Adrianna DaRosa, Bishop Feehan

DaRosa ended her senior season at first doubles with partner Ella Graham with a sterling 14-3 mark, earning CCL MVP honors in doubles. She was part of the tandem that beat Westford Academy, the third-ranked team in the Div. 1 tournament, and helped bring the Shamrocks to a Round of 16 appearance and a 14-2 record this season.

Ella Graham, Bishop Feehan

Graham, a junior teamed up with Adrianna DaRosa in first doubles, and were stellar together. The CCL MVPs in doubles ended the year 14-3 overall.

Megan McCusker, Bishop Feehan

The senior opened the season as the Shamrocks' No. 2 singles player, but was thrust into the top spot due to team injuries. McCusker's move didn't hinder her performance as she ended the season with a record of 18-0 at both first and second singles. Dependable to notch points all season atop the lineup, McCusker is a four-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, a Catholic Central League All-Star and won the CCL Sportsmanship Award for her contributions in bringing the Shamrocks a league title.

Jaelyn Dang, King Philip

Dang was the Warriors' No. 1 singles player, going 13-7 against opposing teams' best competition. Consistency was the senior's biggest asset as she rarely put herself out of matches and was steady on both her forehand and backhand. The two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star was a Hockomock League All-Star.

Addison Lewis, King Philip

Lewis made great strides to improve her game this season, ending her senior campaign with a record of 10-4 at second singles. Named the Warriors' Most Improved Player, Lewis showed a strong tennis IQ that allowed her to pick up on opponents' weaknesses, paired with a good

Megan Atwood, North Attleboro

The Rocketeers had strong play from Atwood at first singles with the senior going 15-5 to help North Attleboro win the Davenport Division title with a record of 16-4. A two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Atwood's success as a Hockomock League All-Star in her final season on the court was a result of her consistency and ability to match opposing top singles players point for point.
