BANDON – A small shoebox full of school supplies, toys, necessity items and notes of encouragement can have a big impact on a child. In 2014, Operation Christmas Child reached a major milestone – delivering shoeboxes to more than 150 million children since the project began in 1993. gifts. For some of these boys and girls, it is the first gift they have ever received. Through the power of a simple gift and the message of hope, these children learn that God loves them. Operation Christmas Child shoebox gifts will be hand-delivered to children in more than 150 countries on six continents. Boxes from this area will probably go to the Philippines.

The collections, the vehicles, the military objects, whether they date from the Civil War or the conflicts in the Middle East, provide an opportunity for military and civilians to talk about military service according to Hinojosa.
