstop also averaged 1.58 goals against and was a Hockomock League All-Star for a second season as she helped keep Attleboro in games all season leading to a 10-8-1 record and only 28 goals allowed.
