# Testing, outbreaks and vaccines

Tillamook County Health
Department reports seven
COVID-19 cases from Oct. 1-3 for
the weekend case count. There were
24 cases in the 7-day case count
from Sept. 26 through Oct. 2.

"Our month to date – this is for the month Sept. 1 through Sept. 30 – was 394," Administrator Marlene Putman reported during a Tillamook County Board of Commissioners meeting Wednesday, Oct. 6. "Of those individuals, 247 were unvaccinated, 86 were vaccinated, and 61 were unknown."

Putman said unknown means the vaccine record is not in Oregon's

The death toll for Tillamook County is now at 24.

Putman said there are 22 outbreaks currently under monitoring. Oregon Health Authority confirmed outbreaks, as of Oct. 6, at Fred Meyer with 31 cases, Tillamook County Creamery Association with 19 cases, Adventist Health with a total of 23 cases, Tillamook Country Smoker with 14 cases, and Hampton Lumber Mill with eight

The Delta variant is three times more transmissible than earlier strains of the virus, Putman said. Vaccines play a crucial role in limiting the spread of the virus. Low vaccine coverage is driving the surge in cases. The vaccine is effective in reducing the disease spread.

"Treatment for COVID-19 is under consideration and investigation," Putman said. "Some is available that has received emergency authorization. Ivermectin is not one of them. It is not approved for treatment for COVID-19. Please do not use this product [or] ingest this product. If you experience signs of toxicity, call the Center for Disease Control."

Putman said if you are vaccinated, the likelihood of severe disease or hospitalization is extremely low.

"You don't need to take an unfounded, unresearched treatment," Putman said. "One treatment that is researched and has emergency approval, like the vaccine, is mono-

clonal antibody therapy."

Talk to your health care provider about this treatment if you have tested positive for COVID-19.

The health center continues to provide COVID-19 testing. Around 25 people are tested each day this week at the center's testing sites. Drive-up testing is available at the Tillamook County Fairgrounds for those with symptoms or is a close contact to someone who has tested positive, as there is still a high demand for testing. No appointments are required. Testing is available from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

Emergency Preparedness Coordinator Ed Colson said 16,835 Tillamook County residents have received at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine. This is 63.46 percent of the total population. A total of 15,64 residents are considered full vaccinated, which is 58.65 percent of the total population.

The health center has COVID-19 vaccine clinics available at the convention center at the fairgrounds from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. Tuesday and Thursday. Flu and pneumonia vaccines are now available at the drop-in clinic until Oct. 17. Beginning Oct. 18 and through the rest of the month, there will be an additional clinic from 1-4 p.m. on Wednesday.

# Living Water Fellowship hosts fall carnival



# Council approves film crew to drive through Manzanita for upcoming Amazon movie

Manzanita will be on the big screen once again. The council approved during a meeting Wednesday, Oct. 6, a special event permit for Big Indie Somebody, Inc. to film a mobile scene in the town for an Amazon Studios film titled "Somebody I Used To Know." The filming of the scene will take place in the afternoon Tuesday, Oct. 12, for 15-20 minutes.

City manager Leila Aman said the request is to film a movie scene from Hwy 101, down Laneda Avenue, up Ocean Road and back up Nehalem Road to Hwy 101. The film crew will not be stopping in Manzanita.

In the application for the special event permit, Roger Faires, assistant location manager for Big Indie Somebody, Inc., said the gist of the



quick drive through Manzanita is to follow a family wedding party as they make their way to a hotel.

The picture bus caravan will consist of one picture bus with 15 extras on board, one camera vehicle, two or three support vans that will have director Dave Franco on board, possibly a van with some adjustment equipment, and possibly a law enforcement escort.

"We're still executing this picture."

"We're still exacting this picture car caravan," Faires said. "I think it's going to be a little simpler than I originally thought."

Faires said they are looking at a 6-car caravan and would be filming while driving through the town. They are hoping for a law enforcement escort. Oregon State Police is short-staffed and Tillamook County Sheriff's Office is interested in filling a one to two car position. The City of Manzanita will also see if Manzanita Police Department has any off-duty officers to escort.

