Alex Houle, Attleboro

Anchoring the lineup at No. 1 singles, the Bombardiers senior captain went toe-to-toe with the best in the Hockomock League, with every match proving to be a hard-fought one. Houle was recognized for her efforts as she was named a Hockomock League All-Star for the Bombardiers.

Ella Graham, Bishop Feehan

The only returning Sun Chronicle All-Star, Graham was the Shamrocks’ senior captain, and a mainstay in the singles rotation while seeing time at No. 2 and No. 3 singles. Graham finished with a 7-6 singles mark for the MIAA tournament-qualifying Shamrocks and provided valuable leadership.

Keira Tinory, Bishop Feehan

Tinory was the Shamrocks’ MVP despite only being a sophomore. She seemed to always deliver whenever her team needed a point en route to a 13-2 regular-season record at No. 1 singles. The right-hander advanced to the quarterfinal round in the individual state tournament.

Addison Hoyle, Dighton-Rehoboth

The Dighton-Rehoboth junior played an impactful role in the starting rotation for the MIAA Tournament-qualifying Falcons. Hoyle only lost one match while playing at No. 3 singles.

Mia Saviolakis, Dighton-Rehoboth

A four-year contributor for the Falcons,

Saviolakis capped her career as a mainstay at No. 1 singles after playing both singles and doubles during her first three seasons. Saviolakis was recognized as a South Coast Conference All-Star.

Veronica Souaiden, Foxboro

Souaiden was the Warriors’ senior captain and a model for consistency during her four years with the program. She played at both No. 1 and No. 2 singles during her final campaign, finishing with a 9-7 individual record to be named a Hockomock League All-Star. Souaiden also was honored with Foxboro High’s sportsmanship award.

Natalie Collins, King Philip

Recognized as a Hockomock League All-Star, Collins made a noticeable leap in her junior season. After spending her underclassmen seasons at doubles, Collins was elevated to No. 2 singles this spring and utilized her impressive backhand en route to a 10-7 singles record, with nine of those wins coming at the No. 2 slot.

Karlie DiFiore, King Philip

It didn’t take the King Philip freshman long to get used to competitive tennis as DiFiore started the first match of the season at No. 2 singles and then elevated into a mainstay at No. 1. The Warriors’ newcomer rode a consistent serve and steady play to a 9-9 individual record. She was named King Philip’s co-MVP and is also a Hockomock League All-Star.

Rose Loughlin, King Philip, Junior

The King Philip junior proved to be a secret weapon with the way she rounded out a stellar singles rotation. Loughlin posted a 13-4 singles record, going 10-4 at second singles and 3-0 mark when called to fill in at No. 2 singles. Loughlin’s versatility and ability to limit unforced errors earned her team co-MVP honors along with being recognized as a Hockomock League All-Star.

Addison Cooper, Mansfield

Cooper was the Hornets’ star sophomore in her first year on the varsity court. She began the campaign at No. 3 singles before rising to the top spot by season’s end and
