

The Girls Soccer All-Stars

Jamie Davies, Attleboro

A four-year veteran for Attleboro, Davies played outside midfielder and striker. With a natural knack for goal scoring and being in the right place when needed, she capped her senior campaign with 14 goals and two assists, helping Attleboro get into the postseason the past two seasons while leading the team in scoring. The Hockomock League All-Star ends her high school career with 35 goals and three assists.

Tatum O'Brien, Attleboro

A second-year varsity starter as a sophomore, O'Brien's ability to create plays made her a tough attacker to defend in blue and white. Only a sophomore, she was a Hockomock League All-Star with an ability to create shots and score from distance. O'Brien finished the season with nine goals and eight assists.

Maddison Eddy, Bishop Feehan

A talented senior midfielder, Eddy's value on the field was indispensable as a defender, playmaker and attacker. Her corner taking abilities became key during the Shamrocks postseason run, leading to several goals, including one to clinch a state final appearance in Division 1. She finished her final season with 11 goals and 25 assists, the latter being the second-most in a single season for Bishop Feehan. A Catholic Central League All-Star, Eddy will play college soccer with Merrimack next fall. "I thought she played even better in the second half of the season," Silva said. "She created a lot of opportunities off set pieces and corner kicks and did a great job in the middle of the field for us."

Ava Graham, Bishop Feehan

Graham was the Catholic Central League MVP as a regular in the box when it came to putting the ball home for Bishop Feehan. The senior finished the year with 23 goals and 14 assists as a technically gifted player who the Shamrocks looked at to produce every game. On top of her attacking duties, she was a relentless defender, when possession was lost. Graham will continue at the collegiate level with Holy Cross next fall. "A clutch performer," Bishop Feehan head coach Phil Silva said. "I thought she stepped in and played hungry. She's one of the most committed defenders as a forward that I've ever coached. A lot of times, we take for granted that forwards don't need to defend and she makes it a huge part of her game. She scored big goals, she's willing to do whatever it takes to win." Graham is a multiple-time Sun Chronicle All-Star.

Brooke Kennedy, Bishop Feehan

A defensive midfielder for the Shamrocks, Kennedy's versatility and non-stop play saw her tally 12 goals and eight assists as a regular fixture on the field. The junior was an All-State pick, and garnered votes for All-New England consideration. A Catholic Central League All-Star, Kennedy has committed to Fairfield University going into her senior season. "She's one of the best all-around midfielders in the state," Silva said of the multiple-time Sun Chronicle All-Star. "She can play every position and has just a ridiculous work ethic."

Amanda Peck, Bishop Feehan

A centerback who could also generate at midfield, Peck's versatility to step up into midfield for added help gave opposing teams trouble trying to get the ball across midfield. High energy and defensive intellect saw her be a fixture in green and gold, and emerge as one of the top defenders in the state. The junior Catholic Central League All-Star ended the year with four goals and two assists. "We moved her into midfield a lot during games even though she was playing (centerback,)" Silva said of Peck, who has already committed to play college soccer at the University of Miami. "Her ability to get up and down and track people defensively, I don't think there's many players in the state who could've done what she did for us this year. For her to do that all season long, the amount of energy it took, she was key."

Neve Taylor, Bishop Feehan

A transfer from Foxboro, Taylor's impact on the field made waves as an attacker and play-maker. Taylor's presence added another threat for the Shamrocks as the junior forward scored 13 goals with three assists for Bishop Feehan in her first season with the program with hopes of taking the next step in development with Graham and Eddy departing for college. "Coming into a brand new situation and adapting from being one of two central at-

tacking players in Foxboro to being in the mix, her role changed," Silva said. "She defended well for us and technically, she's a great passer and has an accurate shot. Would love to see her take another step forward next year."

Haleigh Kelley, Dighton-Rehoboth

A Falcons' co-captain, Kelley was a vocal and emotional catalyst for Dighton-Rehoboth in goal. The junior posted eight clean sheets as a steady presence for a young D-R defense, and shined in two draws to conference powerhouse Apponequet. Kelley was also a South Coast Conference All-Star.

Cailee Leonard, Dighton-Rehoboth

Only a sophomore, Leonard led the attack for the Falcons with 22 goals and eight assists for a prolific season of scoring that ranks her 10th all-time in single season scoring. A strong on the ball player with a knack to knock it past the defender to turn and go, she was a South Coast Conference All-Star.

Erin Foley, Foxboro

A physical midfielder/forward who used her strength and her body to find her way into the box, Foley ended the season with 16 goals and five assists for Foxboro as the team-leader in both categories. The senior

Lindsey Resnick, Foxboro

Resnick's ability to provide the scoring charge as a defender saw her end the season with five assists and three goals in her senior season. A standout defender, Resnick was one of three defenders to be tabbed for the Hockomock League's 'Best 11' as a league all-star.

Addisyn Lamothe-Vaughn, King Philip

Considered one of the top defensemen in the state as a junior, Lamothe-Vaughn was a lockdown right back for the Warriors, who allowed the third-fewest goals in the Hockomock League as a league all-star. While known for her defensive work inside the 18, she was also a threat to take the ball up field and act as a playmaker for her offense. King Philip earned 11 shutout wins throughout the season with her lockdown expertise.

Heidi Lawrence, King Philip

Possibly the most dangerous goal scorer in the Hockomock League, Lawrence burned defenses with off both pure speed and high-level shot selection and placement. Named the Hockomock League's Player of The Year, the Warriors' senior amassed 32 goals and 14 assists this