"We're hoping to get this in

"We're hoping to get this in one pass because after we're done with that driving shot, then we got to hightail it up to Gearhart to do some more filming at a different location," Faires said.

Mayor Mike Scott said the town has had film crews in Manzanita in the past and are a little gun shy.



In a previous film shoot, Laneda Avenue was closed down. Hulu's television series "Shrill" and Amazon's "Staties" have filmed in Manzanita.

"I think if you're going to drive straight to town and not stop, you could probably get away without any problems," Scott said.

The filming caravan would stop at the 4-way stops in Manzanita, Faires said. Regardless of how other cars intersect, they will not be asking the public to wait for the crew.

"The idea is to go with the flow," Faires said.

The crew will begin prepping at Arch Cape in the morning on Oct. 12 before driving through Manzanita. They will obey all traffic laws.

# Two found dead after boat capsizes near Nedonna Beach last week, cast still under investigation

Tillamook County Sheriff's Office deputies responded to a reported capsized sailboat at 8:20 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 3, north of Rockaway, near Nedonna Beach, just south of the south Nehalem Jetty. Rockaway Fire-Rescue, Garibaldi Fire-Rescue, Nehalem Bay Fire-Rescue, Tillamook Ambulance and the US Coast Guard responded



ued searching the area for survivors with two motor lifeboats.

The capsized sailboat, registered out of Astoria, became partially beached and coast guard personnel were able to gain access to the vessel and located a deceased man, the sheriff's office reported.


The two victims, husband and wife, were believed to be the only people on board the vessel at the time of the incident. Thanks to the efforts of Tillamook 911 Dispatchers, the victims were identified and immediate family has been notified.

# August as more go back to work

Oregon's unemployment rate dropped to 4.9% in August from 5.2% in July.

It is first time Oregon's unemployment rate dropped below 5% since March 2020, when the rate was 3.6%. Oregon's unemployment rate was below 5% in only two other periods since 1976 when comparable records began, according to the Oregon Employment Department.

During 14 consecutive months in the mid-1990s when the rate dropped to as low as 4.5%; and during the 51 consecutive months during 2016 through March 2020 when the rate dropped to a record low of 3.3% in

In Oregon, nonfarm payroll employment grew by 7,900 in August, following monthly gains averaging 10,300 in the prior seven months. Gains in August were largest in government (+3,500 jobs); wholesale trade (+1,400); leisure and hospitality (+1,200); and professional and business services (+1,000). Only one major industry cut jobs: retail trade (-1,900 jobs).

Since the low point of April 2020, at the economic depths of the COVIDinduced recession, Oregon has recovered 204,700 jobs, or 72% of the jobs lost during the recession.

Leisure and hospitality added 1,200 jobs in August, following a gain of 6,100, as revised, in July. Despite these gains, it still accounts for the bulk of

ered since early 2020, with 44,300 jobs left to recover to reach the prior peak month of February 2020. The industry has regained 60% of jobs lost early in the pandemic.

Employment in health care and social assistance has been relatively flat all year. This major industry recovered substantial jobs in mid-through late-2020, but is still down 10,400 jobs, or 4%, since its prerecession peak of February 2020. Over the past year, nursing and residential care facilities has been especially weak, having lost 1,300 jobs since August 2020. Meanwhile, two component industries have expanded in the past 12 months: ambulatory health care services (+3,100 jobs) and social

Traversing the 402-mile Oregon Coast Trail, dubbed OCT by seasoned hikers, involves disconnected and sometimes unsafe routes that require the navigation of tidal flows in order to proceed. Add to that a diagnosis of cystic fibrosis - a condition that mimics breathing through a straw - and 25-year-old Colton Cosby's ambition might best be described as not a challenge, but rather a

struggle. Not that Cosby, or "CJ" as short for Colton James Cosby, saw it that way. He completed the trail solo on September 20, carrying a portable nebulizer in his 30-pound backpack in case he needed supplemental mist to open his airways. Ironically, when asked what was most challenging about the expedition, Cosby's response was downright common -

"My feet hurt," he said. The entire venture took 29 days to complete, or as Cosby described it: four miles per hour; 26 nights of pitching a tent; one night in a hiker hut; one night in a Motel 6 (to shower and wash some

active toddler, and his dad said he's been adapting to his son's unique obstacles and ambitions ever since.

