#### Drew Bessette, Attleboro

A four-year member for the Bombardiers who will enter his fifth season next year, Bessette had Attleboro's best plus-minus rating and was second in scoring with eight goals with 10 assists for 18 points. The junior captain was a versatile player who was used heavily in penalty kill situations.

#### Cam Elliott, Attleboro

Elliott closed out his time with Attleboro as a reliable all-around senior defenseman who was moved to the forward in the second half of the season. A great defender with a knack for lighting the lamp, the Hockomock League All-Star finished his season with six goals and eight assists for 14 points, ranking third on the team. Three of his six goals were game-winners.

#### Brody Wolfe, Attleboro

Wolfe broke out in his junior season, topping the Bombardiers in scoring with 22 goals and four assists for 26 points with three hat tricks. The Hockomock League All-Star forward showcased his talent and skill despite his small size by utilizing his speed and scoring ability.

#### Ryan Avila, Bishop Feehan

The junior forward helped dictate the speed of games, with and without the puck, by relying on his physicality to stop opponents and get the Shamrocks' offense going. He was second on the team in goals with six, including three game-winning goals, and had four assists for 10 points.

#### Cam Moura, Bishop Feehan

The senior forward was second on the team in scoring with 14 points, scoring four goals with 10 assists. A captain tri-cap-

tain for his final season, Moura provided leadership as a Catholic Central League All-Star.

#### Austen Trethewey, Bishop Feehan

Trethewey started 15 games in goal for Bishop Feehan and kept the Shamrocks in a number of games. The junior goaltender helped Feehan to seven wins as he posted a 2.40 goals against average with a .920 save percentage.

#### Nikko Chiaradonna, Foxboro

The Warriors' junior forward and team

co-captain again put up eye-popping numbers for Foxboro, nearly doubling his 18-goal tally from a season ago with 35 goals and 16 assists for a team-leading 51 points as a Hockomock League All-Star. The three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star boasts speed, strength with the puck and skill to make him nearly impossible to stop. Chiaradonna still found ways to make things happen and help lead Foxboro to four wins.

#### Grady Bianculli, King Philip

Bianculli tallied 21 points in 20 games, continuing his role as a senior captain on the blue line to earn a third straight Sun Chronicle All-Star nod. The Hockomock League All-Star defenseman tallied 11 goals and 10 assists as he found ways to the goal either as a scorer or to lend an assist.

#### Finn Cunningham, King Philip

A dynamic scorer who could be inserted into any situation and provide what was needed, Cunningham had 13 goals and 13 assists for a team-high 26 points in 17 games. The senior center and Hockomock League All-Star suffered what was believed to be a season-ending injury early in the season, but came back and showed no signs of being slowed down with a hat trick to beat Franklin in late January.

#### Tom Frazier, King Philip

Frazier put up a great senior season for the Warriors, finishing second on the team in scoring with six goals and 18 assists for 24 points. A two-way forward who was a strong, fast winger, the Hockomock League All-Star brought physical play to get to the net.

#### Evan Regan, King Philip

A top-end defenseman for King Philip, Regan provided two-way abilities that made him equal parts of the Warriors' attack and defensive core throughout the season. The Hockomock League All-Star scored five goals and had 11 assists for 16 points, helping spark a KP offense that featured four 20-plus point scorers.

#### Hayden Terrell, King Philip

Terrell was crucial for the Warriors between the pipes, helping them to a 13-win season and its first state tourney win in program history — a 4-0 Terrell shutout. Reliable in all 15 games that he played, Terrell held opponents to a 2.00 goals against average and a .920 save percentage as a Hockomock League All-Star.

#### Matt Kelly, Mansfield

The Hornets' senior forward was a top-liner for Mansfield throughout the season, collecting a team-high 28 points with 11 goals and 17 assists in his final campaign as a Hockomock League All-Star.
