Our Selections

THE GIRLS HOCKEY ALL-STAR TEAM was selected by staff writers with local coaches consulted for their recommendations.

MVP and one of the toughest goaltenders in the league to score on, leading the Warriors to the MIAA Division 2 state final. The three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star allowed an average of 1.08 goals per game and gave up only 28 over the season. Lynch posted three shutouts in the MIAA state tournament and eight in the regular season, including five straight to start the season.

Ella Morgan, King Philip

Morgan is a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and was a Hockomock League All-Star as a junior, posting a 36-point season. She scored 13 goals, but was better at distributing the puck with 23 assists, upping her points total from 20 a year ago. One of many quality scorers for King Philip, the forward remains a key part to the Warriors' growth as a program going forward.

Cristina Coviello, Mansfield/Oliver Ames/Foxboro

Coviello was the backstop behind the Warriors' success. The Foxboro resident put up a nice junior season as one of the best goalies in the area. She posted a 3.11 goals against average with an 89% save percentage, facing 560 shots for the season. MOA went 7-11-1 with her in between the pipes with the team going 62-62 in goals for and against. Coviello's work earned her Hockomock League All-Star recognition.

Annabelle Fanjoy, Mansfield/Oliver Ames/Foxboro

Fanjoy patrolled the blue line for MOA as a junior, helping to lock it down while playing end-to-end defense that earned her Hockomock League All-Star honors. The Foxboro resident finished the season playing in 19 games, scoring one goal and collecting eight assists.

Kayla Isleib, Mansfield/Oliver Ames/Foxboro

Isleib led the co-op squad in scoring, posting 31 points with 19 goals and 12 assists for the seven-win Warriors. The junior forward and Hockomock League All-Star was key in leading a young team with only one senior on the roster. Isleib was a team captain from Oliver Ames.

Mia Zammiglio, Bishop Feehan

Zammiglio's junior season saw her do whatever was needed to contribute on the ice, playing either center or wing or play on the power play and penalty kill. A hard-working captain for the Shamrocks, she did the dirty work in the corners to win the puck battles needed. She finished the season with six goals, six assists and 12 points.

Calleigh Brady, King Philip

Brady was a junior blue-liner for the Warriors who helped hold opponents to 27 goals over 22 games this season. The Hockomock League All-Star had 13 points in 26 games, scoring two goals with 11 assists for the Div. 2 state finalist Warriors.

Annabelle Curran, King Philip

Curran was superb for King Philip all season, giving the Warriors a scoring punch when it was needed. The sophomore three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star finished with 41 points, scoring 27 goals with 14 assists as she stepped into being a top-6 forward. Curran was also a Hockomock League All-Star.

Stephanie Leblanc, King Philip

The top freshman in the Hockomock League where she was an All-Star, Leblanc led the Warriors in scoring, amassing 45

points with a near-even split of 20 goals and 25 assists in 25 games. Speed and skill combined to make Leblanc a nightmare for opposing defenses and she figures to be a central piece for the next three years.

Kiki Lynch, King Philip

Lynch was the Hockomock League

King Philip Regional High junior forward Ella Morgan was the catalyst for the Shamrocks in the offensive end with a team-leading 23 assists to go with 13 goals.

Annie Lough, Bishop Feehan

The sophomore forward was second on in scoring for Bishop Feehan, providing three-zone ability every time she hit the ice. A two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and a Catholic Central League All-Star, Lough scored nine goals with seven assists for 16 points, and was rarely out-worked as an elite back-checker who also played on both the penalty kill and power play.

Georgia Murray, Bishop Feehan

Murray was the Catholic Central League MVP as she led Bishop Feehan in scoring for the third season in a row with 24 goals and 15 assists for 39 points while elevating her game to a new game-changing level. The dynamic junior forward sits at 119 career points on the school career leaderboard and is a three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star. The CCL All-Star also received the MIAA/Boston Bruins Sportsmanship Award and will play in the MSHCA Cross Border All-Star Challenge Sunday against the Connecticut All-Stars.

Aviva Olitky, Bishop Feehan

An anchor once again for the Shamrocks in goal, Olitky put forward her best season as a senior, playing nearly every minute of Feehan's season between the pipes. The three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star posted a .933 save percentage with a 1.29 goals against average and 12 shutouts. Olitky was a CCL All-Star who surpassed 1,500 career saves in her third season in goal and was named to play in the MSHCA Seniors All-Star game.