'CJ can be hard to keep up with," said David Cosby, who works in the logging industry as a security and fire watcher in the field for Dancer Logging. Inc. "Even more so when trying to keep up with his mind, because he has so many hopes and ambitions of things he wants to do with his life."

The junior Cosby said his ultimate goal is to cross the Pacific Crest Trail, a behemoth 2.650-mile jaunt that begins at the small town of Campo at the Mexican border and reaches north to Manning Park in British Columbia. Cosby hopes to master this and other trails while pursuing a degree in documentary filming between excursions. This could also mean a lot of travel time for Cosby's dad, who walks with him during day trips on local trails but opts to travel from a distance in his 32-foot travel trailer during the longer hauls.

It's obvious the duo is close. Cosby finished the Oregon Coast Trail on September 19, but decided to spend the night at Crissev State Park so that he and his dad could walk the last mile together, ceremoniously touching the state park sign with the palm of their hands.

While Cosby noted he has the support of his dad, he is also inspired by another: Nick Talbot, a County Durham, England-based climber who also has cystic fibrosis. Talbot was the first man with cystic fibrosis to summit weatherfickle Mt. Everest - on his third attempt. On his second attempt, he suffered cracked ribs and hypothermia after an 8.7 magnitude earthquake caused an avalanche that killed many climbers, including his friend and Google

Executive Dan Fredinburg. The climbing community, though vast, is nonetheless close knit. Talbot responded to a request for comment from the Curry Coastal Pilot about Cosby's achievement.

"First of all, a big congratulations to Colton," Talbot said.

"402 miles is impressive for anyone to do, let alone someone with CF (cystic fibrosis). He must have overcome so much to achieve this. I'm happy that my Everest challenge has encouraged Colton to push impressive new boundaries, and I hope all CFers get to live their best life and push their own personal boundaries whatever they may be.

'That has made my day," responded Cosby, who was eating his first post-hike, home-cooked breakfast when notified of Talbot's words.

Talbot echoed Cosby's drive to keep pushing forward.

"I was inspired to climb by the desire to push boundaries and raise profile and money for CF charities around the world," he said. "It's really tough having challenging goals with CF because it is so much harder to become as fit as other people, deal with lower lung capacity and potential infections and continue treatments. Sometimes, you have to develop special techniques to deal with CF to achieve your goal."

As for his next excursion? Cosby conceded he will need to give up his penchant for junk food, opting instead for a high-protein and nutrient rich

"This time I was able to complete the trip with a basic outline that was loosely planned," he said. "But the next time I will need to eat healthier in order to meet the 10-20 miles of walking a day."

The senior Cosby, perhaps still recuperating from the month prior, was more inclined to reflect on the day's one-mile walk to the finish

"It was a very emotional time. He's got a disease," David Cosby said. "He's gonna die with it sooner or later, we just don't know when. Until then, he wants to get as much out of life as possible."



### More EIDL grants and loan limit increase

ederal Aid for Small Businesses is still available, and it is being overlooked by many small businesses. We get it there has been so many programs to help small businesses that it's hard to keep them straight. But there are thousands of dollars still out up for grabs through the COVID-19 Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) program for businesses, sole proprietors, independent contractors and private nonprofit organizations, so this update is worth your attention. (Agricultural enterprises are not eligible for these specific programs, but there are different programs for agriculture.)

Tillamook is categorized as "economically depressed" along with most of rural America by the Small **Business Administration** standards, which means we have new EIDL advance opportunities beyond the initial, forgivable advances. This means that you may be able to receive thousands of dollars in what is effectively grant funding. We have done the research for you, and we know firsthand to how the program works, because we received our forgivable advance last week.

