County to hold hazardous waste collection event

COOS COUNTY – Coos and Curry county residents can dispose of various household chemicals at a second free household hazardous waste collection event this month.

The event is scheduled for 9 a.m.-1 p.m. Saturday, June 24, at the Beaver Hill Transfer Site on U.S. Highway 101 between Coos Bay and Bandon.

Only household hazardous waste will be accepted. The collection event allows Coos and Curry county residents to safely dispose of a wide range of materials including pesticides, solvents, fluorescent

lights, pool chemicals, aerosol cans, caustic cleaners, mercury thermometers and flammable liquids. Ammunition, asbestos, explosives, fireworks, radioactive materials and medical wastes will not be accepted.

The county requests that all disposable materials be in their original containers or otherwise properly labeled.

No large quantities of “unknowns” will be accepted.

Disaster exercise set for this weekend

BANDON – Residents are asked not to be alarmed when they hear aircraft – included fixed-wing and helicopters – taking off and landing between 8 a.m.-5 p.m. this weekend.

A three-day disaster response exercise involving hundreds of participants from over 40 agencies will take place June 24, 25 and 26 in Coos and Curry counties.

Deb Simon, Coos County Emergency Management project coordinator and event public information officer, is asking residents not to call 911 unless they have an emergency. Local officials are all aware of the exercise, which will take place at specific undisclosed locations in North Bend, Bandon and Port Orford.

The exercise is not open to the general public. It has been in the planning stages for more than a year and is intended to enhance capabilities and response activities between local, county, state and

federal emergency response partners in the event of catastrophic event or natural disaster, such as an earthquake along the Cascadia subduction zone and the subsequent tsunami.

Recent studies have shown that the world’s largest quakes are along subduction zones. The Cascadia subduction zone is located just off the Pacific coast impacting the northern California, Oregon, Washington and British Columbia. Experts say the Cascadia subduction zone event will catastrophically damage 94 percent of the transportation infrastructure along Oregon’s coastal communities.

This, in and of itself, will necessitate all assistance and medical evacuation to come from outside the coastal region conveyed largely by air and/or sea based assets, Simon said.
