### Katie Galgoczy, North Attleboro

The Rocketeers' senior set a season-best 11:11.71 in the two-mile at the MIAA Meet of Champions, placing ninth. She also ran 11:19.56 at the MIAA Division 2 Championship for second and 11:38.12 at the Hockomock League Championship for the top spot. In the mile, Galgoczy posted a 5:26.01 season-best at the MSTCA Coaches Invitational, earning 10th place. The two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star was also a key member of the league runner-up 4x800 relay squad.

### Molly Galgoczy, North Attleboro

Galgoczy had a breakout sophomore season, setting a two-mile PR of 11:12.70 at the MSTCA Coaches Invitational to place second and running 11:26.63 at the MIAA Division 2 Championship for third. In the mile, the two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star ran a season-best 5:21.44 at the Hockomock League Championship for second place. Galgoczy also posted a 3:20.11 season best in the 1,000 meters and contributed to the league runner-up 4x800 relay team.

### Evangeline Emerson, Norton

Emerson, excelled again in the shot put. The Lancers' senior set a PR of 38-11.25 at the MIAA Division 4 Championship, winning the event, and also captured the Tri-Valley League title with a 35-7.25 throw. Emerson finished sixth at the MIAA Meet of Champions with a 36-9.75 throw and earned 13th at the New England Championships (36-4). She also competed at the New Balance Nationals, throwing 36-0.75.

### Zoe Santos, Norton

Santos set a PR of 5 feet, 7 inches in the high jump at the New England Championships, finishing second. The Lancers' senior also won the Tri-Valley League Championship with a 5-6.5 jump, placed first at the MIAA Division 4 Championship with a 5-4 leap and was victorious at the James Kalperis Relays. The three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star recorded a season-best long jump of 15-10 and competed in the shot put, with a 30-10.5 mark.

### Julianna Dutra, Seekonk

Dutra, a junior, set a 55 dash PR of 7.55 at the MIAA Division 5 Championship, finishing sixth. She ran a PR of 43.73 in the 300 meters at the MSTCA Qualifier Meet, placing sixth. Dutra finished second in the 300 meters at the South Coast Conference Championship (44.56) and 12th at the MIAA Division 5 Championship (44.27). As part of the 4x200 relay team, she helped Seekonk claim first at the James Kalperis Relays.

### Kearston Nelson, Seekonk

Nelson had a standout senior season in the shot put, setting a PR of 36 feet, 11 inches. The two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star was a collector of crowns throughout the season, placing first at both the James Kalperis Relays (32-9) and the MIAA Division 5 Championship (34-10). Nelson was 14th at the MIAA Meet of Champions with a throw of 33-3.5, marking an impressive season for the repeat Sun Chronicle All-Star.

### Hayden Robinson, Seekonk

The Warriors' junior set a 600 meters PR of 1:36.95 at the MIAA Division 5 Championship, finishing in second place. Robinson was also the South Coast Conference champion in the event, running 1:42.61. She placed 10th at the MIAA Meet of Champions and third at the MSTCA Qualifier Meet with a 1:37.49 mark. Robinson, a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, helped her team win the 4x200 relay at the James Kalperis Relays.