But first, let's rewind to 2020 when the COVID-19 EIDL program was first released. At that time, the Small Business Administration touted that any business who applied to the program would get a \$10,000 advance that was forgivable and would not need to be paid back as part of their loan. This was confusing to many as it rolled out because as the SBA later changed the advance to be \$1,000 per employee, up to \$10,000 total. Also confusing was the fact that you didn't have to accept the additional loan to get the advance. Bottom line: If you applied, you received an advance equal to \$1,000 per employee and then got to choose a loan amount. Regardless of whether you took that loan or not, you got to keep the advance as a grant as long as you used it for operational expenses.

Fast forward to 2021 and the release of the American Rescue Plan. In this package the SBA was directed to



offer what is being called a "Targeted Advance." This additional advance is open to economically depressed areas like ours, and it is an opportunity for businesses to receive the difference between what their initial advance was and the full \$10,000 that was originally intended for the advance, as long as they:

• Can demonstrate more than 30% reduction in revenue during an eight-week period beginning March 2, 2020, or later.

• Have 300 or fewer employees.

For example, if your business had three employees, it would have originally received \$3,000. The targeted advance would provide an additional \$7,000 to make the grand total \$10,000.

And then there's the icing on the cake — also in the American Rescue Plan. Some small businesses in economically depressed areas also became eligible for a "Supplemental Targeted Advance," which provides an additional \$5,000 forgivable advance on top of the first two advance programs. This advance is only available after you have received the full \$10,000 from the previous two programs; it brings the grand total of EIDL "grant" funding to \$15,000 per business. To be eligible for this advance, applicants must:

• Prove more than 50% economic loss during an eight-week period beginning on March 2, 2020, or later, compared to the same period of the previous year. Applicants need to provide gross monthly revenue (all forms of combined monthly earnings received, such as profits or salaries) from January 2019 to the current month-to-date

• Have 10 or fewer employees.

The advances are only available to businesses that apply for the EIDL loan. Again, you don't have to actually accept the loan, but you do have to apply to the program to be able to access the forgivable advance money.

In short, if you haven't applied for the EIDL program at all, you are essentially leaving a "grant" of \$15,000 on the table. If you have applied for the program but haven't sought either of the new, targeted advances, you are potentially missing out on thousands of "grant" dollars.

During the first year of the pandemic, the Chamber sent out weekly updates to help local businesses obtain millions of dollars through federal and state programs. This EIDL advance money is allocated to businesses and will head to communities around the nation soon. Let's bring it home to stimulate our local economy!

In addition to the advances, the EIDL program has increased the loan limits for businesses that might need additional funds. There are restrictions on how these funds can be used, but a game changing program update now allows you to pay off existing debt with these loans. For some businesses, this could be a good option to lower debt and loan payments because the EIDL loans run on a 30year amortization and have an interest rate of 2.75% (non-profit) to 3.75%, with payments deferred for two years from loan origination.

Stay tuned for a future article on this and the Employee Retention Tax Credit Program, another financial recouperation opportunity for local business.

And in the meantime. I encourage you to begin working on your application for the EIDL program and targeted advances. To start your loan application and receive the first advance, visit covid19relief.sba.gov. If you have already applied for the program, visit your online portal to find options to apply for the new, targeted advances and loan



# Hail to the nurses

For the past year while we are dealing with the pandemic, we have heard a lot about those most heroic and caring nurses that have given their time - and sometimes their lives - to care for those most seriously affected by Covid. Having nurses and doctors in our family, I know how hard they have worked and how under-appreciated they are. So, if you know a nurse – even if you haven't been directly helped by one thank them for giving so much of themselves. It has



been a tough year for them

But did you know there are nurses in nature, too? Plants that give of themselves to

support others. Most often these are fallen trees that are called "nurse logs." The next time you take a walk in the woods, look for them in the understory of the forest.

