Applications for standard seasonal heating assistance shall be received until April 30, 2026. Approved disbursements for heating bill payments will commence on October 1, 2025, and conclude on May 31, 2026, contingent upon application submission and fund availability, and will terminate upon either the depletion of allocated benefits or the seasonal end date, whichever transpires first.

Standard Crisis Assistance will be available until April 30, 2026, with the possibility of extension due to protracted severe weather conditions and/or considerable increases in fuel costs.

Applications for Weatherization Assistance will be accepted throughout the year. Given Wyoming's climate, characterized by extended winters and limited periods of warm weather, Cooling Assistance is not currently provided due to budgetary constraints; however, the Weatherization Assistance Program does facilitate certain repairs and installations of cooling systems.

The specific operational dates are as follows: Heating Assistance for unregulated deliverable fuels (seasonal benefit) will be available from October 1, 2025, to May 31, 2026. Heating Assistance for regulated utilities (seasonal benefit) will be accessible from November 1, 2025, to May 31, 2026; Crisis Assistance (Special Situations) will operate from October 1, 2025, to April 30, 2026, with a contingency plan allowing extension beyond April 30th in the event of a prolonged and severe winter or significant mid-season fuel price increases; Weatherization Assistance (LIHEAP WAP) will be offered from October 1, 2025, to September 30, 2026.

Wyoming utilizes a centralized application intake and processing system; therefore, the establishment of an application deadline for Heating Assistance ensures sufficient time for follow-up and processing of incomplete applications before the season's termination date. The Heating Assistance benefit is retroactive to the commencement of the heating season, and benefits will be disbursed until either the benefit is exhausted or the seasonal end date is reached, whichever occurs first. Public outreach efforts will be undertaken to ensure awareness of the Heating Assistance application submission deadline.

The State of Wyoming maintains robust fiscal management and internal controls for its Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP) to ensure accountability and compliance with federal regulations.

Dedicated Fund Management: LIEAP funds are meticulously budgeted and tracked as a distinct financial entity. This is facilitated by assigning the LIEAP program a unique chart of account number, which comprehensively includes a unit number, program code, program period code, and an activity code. This detailed coding ensures expenditures are strictly confined to eligible categories.

Benefit Tracking and Payment Processing: Benefits disbursed to fuel suppliers on behalf of eligible clients are meticulously recorded within the specialized LIEAP computer system. These payments are subsequently processed through the state accounting system, with the corresponding activity codes diligently attached, to maintain transparent and accurate financial records.

Cost Allocation and Personnel Tracking: The Wyoming Department of Family Services (DFS) operates under a federally approved cost allocation plan. To ensure accurate fiscal accounting for salaries, leases, and indirect costs, State personnel rigorously track their time through a comprehensive time and effort reporting system.

Independent Audit and Specific Fund Tracking: Furthermore, the State undergoes an independent Single Audit as mandated by federal requirements, providing an external validation of financial integrity. For enhanced transparency and reporting, unique coding structures are in place to separately track and report on Regular LIHEAP FFY25, LIEAP Supplemental, and LIEAP Infrastructure funds.

Internal Control Framework: The DFS's internal controls and procedures are developed and rigorously maintained by representatives of the Financial Services Division (FSD). These procedures are consistently reviewed and adhered to by all Department employees, including supervisors, managers, and administrators. The responsible and appropriate handling of public funds is recognized as a collective responsibility, incumbent upon all state administrators, managers, supervisors, and employees.

The State of Wyoming undergoes an annual financial and compliance audit conducted by an external auditing firm. This audit is performed in accordance with the requirements of the **Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Uniform Guidance**.

The Wyoming Department of Family Services (DFS), as a State agency, is included within the scope of this statewide audit. The audit covers all Federal awards received by the State, as reported on the Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards (SEFA). The external auditor's selection of specific programs for review is based on a risk assessment. This assessment considers various factors, including:

- The total dollar value of Federal expenditures for a given program, as reported on the SEFA.
- Responses to risk-related inquiries.
- Other factors that may increase the risk of non-compliance, such as significant program changes or new key personnel (e.g., a new program manager for the LIHEAP program).

The external auditor's risk assessment and program selection process are designed to ensure that major programs are audited over a cycle of approximately five years.

The selection of the external audit firm is managed by the Wyoming Department of Audit, which issues a Request for Proposals (RFP) for audit services on a four-to-five-year cycle.

The LIHEAP Appeals Process

The following outlines the established process for handling appeals from applicants who receive a Notice of Action.

Local Conference

The first step for any applicant who wishes to appeal a decision is to request a **local conference** with the local agency. Most disputes are resolved at this level.

- If the initial decision is found to be incorrect, the application is re-processed and approved.
- If the original decision is upheld, the applicant is given a clear explanation of the reasons and provided with referrals to other resources, along with information on their right to request an administrative hearing.

Administrative Hearing

If a resolution is not reached at the local conference, the applicant has the right to request an administrative hearing. While this is a rare occurrence, Wyoming's Contested Case Rules provide a consistent framework for these hearings.

Submitting an Appeal

Applicants are encouraged to submit their appeal requests as soon as they receive their denial notice. They have **10 business days** from the date of receipt to submit a request.

Common grounds for appeal include:

- Disagreement with the reason for denial.
- Belief that the benefit amount is incorrect.
- The application was not acted upon within 45 days of receipt.

Application Timelines

The local LIHEAP agency is contractually obligated to act on all applications within **30 days**. This is closely monitored within the LIHEAP computer system. If an application is not processed within this timeframe, the applicant may request a local conference or an administrative hearing. Crisis applications are an exception and must be expedited. To date, no administrative hearings have been required due to delays in application processing.
