

The Boys Basketball All-Stars

Attleboro High's Connor Houle was the Kelley-Rex Division MVP in his senior season and closed out his Bombardiers career with 1,236 points.

Devin Dufresne, Attleboro

Dufresne averaged 10.4 points per game, scoring 249 points in a 21-win season for Attleboro. The junior Hockomock League All-Star also had 2.4 rebounds per game and hit 43 3-pointers with a 68% field goal percentage. He was the team leader in both 3-point percentage and field goal percentage as Dufresne was a spot-up shooter for the Bombardiers with a tough defensive motor who consistently played at a high level.

Shane Hanrahan, Attleboro

Hanrahan scored 233 points, playing a versatile role in Attleboro's offensive plans. The junior's presence allowed Attleboro to play an aggressive switching man-to-man defense and transition offense that was one of the best in the state. He was also willing to battle in the post or on the perimeter, and came up big in moments, like his game-winning 3-pointer to knock off eventual Div. 1 state champion Bishop Feehan in the Blue Bombardier Classic. Hanrahan also averaged four rebounds a game with a 75% free-throw percentage.

Connor Houle, Attleboro

The senior point continued his ascension into one of the top scorers in the Hockomock League and was the Kelley-Rex Division MVP. Houle was the floor general for the Bombardiers in helping them achieve a 21-win season and a MIAA Div. 1 tournament berth as a top-10 ranked team. Houle closed out his high school ca-

reer with 1,236 points for the third-most in program history. The ultimate teammate and player, the three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star averaged 18.6 points and 5.5 assists per game, and was a strong piece in keeping Attleboro's high-paced offense going.

Ladainian Rodrigues, Attleboro

A three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and three-time Hockomock League All-Star, Rodrigues was the second half of a dynamic scoring duo for the Bombardiers. The senior swingman had 1,142 career points for fifth in school history and closed his senior season with 471 points, averaging 19.6 points per game. Rodrigues was also a strong rebounder, averaging 10.3 per game and a strong piece at all levels with four assists and 4.1 steals per game. He was a regular in Attleboro's rotation for the last three seasons as a fierce competitor and a strong leader.

Brody Bumila, Bishop Feehan

The Catholic Central League MVP put on a show for the ages during the MIAA Div. 1 tournament to cap his senior season, helping the Shamrocks win the state title. In 25 games, the three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star scored 766 points, averaging 30.6 per game on 69.7% shooting with 15.2 rebounds per game. Bumila scored 30 points or more in 12 games and had 40 or more in five games. In the state tournament, Bumila averaged over 50 points per

game along with 20 rebounds going into the state final against Central Catholic. He also tied the school's single-game record of 51 points in a semifinal win over Andover. Routinely double- or triple-teamed with the ball, Bumila found a way to will his team to victory and proved to be one of the most dominant players Massachusetts has seen in the past 25 years.

Egan Gill, Bishop Feehan

A Catholic Central League All-Star, Gill appeared in 25 games his junior season, posting 177 points while averaging 7.1 points per game across that stretch as the Shamrocks' point guard. A 31% 3-point shooter, Gill was an iron man for the state champion Shamrocks who rarely saw time off the floor. He averaged 3.4 rebounds and 1.4 steals per game as an excellent on-ball defender and floor general.

Lucas McNally, Bishop Feehan

The Bishop Feehan senior averaged 10.2 points per game during the Shamrocks' state title run, leading the team with 28 3-pointers (26%). As a sharpshooting perimeter threat, McNally came up big multiple times down the stretch in tournament play, including 10 three-pointers in the final five games- two of which were crucial in the state final. He averaged 3.0 assists per game.

Jake Webster, Bishop Feehan

In 25 games for the Shamrocks, Webster posted 346 points, averaging 13.8 points per game with a 46.7% shooting percentage. The senior two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star also averaged 6.6 rebounds, four assists and 1.7 steals as a smart and versatile player for the Shamrocks who had an innate ability to slash to the hoop and defend the opposition's best player. The Catholic Central League All-Star saw time at both point guard and at power forward as he came up big all season.

Maddex Mendoza, Dighton-Rehoboth

Mendoza was a quality secondary option for the Falcons, averaging 13.9 points per game behind Reidy. The junior also had four rebounds and 2.6 assists per game, and was named a South Coast Conference All-Star.

Josh Reidy, Dighton-Rehoboth

Reidy is a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and was an elite scorer for the Falcons this past season, helping D-R to an 11-win season. The senior averaged 23.9 points and 9.1 rebounds per game to go with averaging 2.3 assists. He was a South Coast Conference All-Star.

Cam DeLeskey, Foxboro

DeLeskey was a senior grinder for Foxboro, leading the Warriors in steals (1.5), pass deflections (1.7) and assists (2.8) per game. He also averaged 8.4 points for third

on the team and 3.2 rebounds per game. A great competitor and a tremendous athlete, Deleskey's ability to defend the opposition made him an invaluable part of Foxboro's success.

Henry Griffin, Foxboro

Griffin was second on the team in scoring with 10.4 points per game, and was second on the team in rebounds at a 7.4 per game rate. The senior Hockomock League All-Star also averaged a team-high 1.1 blocks per game and was a 63% shooter from the field with five double-doubles. An interior force for Foxboro, Griffin was consistent and reliable in the post for the Warriors to give them rim protection and production on both ends of the court.

Colin Trimble, Foxboro

The senior Hockomock League All-Star led the Warriors in several offensive categories, including 15.3 points per game and 9.8 rebounds per game. He also averaged three offensive rebounds to lead Foxboro and averaged two assists per game. Trimble shot 44% from the field and was a 35% shooter from beyond the arc, ranking third on the team. Trimble had 10 double-doubles with three games of 28-plus points and had a 23 and 13 double-double in Foxboro's state tournament win. A nightmare matchup for the opposition, Trimble could score both inside and outside, bringing high production and leadership to the Warriors.
