Work sessions set at City Hall this week

BANDON - The Bandon City Council and Planning Commission are holding work sessions this week that the public is invited to attend. Public comment is not allowed at work sessions, though written input is permitted. Public comment is always welcome at hearings and regular meetings.

A work session is scheduled for 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, March 7, with the Planning Commission to hear a presentation by the Bandon Beach Hotel applicants regarding their proposed zoning code amendment. The applicants are proposing to modify the CD-1 zoning text to allow for a building height up to 45 feet, side and rear yards of 5 feet and 55 percent lot coverage with up to 75 impervious surface. The changes are proposed to only apply to the property currently occupied by the Bandon Beach Motel at 1090 Portland Ave. on Coquille Point.

The Planning Commission will also hold a work session at the same meeting at 6:30 p.m. Wednesday, March 7, to hear a presentation regarding an introduction to a possible new cell tower ordinance for Bandon. An informal discussion will occur with the presentation.

Showing throughout the county, one of her paintings hung outdoors at the Bandon boardwalk event for three seasons. She has exhibited at Mind Power Gallery in Reedsport, had various installations at Southern Coos Hospital and Health Center in Bandon, Evergreen Court in North Bend and she even held a private show at the Coquille Community Building.

OCCI hosts high school culinary competition

COOS BAY - Southwestern Oregon Community College's Oregon Coast Culinary Institute will host The Oregon Coast Invitational on April 14. This is a competition for high school students only. There will be two competitions - culinary and baking. Culinary: Chicken Cordon Bleu, an individual interpretation. Baking: Strawberry Shortcake, an individual interpretation.

The competition begins at 8 a.m. Saturday, April 14, with staggered starting times to allow for students to compete in both competitions if they desire.

Awards to winning individual competitors in the culinary and the baking competitions are: 1st place finishers will receive a \$4,000 scholarship to OCCI; 2nd place finishers will receive a \$3,000 scholarship to OCCI; 3rd place finishers will receive a \$2,000 scholarship to OCCI.

In addition to these scholarship winners, every student participating will receive a \$250 scholarship to attend OCCI. Your school can be a winner too! The schools represented by the top three winters of each category will be given a cash prize to purchase equipment for the culinary program at their school. The first place winner's school will receive \$300, the second place winner's school will receive \$200, and the third place winner's school will receive \$100.

The entry fees for this year's competition are being paid for by OCCI's chief purveyor, Day Ship Supply. Meals included will be Friday night dinner, a continental breakfast Saturday morning, and an awards banquet luncheon. The awards ceremony and lunch will begin at approximately 12:30 p.m. Saturday.
