Cranberry Festival coming Sept. 8-10

BANDON – The 71st annual Cranberry Festival is a pirate themed weekend of activities, events and entertainment for the whole family.

With the theme "Shiver Me Cranberry," there's something for everyone, with a craft fair, football game, cruise-in and car show, bike ride, Cranberry Festival parade, festival market, queen's coronation, street dance, cornhole tournament, disc golf tournament and a cranberry run.

Cranberry cooks compete for a culinary crown in the Queen of the Kitchen food fair, while hungry festival goers dive into the cranberry eating contest to win prizes. Farmers and artisans will offer their goods at Cranberry City and the festival market and live music will be offered at the main stage and at the Old Town Marketplace throughout the weekend.

There are a few changes in festival events this year. The coronation will be held at 6 p.m. Saturday on the main stage in Old Town rather than Friday night. The Cranberry Bowl football game will be held vs. Riddle High School at 7 p.m. on Friday night at Tiger Field, rather than on Saturday afternoon. In addition, the BHS volleyball team will play Riddle at 3:30 and 5 p.m. in the BHS gym on Friday.

The special section will also be available at the Bandon Visitor Center and other locations around town during the festival.

City issues temporary fire restrictions

BANDON – The City of Bandon has issued temporary fire restrictions for residents regarding open burning, due to the dry conditions and the current state of extreme fire danger issued by the Coos Forest Protective Association.

CFPA, the Southwest Oregon District of the Oregon Department of Forestry and Oregon State Parks have all taken steps to restrict open burning, use of power tools, mowing, off-road motor vehicle operations and other activities that pose increased risk for fire.

Fire Chief Lanny Boston said that while no engines or personnel from the Bandon Rural Fire Department are currently being used to fight the Chetco Bar Fire, which is classified as the largest forest fire currently burning in Oregon, all other surrounding resources are being used, which leaves the city vulnerable if backup is needed.

The existing conditions make fires a continued threat to the health, safety and wellbeing of the citizens of Bandon and the greater Bandon community, said City Manager Robert Mawson.

"This wasn't prompted by any single incident," Mawson said. "Other resources are deployed, and while no one from our local district is fighting fire, we don't have any support from anywhere close by."

Mawson said three local firefighters were fighting the Chetco Bar Fire, but have since returned to Bandon.

"Humidity is down, so one thing we are asking people to do is not to mow except between 7 a.m. and noon near dry or cured grasses or any fire-sensitive area," Mawson said. "We don't plan to cite anyone, but we want people to think about what's going on and be wise about what they are doing."

Boston, Mawson and Mayor Mary Schamehorn

have enacted the following restrictions:

■ In respect to Chapter 8.20 of the Bandon Municipal Code, residents are reminded that outside burning within city limits is always prohibited. The city will not authorize and no one is allowed to conduct any outside open burning including kindling, maintaining or burning any bonfire, outdoor rubbish or waste fire, or use any trash burners, incinerators or burn barrels, or authorize any such fires or use of such devices on private land.

■ All exemptions provided for in Chapter 8.20 of the Bandon Municipal Code are suspended. The following activities are prohibited within city limits until further notice: all open flame fires, including barbecue appliances, charcoal, cooking fires and warming fires, outdoor patio and yard fireplaces, fire pits and smokers, decorative and ornamental fires, ceremonial and recreational fires, and any other open flame fires.

The use of all forms of fireworks is prohibited.

■ Use of the following equipment and activities shall be restricted to the hours of 7 a.m. to noon when used on or near dried, cured vegetation and in other fire sensitive areas: lawn mowers and tractors, chain saws and other power saws, and cutting, grinding or welding. Use of any other spark-emitting internal combustion engine, not specifically mentioned, is not allowed.

The harvest of agricultural crops is exempt from this restriction.

The restrictions will stay in effect until fire danger conditions have sufficiently diminished, at which time the restrictions will be rescinded by vote of the Bandon City Council.

Avast ye! All hands hoay! Parade attendees and entrants are sure to be walking and talking like pirates with this year's Cranberry Festival theme, "Shiver Me Cranberry"

Entrants are encouraged to have a yo-ho-ho fun time as they heave-ho into sailor and pirate costumes or decorate their floats with crow's nests and pirate booty, then batten down the hatches for the festival parade. Add a few cranberries and have a blast - the possibilities are endless.

A formation flyover by members of the Bandon Aero Club will kick off the parade at 10 a.m. Saturday, Sept. 9, followed on the ground by the VFW Honor Guard. Floats, cranberry harvesting equipment, sporty classic cars and hot rods, the Shriners and their tiny cars, a variety of tractors, the Coos County Mounted Sheriff's Posse, Miss Coos County, the BHS marching band and many more will be among those participating in the parade and celebrating Bandon's lengthy cranberry heritage.

Last minute parade entries will be accepted the day of the parade, but they will not be eligible for an award. Registration starts at 7 a.m. and judging will be held from 8-10 a.m. Judges will award ribbons for first and second place in each of five divisions, along with special ribbons for best entry.
