NOTICE TO RESIDENTS OF CITY OF BANDON SMOKE-TESTING AND SEWER SURVEY

Beginning September 2017 (weather permitting) personnel from Dyer Partnership and City of Bandon Wastewater Staff will be conducting a physical survey of the City's Sanitary Sewer System. This will last a minimum of four days to a maximum of seven days. This study will involve the opening and entering of manholes in the streets and easements. An important task of the survey will be the "Smoke Testing" of sewer lines to locate breaks and defects in the sewer system. The smoke that you see coming from the vent stacks on houses or holes in the ground is NON-TOXIC, HARMLESS, HAS NO ODOR, AND CREATES NO FIRE HAZARD.

The smoke should not enter your home unless you have defective plumbing or dried-up drain traps. If this occurs, you should consult your licensed plumber. In any event, if the harmless smoke can enter through faulty plumbing, the potential exists for dangerous sewer gasses to enter your home. Should smoke enter your home, you may contact a member of the smoke testing crew working in the area, and he will be pleased to check with you as to where and why the smoke has entered your home. If you have any seldom-used drains, please pour water in the drain to fill the trap, which will prevent sewer gasses or odors from entering the building.

Some sewer lines and manholes are located on private property within easement area. Whenever these lines require investigation, members of the inspection crews will need access to the easements for the sewer lines and manholes. Homeowners do not need to be home, and the workmen will not need to enter your house.

Photographs are to be made of leaks occurring in the system. Your cooperation will be appreciated.

Scholar will recount her time with Coquille Tribe

COOS BAY - An eroding riverbank was the beginning of a beautiful friendship for Roberta Hall and the Coquille Indian Tribe.

It was 1976, and Hall, an anthropology professor at Oregon State University, received a distress call. Artifacts and bones had begun emerging from the ground near Bandon. Could she help preserve the site? Hall's hastily assembled team joined tribal members beside the river, and a long weekend of work secured the site. Afterward, Hall would make many return visits, with students in tow, researching the tribe's history and recording stories from tribal elders.

Hall, who retired in 2003, will recall her memories of those years in a Tuesday, Sept. 5, lecture at the Coos History Museum, located adjacent to the Coos Bay

waterfront. The event is part of the museum's First Tuesday Talks.

Now 78, Hall was deeply involved with the tribe during the years preceding its 1989 restoration to federal recognition. Having been "terminated" by Congress in 1954, the Coquille people were struggling to retain their cultural heritage and tribal unity when Hall met them.

Hall's Sept. 5 talk, "Portraits of the Coquille People," will feature decades-old recordings of her conversations with tribal elders. She hopes it also includes conversations with the audience.

Dr. Roberta Hall's lecture will begin at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, Sept. 5, at the Coos History Museum. It's part of the museum's First Tuesday Talks series. Your

museum entrance fee or membership includes admission to the talk.
