Daniel Fleming, Mansfield

The Hornets’ junior went 11-1 in first doubles with teammate Dorian Michel for Mansfield. Fleming received the team’s Most Improved Award and has been selected as a captain for next year’s squad.

Muhi Karuppusamy, Mansfield

Only a sophomore, Karuppusamy is already a repeat Sun Chronicle All-Star. Stepping up to No. 1 singles this season, Karuppusamy went 14-5 to be named the Hornets’ MVP and a Hockomock League All-Star.

Dorian Michel, Mansfield

Michel went 11-1 playing at first doubles in his sophomore season with partner David Fleming for the Hornets.

Bhavi Mood, North Attleboro

The Rocketeers’ senior captain finished 8-8 at second singles but according to Rocketeers boys tennis coach Tyler Aubuchon, “(Bhavi’s) contribution to the team can’t be measured in wins. He is an amazing leader and a huge reason our young and inexperienced squad ended up in the playoffs and being a competitive team.”

Aaryav Relan, North Attleboro

Although just a sophomore, Relan led the Rocketeers with an 11-5 record at first singles, including match victories over powerhouse Sharon, Foxboro (which was undefeated at the time) and Marblehead in the MIAA tournament. “(Aaryav) is an incredible tennis player and loves the strategic side of the game,” North Attleboro boys tennis coach Tyler Aubuchon said. Relan is a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and a Hockomock League All-Star.

Nathan Chisholm, Attleboro

Only a freshman, Chisholm nonetheless played first singles for the Bombardiers, going 7-9 and helping the team to the state tourney. “He smacks a heavy ball while learning his capabilities,” Bombardiers boys tennis coach Chris Morris said. Chisholm is also a Hockomock League All-Star.

Jackson Fazzina, Attleboro

Fazzina, a junior Hockomock League All-Star, played at No. 2 singles and compiled an impressive 11-5 record this season. Called “Cool, calm and collected, with amazing technical skill” by Attleboro boys tennis coach Chris Morris, Fazzina was chosen as a co-captain for the 2027 season.

Max Comey, Bishop Feehan

Comey was the senior captain at No. 1 singles for the Shamrocks and finished 8-8 while playing one of the toughest schedules in the state. Comey, who is a multi-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, will attend the University of Notre Dame in the fall.

Will Kennedy, Bishop Feehan

The junior began the season playing second doubles, where he went 5-3, before making the switch to third singles for the Shamrocks, where he went an identical 5-3. Kennedy has already been selected as a 2027 team captain.

Conor Wright, Bishop Feehan

Wright is a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star who was a team leader. The talented junior finished the season at 10-6 in second singles despite playing a schedule consisting of mostly top Division-1 schools. Wright has been selected as a 2027 team captain.

Ty Perry, Dighton-Rehoboth

The multi-talented junior capped off his impressive season with a 12-0 regular-season mark, and improved to 13-0 with his state state tourney match. Perry didn’t drop a set all season, and was named the

Jacob Dsouza, Foxboro

The sensational freshman joined the Warriors this spring, and according to Foxboro boys head coach Jim DiNitto, “took the league by storm.” Dsouza finished the season with a 16-1 record to be named was the Hockomock League’s Davenport Division MVP. His lone loss of the regular season came in his final match of the season to North Attleboro’s No. 1 singles player — a player he had beaten in straight sets earlier in the season. According to DiNitto, “Coming off the court after that defeat, I was expecting disappointment, but what Jacob expressed about the match was ‘He won. He played better than me today. He deserved to win,’ which I considered a very mature response to his only loss of the

season.”

Justin Truss, Foxboro

Playing at second singles as a sophomore, Truss turned in a solid 10-5 record, relying on his combination of power and finesse. “Most opponents see Justin as a very young-looking boy who looks like he could be easily overwhelmed, but what he lacks in stature, he makes up for it in true grit,” Foxboro head coach Jim DiNitto said. “They (opponents) usually figure out that he’s way more than they bargained for, and many players come off the court after playing him and wonder what happened.”

Luke Bailer, King Philip

Bailer was a senior co-captain for the Warriors, who went 10-10 during the season to qualify for the MIAA Div. 2 state tournament for the second season in a row. A three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Bailer went 12-6 for King Philip in the highly competitive Hockomock League where the Warriors’ improved as the season progressed. Bailer was selected as a league all-star to wrap up having played varsity tennis for four years.

Brent Schneider, King Philip

The Warriors’ senior co-captain went 9-6 at second singles for King Philip to finish his four-year varsity career as a Hockomock League All-Star.

Kingston Carey, Mansfield

Carey was a reliable 13-4 at third singles for the Hornets, who repeated as league champions in the Davenport Division of the Hockomock League with a 16-3 league record and a 10-0 divisional mark. A senior captain this season, Carey received the team’s Coach’s Award. He will be pursuing
