Johnson County Transfer Station Notice The following changes are included as part of the recently approved 2022-2023 Johnson County operating budget. Beginning August 1st, 2022 there will be an upward adjustment in tipping fees at the Johnson County Transfer Station. The current cost of \$52 dollars per ton to dump will change to \$60 dollars per ton. The minimum charge of \$2 dollars for small loads will change to a minimum charge of \$5 dollars up to 100 pounds. The new fee schedule is brought about due to the change in cost that the County incurs in order to provide this service.


