The first snow sleds were made of materials like wood, bone and animal hides.

A kicksled is a small sled with a chair mounted on two runners that was invented in several Nordic countries during the late 1800s. The rider stands on one of the runners and pushes along the ground with their other foot in a manner similar to how a person propels a skateboard.

The famous Iditarod dog sled race commemorates an actual event when 20 teams of dog sledgers traveled 1,085 km (674 mi.) to deliver life-saving medicine to the city of Nome, Alaska, in 1925.

The "Flexible Flyer" was patented in 1889 by Samuel Leeds Allen. He designed the popular sled as a way to keep the workers in his farm equipment factory employed during the slow season.

Bobsleds are a heavy type of sled used primarily for racing. Bobsleds were simultaneously invented in both St. Moritz, Switzerland, and Albany, New York, during the late 1800s.

The ancient Egyptians used sleds carved from rock to transport massive stone blocks over sand.

Go Big Or Go Home

One of the world's largest kicksleds was built in Switzerland. The sled is 10 m (32 ft. 9 in.) in length.

The "Uncle Sam" sled, built in the late 1800s, was one of the longest sleds. The sled measured 23.5 m (77 ft.) in length and could seat nearly 70 adults.

Get The Sled Out

The Vikings used sleds for a variety of purposes. Many sleds have been found at Viking burial sites.

In the 1650s, Russian aristocrats rode sleds carved from ice blocks down man-made tracks.