The Pacific Northwest forests are perfect places to find nurse logs. This is partly because our trees grow so large and so tall. We have a wide variety of large trees, too, like Sitka spruce, Douglas firs, cedars and hemlocks. Some of these trees are so large you can't wrap your arms around them, even when trying with a friend on the other side. So when they fall, they fall hard. And usually fall on top of other plants like ferns, mosses and lichens that inhabit the forest floor. Fallen trees also allow more sun and rain to reach the floor of the woodlands.

Decay is a very important part of a rejuvenating forest and the older and larger the tree, the longer it will take to break down and decay. And decaying wood is much easier to grow in. It is not as dense as live wood and contains nutrients that are readily taken up by seedlings. Many times, a tree starts to decay as a snag, with fungi and insects helping in the decaying process. By the time it falls to the forest floor, it is already in a state of decay that make it easier for seeds to grow. Other trees are healthy when they fall, being uprooted by high winds or humans. Once they start the decaying process, they, too, will make

Think about it: millions and millions of tiny seeds fall from cones at the height of a healthy tree and need to drift all the way to some bare soil hundreds of feet below. Between the top of a tree and the fertile ground lie all sorts of impediments like shrubs, ferns, and vines on the forest floor. And that doesn't even take into account the covering of needles, mosses and lichens that carpet the soil under all those evergreen trees that make their home in the Pacific Northwest.

But if that tiny seed can find purchase in a welcoming nurse log that sits above the forest floor, it just makes it easier to sprout and grow. There is more surface for the seeds to land on when the tree lies horizontally. The moisture content available to the roots of a seedling is more consistent in a decaying tree than on exposed soil which has a tendency to dry out. The curvature of a nurse log will perhaps keep falling needles and leaves from smothering the tiny seeds.

Nurse logs have been shown to provide a substrate that is different than that of the forest floor. This means the logs increase the habitat for a wider variety of plants of the next generation. Studies done in Washington state's coastal forests have found that nurse logs support 90% of Sitka spruce and hemlock, while Douglas fir, alder and big leaf maple prefer the forest floors. This gives a wider diversity of plants in the same region. Additional reports have found that, in other forests, nurse logs support about the same amount of variety as the forest floor.

Nurse logs will continue to nurture those seedlings until the nurse logs have completely decomposed. This can take decades or even centuries as a log will decay at approximately the same rate as it took to grow to maturity. Look closely at the forest floor when you are next in the woods and you may see the remnants of a very large tree that is still supporting a mature tree.

But it is not only tree seedlings that are found on nurse logs. Smaller shrubs like Pacific wax myrtle and evergreen huckleberry can be seen in this photo of a shore pine nurse log.

While nurse logs are certainly prominent in our coastal temperate rain forests, they are found in many, many forests all over the world to varying extents. In any case, they provide a snapshot of generational support for us to consider and reflect upon. Nurse logs have been supporting new generations for centuries and will continue to

do so long into the future. Another "nurse" to thank.

Rarely will you hear an entrepreneur say nice things about a state regulation, but Roy realizes how important ORS 746.280 has been to his company. That's the Oregon law that prohibits insurers from requiring their customers to get repairs done at a particular collision center, meaning that if you're ever in an accident, you get to choose where you want your vehicle repaired. So, body shops like E&E, who have stellar reputations, benefit by doing quality work.

"When customers pick up their cars after we've repaired them, they typically tell us two things," explains Roy. "The first is that they can't tell what we repaired, in other words we've restored their vehicle to its pre-accident condition. Then they'll jokingly say they hope they never see us again.'

Nobody likes to get in an accident, but some people do on numerous occasions. It's a testament to E&E Auto Body's service and the quality of their work that their customers do return. E&E customers come from as far north as Astoria, as far south as Lincoln City and as far east as Portland. For obvious reasons, there seem to be very few auto accidents west of Tillamook.

