Landon Vieira, Attleboro

Viera's sophomore season ended with a 43-point showing for the Bombardiers, scoring 32 goals with 11 assists. Vieira also caused 42 turnovers and collected 73 ground balls as a midfield presence for Attleboro.

Harry Wheaton, Attleboro

One of the most successful goalies to come out of Attleboro's lacrosse program, Wheaton held a 59.7% save percentage in his senior season, stopping 258 shots to end his high school career with 918 saves. Wheaton gave Attleboro a chance to win every time he was in goal and is a multiple-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Adam Hertel, Bishop Feehan

Hertel was in the running for Catholic Central League Defensive Player of The Year as a CCL All-Star in his freshman season. Hertel turned heads in preseason to become a staple in the defense, causing takeaways and forcing turnovers for the Shamrocks. Hertel took on opponents' top offensive weapons, forcing 36 ground balls and 20 caused turnovers. When not playing defense, Hertel also played as a long stick midfielder and took some faceoffs.

Blake Masso, Bishop Feehan

Another dominant player for the Shamrocks, Masso was a freshman Catholic Central League All-Star who made an instant impact, scoring 42 goals with 42 assists. He was a frequent contributor and one of the most dominant players on the field.

Cooper Masso, Bishop Feehan

A junior transfer from Catholic Memorial, Masso joined his younger brother Blake to dominate for Feehan, closing the year with a 100-point season as the Catholic Central League's MVP. Shamrocks head coach Tom Sheerin called Masso, "The best player on the field, immediately," as the junior finished with 59 goals and 41 assists to lead the Shamrocks to an 11-win season.

Pat Sintorn, Dighton-Rehoboth
