Tatum O'Brien, Attleboro

Recognized as the Hockomock League Kelley-Rex Division MVP, the Bombardiers senior captain and key playmaker scored 14 goals and added eight assists this season. A two-time Eastern Mass. Girls Soccer Coaches Association All-Star, O'Brien concluded her stellar Attleboro career with 36 goals and 31 assists. She is a three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and will continue her soccer career at Quinnipiac University.

Ciara O'Driscoll, Attleboro

A three-year starting goalkeeper, O'Driscoll turned away opposing attacks time and time again for the Bombardiers. "Her timely decisions and reaction time are some of her tools that make her a great keeper," Attleboro coach Steve Santos said. O'Driscoll allowed a mere 1.67 goals per game with four shutouts in 18 regular-season starts. She is a first-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Kennedy Samuel, Attleboro

The Bombardiers' junior provided helpful versatility with her ability to play forward or defense, showcasing exceptional speed that helped her thrive in the attacking and defensive thirds. A two-year varsity starter, Samuel scored 10 goals with six assists last season. She was recognized as a Hockomock League All-Star and Eastern Mass. Girls Soccer Coaches Association selection. Samuel is a first-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Lanie Cawley, Bishop Feehan

"She was the most versatile player on the team this season," Bishop Feehan head coach Phil Silva said of the Shamrock senior captain, who was named an Eastern Mass. Girls Soccer Coaches Association All-Star and Catholic Central Conference All-Star. Cawley, who finished with 11 points on six goals and five assists, succeeded at every position largely due to her ability to make runs and passing skills.

Quinn Dwomoh, Bishop Feehan

The Bishop Feehan freshman was named the Catholic Central League Offensive Player of the Year and an Eastern Mass. Girls Soccer Coaches Association All-Star. Dwomah led the Shamrocks in points behind a team-high 17 goals and 11 assists. "She was a threat to score any time she got the ball on the attacking half of the field," coach Phil Silva said. Dwomoh is a first-time Sun Chronicle selection.

Addie Hansbury, Bishop Feehan

Named the Catholic Central League Defensive Player of the Year, the junior center back played a key role on Bishop Feehan's defense, which earned a pair of shutout wins in the postseason. "She's a solid all-around player that controls play and breaks up numerous attacks," Shamrock coach Phil Silva said of Hansbury, who was recognized by the Eastern Mass. Girls Soccer Coaches Association. She is a multi-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Tia LaBrecque, Bishop Feehan

A two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, the Bishop Feehan junior finished second on the team in goals scored (11) en route to being a Catholic Central League All-Star and recognized by the Eastern Mass. Girls Soccer Coaches Association. "She has the ability to take on anyone off the dribble," coach Phil Silva said of LaBrecque, who was a member of the U.S. Women's Deaf Soccer National Team that claimed gold at the Deaf Olympics.

Savannah Ryan, Bishop Feehan

One of the impressive underclassmen in the Catholic Central League, Ryan ignited the Shamrocks with her two-way play in the midfield. The sophomore was recognized as an Eastern Mass. Girls Soccer Coaches Association selection and a Catholic Central League All-Star. "She has the ability to play her teammates the ball into tight spaces," coach Phil Silva said of Ryan, who was second on the team in points (17) with seven goals and 10 assists. She is a first-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Cailee Leonard, Dighton-Rehoboth

An Eastern Mass. Girls Soccer Coaches Association All-Star, the D-R senior was a key playmaker and force to be reckoned with in the attacking third. Leonard finished with 13 goals and seven assists in 17 games this season, helping the Falcons

Morgan Riley, Foxboro

A four-year contributor and senior captain for the Warriors, Riley was once again impactful on the offensive end. The Hockomock League All-Star finished the season with seven goals and four assists. Riley is a first-time Sun Chronicle selection and member of the Warrior girls lacrosse team.
