The Girls Swimming All-Stars

Ella Lynch-Bartek, Attleboro

The Bombardiers' leading point producer for the season, Lynch-Bartek won the 100 freestyle by better than a second at 57.81 and took sixth in the 100 backstroke (1:08.9). A member of the Kingfish Swim Club, the junior was also a member of the third-place 200 freestyle relay team and fifth-place 200 medley relay team.

Jill Carline, Bishop Feehan

Carline helped guide Bishop Feehan to the CCL title in its first season with a second place in the 200 freestyle (1:55.05) and fifth in the 100 backstroke (59.95), while swimming with the 200 medley relay and freestyle relay teams. Carline, a junior, has a personal best of 59.34 in the 100 backstroke.

Kathryn Hornsleth, Bishop Feehan

A product of the Kingfish Swim Club, Hornsleth excels in the freestyle events and with the Shamrock relay teams. Hornsleth took seventh in the 500 freestyle (6:08) as Bishop Feehan won its first Catholic Central League Meet title. The senior swimmer is a member of the 200 and 400 freestyle relay teams with personal best times of 29.34 in the 50 freestyle, 1:04.33 in the 100 freestyle and 2:16 in the 200 freestyle.

Julia Pelchat, Bishop Feehan

A product of the Gator Swim Club, the Shamrock sophomore took third place in the 100 breaststroke (1:15.8) and eighth in the 50 freestyle (25.23) as Bishop Feehan won the team title at the CCL Meet. Pelchat has personal best times in the 100 (1:02.08) and 200 (2:28.3) butterfly, in the 100 freestyle (57.11) and 200 backstroke (2:23.5).

Skylar Pemberton, Bishop Feehan

The Shamrocks' senior freestyle sprinter specialist captured the No 9 spots in both the 50 freestyle (25.38) and 100 freestyle (56.87). A member of the Bluefish Swim Club, Pemberton also swims with the 200 and 400 freestyle relay teams. She has personal best short-course times of 25.67 in the 50 and 55.7 in the 100 freestyle.

Abby Gallagher, Foxboro

One of the foundations of the Foxboro program through the years, the Warriors' senior captain and Hockomock League All-Star took second place in the 500 freestyle (5:36) and fifth place in the 200 freestyle (2:07.3). The Kingfish Swim Club member swam a leg for the fourth-place 200 freestyle relay team and eighth-place 200 medley relay team.

Meghan Lathrop, Foxboro

The Warrior sophomore is a product of the Hay Lightning program and a two-time fixture among the Hockomock League and Sun Chronicle All-Star swimmers. At the Hockomock League Meet this season, Lathrop took third in the 100 butterfly (1:032) and fourth in the 500 freestyle (5:43.1), while being a member of the fourth-place 200 freestyle relay team and eighth-place 200 medley relay team.

Rachel Bailer, King Philip

The Warriors' freshman is a product of the Kingfish Swim Club and had a terrific first Hockomock League Championship Meet by taking sixth in the 100 breaststroke (1:21.5) and seventh in the 500 freestyle (5:54) while

also being a member of the third-place 400 freestyle and fourth-place 200 medley relay teams. She clocked times of 28.25 in the 50 freestyle and 2:09.7 in the 200 freestyle at the age group meet.

Meghan Campbell, King Philip

The Warrior senior hails from the Hay Lightning program. She was a top-four finisher in all four events entered at the Hockomock League Meet. Campbell placed first in the 500 freestyle (5:31.5, winning by five seconds) and took second in the 200 freestyle (2:06.1). She was a member of the third-place 400 freestyle and fourth-place 200 medley relay teams. She has clocked a 2:00.8 in the 200 freestyle and 2:19 in the 500 freestyle.

Madelyn Cleasby, King Philip

A member of the Kingfish Swim Club, the Warrior freshman made an impact in the freestyle events, the individual medley and relay events. She finished fifth in the 200 IM (2:34) and eighth in the 100 backstroke (1:09.2) at the Hockomock League Meet, while being a member of the fourth-place 200 medley relay team. Cleasby has clocked personal best times of 1:06.2 in the 100 freestyle, 2:23 in the 200 freestyle and 1:11.6 in the 100 backstroke.

Bri McMaster, King Philip

The junior has been a solid contributor for King Philip, helping the Warriors to the area's best finish (third) at the Hockomock League Championship Meet. McMaster captured the No. 5 spot in the 50 freestyle (27.87), while being a member of the third-place 400 freestyle relay (4:06.6) and fourth-place 200 medley relay (2:06.5) teams. She swims in the offseason in the Kingfish program.

Sofia Seifert, Mansfield

The Hornets' junior swam in 16 individual races this season, never taking below second place to go with 11 first-place finishes and five runner-up spots. A product of the Hay Lightning program, Seifert's personal bests in events were: 50 freestyle (27.78), 100 freestyle (1:02.68), 100 backstroke (1:08.92) and 100 breaststroke (1:18.78). Seifert finished fourth in the 50 freestyle (27.78) and 100 breaststroke. In the offseason, Seifert is a volunteer at an assisted living facility in Mansfield.

Addison Abreu, Seekonk

The Warrior freshman, a member of the Gators Swim Club, was a four-time champion at the SCC Championship Meet. Abreu finished first in the 100 backstroke in record time (1:00.12, winning by 21 seconds) and took the 100 freestyle (56.0, winning by eight seconds). She was also a member of the first-place 200 medley (winning by 13 seconds) and 400 freestyle (winning by 43 seconds) relay teams.

Korryn Cartwright, Seekonk

The Warriors' fabulous freshmen rewrote the SCC Championship Meet record book twice in finishing first in both the 200 freestyle (2:02.2, winning by 22 seconds) and 100 butterfly (1:01.3, winning by four seconds). A member of the Gators Swim Club program, Cartwright was a member of the first-place 200 medley (record 1:56.12) and 400 freestyle (3:55) relay teams.

Jayla Pina, Seekonk

A member of the Cape Verdean National Team heading to the Olympic Games and a product of the Gators Swim Club, Pina was a four-time champion at the South Coast Conference Meet. The Seekonk junior won the 200 IM in record time (2:08.9, winning by 16 seconds) and finished first in the 100 breaststroke in record time (1:07.11, winning by 12 seconds). She also anchored the first-place 200 and 400 freestyle relay teams.
