Donovan Rohrs, King Philip

A breakout junior campaign saw Rohrs finish his season with 352 points, averaging 16 per points game for King Philip. The Hockomock League All-Star shot 47% from the field and had six games of 25 points or more, including a career-high 30 against Sharon.

Brody Billone, Mansfield

Billone scored 257 points in 23 games, hitting from the field at a 41% rate. The junior Hockomock League All-Star was a frequent 3-point shooter, hitting from distance 60 times at a 36% rate. Billone added 66 assists, grabbed 124 rebounds and had 36 steals with 12 blocks for Mansfield.

Matas Gutauskas, Mansfield

Gutauskas put up 215 points in 21 games for his senior season played, shooting at a 53% percentage for Mansfield. He grabbed 101 rebounds with 35 assists, and had 38 steals with six blocks as one of multiple key figures on a Hornets team that was one of the top teams in Division 2 nearly all season.

Darrian Sanders, Mansfield

Mansfield's second-leading scorer with 276 points, Sanders shot 42% from the floor. The Hornets' junior also 112 assists and 150 rebounds, both team highs, along with 22 blocks and 37 steals as a Hockomock League All-Star.

Tommy Vallett, Mansfield

Vallett finished his senior season with a team-high 279 points in 24 games, shooting at a 60% rate from almost exclusively inside the arc. The Hockomock League All-Star grabbed 143 rebounds with 73 assists, and also had 46 steals with 12 blocks to lead the Hornets to the Division 2 quarterfinal.

Jovani Melendez, Norton

The junior was the go-to guy for the Lancers

this season, emerging as a unanimous Tri-Valley League All-Star selection. Melendez finished with 422 points, averaging 21.1 points per game on 50% shooting from inside the arc. From distance, he was a 34% shooter, acting as the central part to Norton's offense and averaged three steals per game.

Elliott Baldizar, Seekonk

The Warriors' sophomore guard finished with 349 points, shooting 55 3-pointers as Seekonk finished the season with nine wins. He added 158 rebounds with 66 assists, 23 steals and 13 blocked shots to lead a young Warriors' core. Seekonk's MVP, Baldizar tied a school record with eight 3-pointers against Fairhaven during the season and was a unanimous South Coast Conference All-Star.

Gavin Pereira, Seekonk

Pereira's was the sophomore engine that made the Warriors go. The underclassman led the SCC in assists with 133, averaging seven per game, and was second on the team in scoring with 220 points. Pereira also had 52 rebounds, 42 steals and 13 blocks at guard.
