Hurlimand is one of three Nestucca High School Valedictorian’s that were able to achieve a 4.0 GPA.

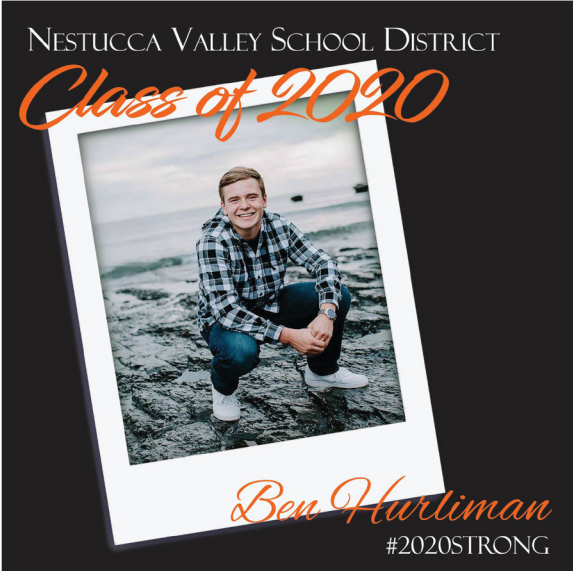
“My favorite high school memories were spending time with all of the friends that I grew up with from preschool,” Hurlimand said. “And playing sports
