Redbud Ride returns for 2025 cycling season

a s spring makes its return, redbud trees begin to bloom again – indicating that the time for cyclists to prepare for the Redbud Ride has arrived.

The Redbud Ride is held in London – the Cycling Capital of Kentucky – each year. This will mark the annual event's 19th year, as it was established as early as 2006.

This year, the recreational event will begin at the London-Laurel Farmers Market, located at 100 West Dixie Street in London, around 7:30 a.m. on Saturday, April 26.

Registration, early check-in, and festivities will be available Friday, April 25. Registration and packet pick up will be held at the London Community Center from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m., with a Downtown Block Party kicking off around 6 p.m. The block party entails entertainment at participating downtown eateries.

At 6:30 a.m. on April 26, cyclists will have a final opportunity to register at the London-Laurel County Farmers Market. A Jr. Redbud Ride at Town Center Park will follow, starting at 10 a.m. Once participants

cross the finish line, they will be greeted by an afterparty at the the farmers market – featuring live entertainment, food trucks, and local vendors.

Over the years, the Redbud Ride has become a staple within the London community. Each year, the ride attracts about 800 to 900 cyclists ranging in skill level. Riders can choose from four well-marked routes, each supported by knowledgable SAG (Support and Gear) drivers and a network of rest stops. With a family-friendly 23-mile loop and a more rigorous 100-mile century ride, the event has something for everyone.

Routes include the Yellow Route, Orange Route, Green Route, and Red Route. Yellow is 24 miles long, Orange is 34, Green is 72, and Red is 100. Each one will kick off at 7:30 a.m. on April 26.

Funds raised through the ride will go back to London Downtown, the host of the event, for the enhancement of downtown businesses and restaurants.

Both the London and Laurel tourism commissions work alongside London Downtown to make the event possible. With London Downtown's Executive Director Kristen Strawser just entering the role in November last year, this will mark her first RedBud Ride as director.

"There's something special about seeing the streets filled with riders, families, and visitors all enjoying our town," Strawser said of the event. "It's a perfect example of how events can boost visibility and community pride."

2025 Redbud Ride dedicated to memory of Cammie Creech

Cammie Creech was 54 years old when she passed away unexpectedly while participating in last year's Redbud Ride.

It was Creech's first time taking part in an event such as this one, for which she had excitedly trained for with her husband, Jack. The pair regularly cycled on back roads in preparation for the ride. When the day came, they chose to do the Yellow Route – a 24-mile route that she purchased a bike in anticipation of.

"She was looking forward to it," said her sister-in-law, Kathy Creech. "She had it marked on her calendar: Redbud Ride."

On the route, Cammie passed due to a sudden widowmaker heart attack. According to Kathy, although heart disease does run in Cammie's family, she had not experienced the typical warning signs. Kathy recalled that doctors had treated her sister-in-law for acid reflux just two months earlier, never suspecting it was related to more serious complications.

sister-in-law. "She's more of a sister to me, but legally, she's my sister-in-law," she said.

She also shared that Cammie had two children, Brandon and Shae.

In addition to loving her family, Cammie had a deep love for animals and plants. She volunteered with local rescues such as Kentucky Mutts, and had a talent for taking care of plants, as well as flowers.

"She could make a plant come back from the dead," Kathy said.

When asked how Cammie would want to be remembered, Kathy stated, "She'd want to be remembered for the way she loved people, God, and animals."

Kathy described Cammie as the kind of person who always noticed when others were struggling and needed help. One example she provided was when a coworker was upset about putting her dog to rest and Cammie did not hesitate to provide emotional support. "Just wait right there – I'll go with you," she told her.

Kathy also shared that Cammie was most known by her loved ones for her selflessness and humor.

"She had more energy, I swear, than a teenager. The woman never sat down. She was like spitfire," Kathy stated. "She was a prankster. She loved to crack a joke and pull a prank better than anybody."

That same energy extended into much of what Cammie did – including how she approached the Redbud Ride.

"I think she really enjoyed it," Kathy said. "I think she would have continued on had she lived."

This year, a bicycle will be on display at the London-Laurel County Farmers Market – where the Redbud Ride will kick off – in Cammie Creech's memory. Tumblers and t-shirts with her photo on them will also be available.

REDBUD RIDE ROUTES

Redbud Ride offers a route for everyone

yclists at different skill-levels require different routes – that's why the Redbud Ride offers

These include the yellow, orange, green, and red routes. While riders can decide for themselves which route best fits their comfort and experience, the most commonly recommended option for beginners is the yellow route, a smooth, 24-mile loop that travels from downtown London to McWhorter Church and back.

Second in difficulty is the 34-mile orange route. It is a modest route, great for first-timers seeking a challenge or experienced riders interested in keeping a more casual pace.


The green, intermediate route entails 72 miles. The route will have several short hills, as well as some

The route is known for being scenic and will once again be part of the Kentucky Cycling Challenge, which contains five rides including the Redbud Ride. In the case that an individual participates in all five rides on the list, they will receive custom gear for the year.

The red – and pinnacle of the Redbud Ride - is the most advanced route. It has been chosen by cyclists across the nation as the "Best Century Ride in America."

The route will be a part of the Kentucky Century Challenge again this year. The challenge requires cyclists to complete at least 250 miles to earn rewards.

All adult routes are on public roads and highways. Kelvin Hib-

bard, London Downtown President, shared that riders are expected to follow all state traffic and bicycle safety rules, as the Redbud Ride prioritizes safety, with six safety and gear (SAG) drivers patrolling the routes in clearly marked vehicles and four medically trained Red Cross riders biking alongside participants to assist if needed.

Each of the four routes will be marked with signs, colored arrows, and street signage. Volunteers drive the routes in advance to highlight any potholes or road hazards. Curves and turns are painted with

colored arrows on the pavement red route riders follow red arrows, blue route riders follow blue, etc.

In addition to physical markers, cyclists can download free GPS maps of the routes through this link: https://visitlondonky.com/attractions/cycling-capital-of-kentucky-2/. Hibbard stated the the GPS system offers detailed, turn-by-turn navigation, including parking instructions, elevation changes, and rest stop alerts. It is available at no cost and can be programmed directly into a participant's phone.

All routes include multiple rest

stops – about nine total– spaced approximately 15 to 20 miles apart. These stops offer cyclists the chance to rest, eat or hydrate, and use the restroom before heading out again.

Although most participants finish by mid-afternoon – around 2 to 3 p.m. -organizers remain on-site until the final rider returns to ensure each cyclist completes their route safely.

"I want it to feel alive—not just during events, but all the time," Strawser stated. "I'm incredibly excited about what's ahead. I'm grateful for the support so far and can't wait to keep building something special for our little town."

Strawser, born and raised in London, attended South Laurel High School. In addition to her recent role, Strawser is a business owner. Strawser's business, Moody Cows, is a local ice cream shop located at 318 North Main Street in London.


