The *Gloria*, while not initially composed for the holidays, is a wonderful choice for a seasonal program with its lively rhythms, bright melodies, and joyful expression. This piece, known for its uplifting spirit and melodic richness, feels right at home in a holiday celebration, resonating with warmth and excitement.



- he bottom of the trunk (at least an inch). Any pre-cut tree will have sealed its original cut with sap so it can't suck up the water it needs! The best tree starts with selection. Buy a fresh tree and test for needle retention. Gently tug along the branch; only a few needles should fall off.
- Put the tree in the water immediately! Think of your tree as a cut flower. It will not survive long without water; you may not see the tree wilt, but it will never be the same if it dries out. You can start out by just placing the tree in a bucket of cool water in your garage, but don't store it for more than a day or two
- Keep your tree away from heat sources to stop it from drying out.
- Never let the water run dry. Check on water levels twice a day for the first week! WATER. WATER WATER!!




