

The Boys Indoor Track All-Stars

Braiden Carrico, Attleboro

A Hockomock All-Star for the four-time Hockomock League champion Bombardiers, Carrico finished second place in the long jump, sixth in the 55M dash, and helped the 4x200M relay team to a second-place finish at the league meet. The junior placed seventh in the long jump at the Division 1 State Championship and 20th in the 55M dash while helping Attleboro to an eighth-place finish in the 4x200M relay.

Fareed Oseni, Attleboro

The multi-talented Bombardier junior took first place at the Hockomock League Championship in the 55-meter hurdles (7.54) and tied for second in the high jump. At the New Balance, the Hockomock League All-Star finished in 97th place. Oseni won every dual meet during the regular season except for one, when he finished second for the Bombardiers, who claimed their fourth straight Hockomock crown.

Noah Williams, Attleboro

The talented senior shot putter is a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and a Hockomock League All-Star, finishing second in the event at the league meet. Williams was the top performer at the Division 1 State meet for the Bombardiers. He was ranked fourth in the state in the shot put and finished seventh at States. At the New Balance, Williams placed 53rd. Williams won every regular season meet he participated in this season except for one.

Xavier Baker, Bishop Feehan

The junior speedster won individual gold in the 55-meter dash at the MAC Championship (6.61) and was a member of the first-place 4x200M relay team (1:35.05) at the same meet. At the Division 2 State Championship, Baker was fifth in the 55M (6.66) and was part of the 10th-place 4x200 relay team (1:33.62). He finished 24th in the 55 meters (6.80) at the Meet of Champions. "Xavier's focus all season was being at his best when it mattered most," Shamrocks co-head coach Brendan Sullivan said. "He showed up for the team during championship season, earning a medal at the D2 Championships and a trip to the Meet of Champions."

Eli Fernandes, Bishop Feehan

The versatile senior excelled in the high jump, where he won the Division 2 state championship with a jump of 6-5. Fernandes also competed in 55-meter dash with a 6.95 top time, placing seventh in the event at the MSTCA Coaches Invitational, and had a top mark of 18-9½ in the long jump. "Eli saved his best for last this year, as he had a three-inch season-best jump (an improvement from the Meet of Champions) to win the D2 state title in the high jump," Shamrocks co-head coach Brendan Sullivan said. "Eli thrives in the big moments."

Mack Slowey, Bishop Feehan

Only a sophomore, the versatile athlete also participated in three events with a stunning performance in the long jump, where he jumped 22-7¼ to break a long-standing Shamrocks school record in the event at the MSTCA Coaches Invi-

tational. He finished fourth at the Div. 2 State Championship (21-5) in the long jump and ninth (21-2¼) at the Meet of Champions. His other event season-best performances included an 8.68 in the 55M hurdles and 6-2 in the high jump (at the MSTCA Coaches Invitational). "Mack has an extremely high ceiling in the jumps," Shamrocks co-head coach Brendan Sullivan said. "He broke a 30-year-old record in his first long jump of the season and will continue to improve as he commits more and more to the sport."

Seamus Sullivan, Dighton-Rehoboth

The Falcons senior closed out his scholastic career by breaking a 17-year-old school record in the 55-meter dash with a time of 6.60. He also placed first in the 55M dash at the SCC Championship Meet, and was second in the 300M at the same meet. Sullivan was also a member of D-R's 4x50-yard shuttle relay team that placed eighth at the Division 5 Relays, was seventh in the 55M dash at the Division 5 State Championship to qualify for All-Stars and was a member of the 4x200m relay team that placed seventh at the Division 5 Championship.

Timmy Chase, Foxboro

The sensational senior was the leading point-scorer for the Warriors. A two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Chase was Foxboro's top performer in the mile (4:36.48), two-mile (10:25.75), and in the 600M (1:24.55), and was a third-place finisher in the Division 4 State Championship in the same event. The Hockomock League All-Star was also a mainstay for the Warriors' 4x400 and 4x800 relays. "He was one of the captains of the team, and he's had one of his most consistent seasons this winter, always stepping up in places that the team needed him to help the team win meets," Foxboro head coach Matt Smith said.

Eamonn Kelly, Foxboro

Kelly was Foxboro's multi-talented senior co-captain who was the second-highest point-scorer on the team, and the Warriors' top performer in the 300M (37.13), the 400M (51.2), the 800M (2:01.8), and the 1,000m (2:41.72). A Hockomock League All-Star, Kelly took third in the 600M at

the Hockomock League Championship, and was the anchor of Foxboro's 4x400 and 4x800 relays. "He was highly competitive and dedicated with some of the best event range I've ever coached," Warriors head coach Matt Smith said. "He always wants to do as much as possible in the meets. The word of the season for Eamonn has been 'reliable.'"

Ryan Love, King Philip

Love was a great senior captain for the Warriors this winter and the Hockomock League champion in the 1,000M who anchored the league-champion-winning 4x400M relay as well. He placed third overall in the 1,000 at the Division 2 State Championship, with his season best in the 1,000 coming at the Meet of Champions in a time of 2:36.12.

Connor McDonald, King Philip

McDonald was a Hockomock League All-Star as a senior captain. He was the Hockomock League champion in the 300M with a PR time of 36.54, and a crucial member of the league-champion 4x400M relay team. McDonald placed fourth at the

THE BOYS INDOOR TRACK ALL-STAR

TEAM was selected by staff writers with local coaches consulted for their recommendations.

Hockomock League Championship in the 55M hurdles with a PR time of 8.13.

Nikita Cherapukha, Mansfield

Only a sophomore, Cherapukha was the Hornets' leading distance runner and their highest finisher at the Div. 3 State Championship. He finished sixth at the state meet in the two-mile with a time of 10:02.42 for a personal best. Cherapukha finished fourth at the Hockomock League Championship in the same event in 10:05.78. He set new personal bests in the mile (4:42.60) and the 1,000 (2:46.52). "He competes with the maturity and thought process of an upper-classman," Mansfield head coach Kevin Butera said.

Cameron Sekora, Mansfield

Sekora was the Hornets' jack-of-all-trades and the team's highest scorer by a wide margin. Sekora ran times and jumped distances that put him in the top 10 in Mansfield history — a tremendous accomplishment considering the strength and history of the program. He ran 6.74 in the 55M, high-jumped 5-8, and long-jumped 20-6.75. "One of his biggest contributions to the program was leading our 4x200M team to a third-place finish at the Hockomock League Championship Meet," said head coach Kevin Butera.