E&E works with all insurance companies, provides free estimates and assists their customers with filing insurance claims. The company's 11 employees include experienced, highly-trained technicians, some who have been with E&E for decades. In Roy's words, it was his old bank "dragging their feet" that led him to first call Kayla Magden, who manages our Oregon Coast Bank Tillamook office. "Kayla has been amazing," recalls Roy. 



# Unused medications? Drug Take Back Day is Oct 23rd

o you have old pre-scriptions or unused medications? Too often these end up in the wrong hands and wrong places. Unused or expired prescription medications can lead to accidental poisonings, overdose, and abuse. According to the 2019 National Survey on Drug Use and Health, 9.7 million people misused prescription pain relievers and 4.9 million people misused prescription stimulants. The majority of teenagers misusing prescription drugs get them from family and friends, often from the home medicine cabinet. Even prescription drugs thrown in

the trash can be retrieved and abused or illegally sold. (And unused drugs that are flushed can contaminate the water supply!) The best way to dispose of unused medications is to utilize local take-back programs.

Tillamook County Community Health Center will be partnering with Tillamook County Solid Waste for this year's National DEA Drug Take Back Day on October 23rd at the Tillamook County Fairgrounds. Registration is not necessary, just drop in between 10 am and 2 pm.

### At the event you can

- · Bring unused or expired medication (prescription or over-the-counter)
- Bring sharps (injectables / needles) in closed red sharps

containers for safe disposal • Receive a COVID-19 vaccine and a flu shot!

• (Please do not bring liquid medications or creams - the best way to dispose of these medications is by mixing them with kitty litter and placing

them in the garbage)

This is also an opportunity to dispose of diabetic needles (or other injectables). Sharp objects must be placed in closed red plastic Sharps containers and separated from medications. If you need a red Sharps container for these items, they are available for purchase at many pharmacies. During the week of the event (Oct 17-23), a small number of Sharps containers will be available for pick-up at Tillamook County Fairgrounds

at the regularly scheduled vaccine clinics, Tuesday and Thursday 8:30 am - 3 pm and Wednesday 1pm – 4pm. Your local healthcare provider or diabetic supplier may also be able to provide more information on where to find Sharps containers.

Safely disposing unused medications is an important way to protect those around you and prevent addiction or overdose. If you're unable to make it to the event. there are other drug disposal locations across the county (although these locations are only for unused medications and cannot accept sharps or needles). There is a medication drop box at the following locations: Rinehart Clinic & Pharmacy, Rockaway Beach

City Hall, Tillamook County Libraries, Tillamook County Sheriff's Office, Tillamook Pharmacy, Tillamook Police Department. For more information, visit https:// ourtillamook.org/drugdisposal-locations/.

# Apple Spice Baked Oatmeal

Prep Time: 10 minutes Cook Time: 30 minutes

### **Ingredients**

- 1 egg, beaten
- ½ cup applesauce - 1 ½ cups nonfat or 1% milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla - 2 Tablespoons vegetable
- 1 apple, chopped (about 1 ½ cups)
- 2 cups old fashioned
- rolled oats - 1 teaspoon baking pow-
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon

### **Topping**

- 2 Tablespoons packed brown sugar
- 2 Tablespoons chopped nuts (optional)

### Directions

- 1. Wash hands with soap and water.
- 2. Preheat oven to 375 degrees F. Lightly oil an 8x8inch baking dish.
- 3. Combine the egg, applesauce, milk, vanilla and oil in a bowl. Mix in the apple.
- 4. In a separate bowl, mix the rolled oats, baking powder, salt and cinnamon. Add to the liquid ingredients and mix well.
- 5. Pour mixture into baking dish, and bake for 25

### minutes.

- 6. Remove from oven and sprinkle with brown sugar and (optional) nuts.
- 7. Return to oven and broil for 3 to 4 minutes until top is browned and the sugar bubbles.
- 8. Serve warm. Refrigerate leftovers within 2 hours.

### **Notes**

- Substitute other fruit for the apple. Try bananas, pears, blueberries or a mixture.
- Serve warm topped with vanilla yogurt.
