

The Volleyball All-Stars

Haley Carter, Attleboro

Carter was a play-making senior setter for Attleboro, and developed into one of the best in the league by putting the work in and finding her rhythm with her hitters. Holding high expectations of herself, the two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star finished the season with a team-high 604 assists. She also had 61 aces, with 135 digs and seven assisted blocks. Carter was named a Hockomock League All-Star.

Sophia Jaeger, Attleboro

A sophomore net presence, Jaeger elevated the Bombardiers' energy and boasted high court awareness that made her effective on the attack. The Hockomock League All-Star made those on the court around her better to go with 164 digs, 322 kills, 40 aces and 16 blocked shots as a well-rounded player. Jaeger was also selected to the Massachusetts Volleyball Coaches Association All-State Team as well.

Olivia Leonardo, Attleboro

The other half of Attleboro's heavy-hitting outside offense, Leonardo continued to develop into a model of consistency in her junior season, bringing a spark to the offense at the net and from the service line with a team-high 62 aces. Leonardo was also a Hockomock League All-Star.

Caroline Dunn, Bishop Feehan

Dunn was the Catholic Central League MVP in her senior season and named a Massachusetts Volleyball Coaches Association All-State selection. Operating as an outside hitter for the Shamrocks, the two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star had 264 kills with 182 digs and 49 aces. A strong leader on both sides of the ball, she shouldered the heavy workload of 34 swings per game with up to 65 in sets going five sets. A hard hitter who could pick her spots, Dunn was dangerous and hard to defend for the 15-win Shamrocks.

Ella Graham, Bishop Feehan

Bishop Feehan's libero was named a Catholic Central League All-Star, posting 252 digs, 58 assists and 25 aces as a poised presence on the court with her strong communication skills. Graham is a first-time Sun Chronicle All-Star selection.

Keira Reid, Bishop Feehan

Reid was a sophomore second-year starter for the Shamrocks and continued to rise as one of the team's best defenders. Reid had 330 assists with 173 digs and 40 aces while working out of the setter role to keep the pace of Bishop Feehan's high-paced attack.

Victoria Czech, Dighton-Rehoboth

Czech came into her own as a junior middle hitter, evolving into a main threat on offense for the Falcons. Czech racked up 83 kills with 67 blocks and will continue into 2026 as an important piece to D-R's team.

Sara Marsella, Dighton-Rehoboth

The setter off the right, Marsella was the senior heartbeat of Dighton-Rehoboth's offense, finishing with 75 kills, 144 assists, 138 digs and 32 aces.

Shayne Dugan, King Philip

Dugan was a lethal outside hitter for the Warriors. The senior had a .200 hitting percentage and 210 kills with 103 digs, stepping up and working as a role model for her younger teammates.

Cece Kilroy, King Philip

Kilroy was dangerous from the outside,

posting 303 kills with 271 digs and 53 aces as a core six on the floor for King Philip. Highly competitive and athletic, the two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and All-State selection was a crucial piece to King Philip's success and put the Warriors in position to win all season.

Caleigh Shore, King Philip

Consistent in serve-receive for King Philip, Shore's work as a libero saw the Hockomock League All-Star run the floor with 321 digs and 47 aces, setting a high standard for her teammates to follow as a senior leader.

Molly Sweeney, King Philip

The rising sophomore in the Hockomock League capped her second season at the varsity level by playing a key piece for King Philip, hitting at a .347 percentage with 142 kills and 34 blocks. Sweeney held the middle hitter spot and was a force at the net, finding holes that opponents left vacant. Defensively, Sweeney was just as important, coming up big with blocks throughout the season.

Tessa Blacquier, Mansfield

Blacquier was a high-confidence Hornet who set everything up on attack for Mansfield. She finished her senior campaign with 227 assists, 103 digs, 34 aces and 11 kills. The two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star played with great awareness and leadership to set her apart.

Gabrielle Moore, Mansfield

A three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Moore had 266 digs with 56 assists, 46 aces and 10 kills as the Hornets' senior libero. Moore dominated the floor as a Hockomock League All-Star where she was an all-star, working as the Hornets' court leader to take command of matches with her hustle and leadership.

Norton High senior Lucy Perachio totalled 218 digs and 39 service aces for the Lancers.

North Attleboro's junior libero was a Hockomock League All-Star who capped her second season at the varsity level on a high note in a new role. She averaged 3.5 digs per set and led the Rocketeers in aces with 37. She was also the anchor to North's defense, reading opponents' serves efficiently to keep the ball alive.

Lucy Perachio, Norton

Perachio was versatile and crucial for Norton in the libero spot, tallying 218 digs with 39 aces, 27 assists and 11 kills for the


